



## Playing a DVD Movie on a TV

Select models of the Presario Notebook PC come with a Composite TV Out connector on the back of the system, or a Composite TV Out connector and an S-Video connector on the optional port replicator. If your computer is equipped with a TV Out Connector and a DVD drive, please follow the instructions below to play a movie on a TV.

1. Set up your TV Out connection following the procedures in the section “Setting Up Your TV Out Connection” in the Feature Guide.
2. Start the DVD player by double-clicking on the **Compaq DVD Player** icon on your desktop.
3. Insert your DVD into the DVD drive.
4. After a few seconds, the movie should start playing. If it does not automatically start, click **Play** on the DVD player.
5. Press the **FN** (function) and **F3** keys to switch the display from the computer’s LCD screen to the attached TV.



**NOTE:** You may need to press FN/F3 more than once to transfer the image to the TV. Please see “Switching Between Displays” in the Feature Guide for further reference.

6. You can switch the display from the TV back to the LCD at any time by pressing **FN/F3** again.



**NOTE:** DVD movies can only be viewed on one display at a time. If two or more displays are active (LCD plus TV, for example), the movie will show as a black box or blank screen on one of the displays. This is normal.
