Safe Use of Your iPAQ Music Center

- Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.
- Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- Do not use this product near water.
- Do not place this product on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The product may fall, causing serious damage to the product.
- Slots and openings in the cabinet and in the back or bottom are provided for ventilation. To ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating, these openings must not be blocked or covered. 

What Do I Need For Setup?

Minimum requirements for the iPAQ Music Center setup include:

- ➔ **Television**—a video connection is required for setup. After setup, the iPAQ Music Center will function without a TV, but we recommend a TV connection to enhance the experience.
- ➔ **Audio setup**—the iPAQ Music Center does not contain speakers or an amplifier. It must be connected to a stereo receiver or amplified speakers.
- ➔ **Internet access**—the iPAQ Music Center will function with standard dial-up, cable-based or DSL-based Internet Service Providers. During guided setup (Chapter 4) make sure you have the following information handy:
 - Name of your ISP
 - Dial-up number
 - Login name
 - Login password








Did you know ...

As features are added, the iPAQ Music Center will have the capability to record from other devices. To do this connect the cable from receiver output to iPAQ Music Center input (this cable is not included).

Connecting to A/V Receiver and TV or...

1. Connect the **Stereo Cable ❶** to the iPAQ Music Center audio output and to an available audio input on your A/V receiver (such as tape, CD, or auxiliary.)
2. Connect the **Composite Video Cable ❷** to the iPAQ Music Center output and to an available video input on your TV.
3. Connect the **Power Cable ❸** to the iPAQ Music Center and to a power outlet.




Note: For best audio performance, use S/PDIF digital audio connections (either optical or coaxial) instead of analog stereo. For best video performance, use S-Video connections instead of composite video, where possible. **Digital and S-video cables are not included.**

4. Connect the iPAQ Music Center to the Internet (see 2-8).

Hardware Connections (continued)

A/V Receiver Connected to TV

1. Connect the Stereo Cable ❶ to the iPAQ Music Center audio output and to an available audio input on your A/V receiver (such as tape, CD, or auxiliary).
2. Connect the Composite Video Cable ❷ to the iPAQ Music Center video output and to the video input of the same component used in Step 1.
3. Connect the Power Cable ❸ to the iPAQ Music Center and to a power outlet.
4. Connect the iPAQ Music Center to the Internet (see 2-8).



Connecting to the Internet

Using the Built-In Modem

1. Connect the **Telephone Cable ①** to the modem jack.
2. Connect the other end to a **Telephone Wall Jack ②**. Use the included splitter if you want to use a telephone at this location.

Note: If a telephone wall jack is not conveniently located near your Music Center, you may consider using a wireless telephone jack system.




HPNA Setup

1. Connect the **Telephone Cable ①** (optimal home phoneline networking performance requires a minimum telephone cable of 6 feet) to the HPNA network jack on the Music Center.
2. Connect the other end to a **Telephone Wall Jack ②**. Use the included splitter if you want to use a telephone at this location.

Power On

When you turn on your iPAQ Music Center for the first time, you are guided through an initial setup procedure. This process ensures your iPAQ Music Center is optimally integrated with the rest of your home entertainment system.

Powering Up Your iPAQ Music Center

1. When you plug in your iPAQ Music Center, the red LED on the front panel will blink. When the unit is ready to be used, the LED will be solid red.
2. When the LED turns solid red, press the **Power** button  on the remote or front panel. The *Welcome* screen is displayed on your TV.



3. Turn on your A/V receiver and select the proper input mode such as CD, tape, or auxiliary.
4. Select the video input on your television that matches the input you used when connecting the iPAQ Music Center.

Remote Control Overview



**Your Remote Control can be programmed to operate certain functions of your TV and stereo receiver. Refer to the Appendix at the end of this guide for remote control setup codes.*

Battery Installation


The iPAQ Music Center remote control uses two AA batteries.



1. Open the battery compartment door **1** on the back of the remote control.
2. Place two AA batteries **2** into the compartment and close the compartment door.

Meet the Remote Control

The iPAQ Music Center remote control is as easy to use as a TV/VCR remote control. Most of the buttons will be familiar.



Number & Text Entry

Similar to a cellular phone, the iPAQ Music Center remote control can be used to enter text and/or numbers in all text fields, such as those displayed in the *Setup* and *Edit* screens.

The appropriate **Entry** mode engages automatically when a text field screen is displayed.


Each numbered button is assigned a group of letters or special characters.

Note: The **1** key can be used for additional characters not currently found on your remote control.

How Do I Enter Numbers and Text?

In fields where the system accepts only numbers, the **Entry** indicator displays **123**. When numbers and letters are accepted, the **Entry** indicator displays **TEXT**.

Enter numbers in a field by pressing the numeric buttons on your remote control.



Enter alphanumeric characters in a field by repeatedly pressing a number until the desired letter is displayed.


Text Field Editing

To navigate within a text entry field with the remote control, use the following buttons:

- **Up Arrow**—moves cursor up
- **Left Arrow**—moves cursor to the left
- **Right Arrow**—move cursor to the right
- **Down Arrow**—moves cursor down
- **Select**—select or save entries
- **Rewind**—backspace over text.
- **Fast Forward**—insert a space
- **Pause**—saves current character and advances cursor to the next character position

How Do I Edit the Text?

The Navigation arrows and Transport buttons allow you to edit text field entries as shown below.

This chapter provides step-by-step procedures to help you set up your iPAQ Music Center and provides an overview of the *Player*, *Guide*, and *Options* screens.



Setup


After completing the initial setup process, you can modify your system configuration at any time.



Tip

You can use an IR board or USB Presario keyboard.


Registering Your iPAQ Music Center

1. The first screen you see is the Welcome Screen. You will be guided through several setup screens.
2. Enter the requested information using the remote control.
3. Use the navigation arrows to highlight **next** at the bottom of the screen and press the **Select**  button.
4. During the Setup process, you are presented with a series of screens requesting specific information. This information is for owner registration and for personalizing.
5. Setup screens follow the configuration below:
6. At the conclusion of the Setup process, your iPAQ Music Center connects to OpenGlobe™ for registration.



When you press the **Setup** button  on the remote control and select an option from the **Setup** menu, you can modify the specific setting you want without going through the entire procedure again.

Modifying the System Setup

1. Press the **Setup**  button on the remote control to display the *System Setup* screen.
2. Use the navigation arrows to highlight the desired setup activity.
3. Press the **Select**  button to continue.

Players, Guides, and Options Overview

To make things simple, the iPAQ Music Center allows you to control all **Music** mode and **Radio** mode functions using only three types of screens:

- **PLAYERS**—primary mode of operation for Music and Radio
- **GUIDES**—find and organize your music
- **OPTIONS**—create/edit groups and playlists as well as access other features



Navigating the Guide Screen

You can access the *Music Guide* screen by pressing the **Guide** button  on the remote or the front panel of your iPAQ Music Center.


Use the navigation arrows on the remote to highlight titles on the *Music Guide* screen.



Use the **Select** button to start playing a title.


Pressing the **Guide** button  will switch you between the *Guide* and *Player* screens.

Selecting and Playing Music

Music Guide screens are easily navigated with the navigation arrows.

Use the  and  arrows to move from title to title.
Use the  and  arrows to choose a group.

When you press the **Play** button, the title starts playing.

Playing a CD



Tip

Make sure the iPAQ Music Center has access to the Internet so your CD can be identified.

Note: Until the CD is identified, the *Music Player* screen displays “unknown title and artist.” Once the CD is recognized, the information is stored and the title, track, and artist information is displayed.


Did you know ...

The iPAQ Music Center can play and record compressed music (ie, MP3) music files stored on a CD that you created using a PC.

Using the Music Player

When you first insert a music CD, the iPAQ Music Center uses the Internet to look for information about the CD you are playing.

1. Press the **Open/Close**  button on the iPAQ Music Center front panel, and insert a CD.
2. Press the **Open/Close**  button again to close it. When the music starts playing, the *Music Player* screen is displayed.



3. For track times, press the **INFO** button . Track times are displayed.

Setting the Play Mode



Tip

Use the **Shuffle** and **Repeat** buttons on the remote to change the play mode quickly.

Accessing the Play Mode Option


As you listen to your music, you may choose to randomly play songs from a particular CD. The iPAQ Music Center offers six different play mode settings. To select a **Play mode**, complete the following steps:

1. Press the **Options** button . The *Music Options* screen is displayed.



2. Use the navigation arrows to highlight the **Play mode** option.

Setting the Play Mode (continued)


The current **Play mode** is displayed by pressing the **Info** button  on the remote. You can change the **Play** mode at any time.

Accessing the Play Mode Option (continued)

- Press the **Select** button . The *Play Mode* screen is displayed.



Play Mode	What it does
normal	Plays current title once, then stops. Tracks are played in sequential order.
repeat track	Plays current track repeatedly until manually stopped.
repeat title	Plays current title repeatedly until manually stopped.
repeat group	Plays all tracks in currently selected group repeatedly until manually stopped.
shuffle title	Randomly plays all tracks within currently selected title until manually stopped.
shuffle group	Randomly plays all tracks within currently selected group until manually stopped.

- Use the navigation arrows to highlight the desired **Play** mode.
- Press the **Select**  button.
- After your play mode selection is made, you are returned to the previous screen (*Guide* or *Player*).

Recording from a CD

The iPAQ Music Center makes recording your favorite music easy and fun! You can record all or part of a CD.

Background Information

Compression technology minimizes the size of a digital audio file while attempting to retain the fidelity of the original recording. The file size is minimized by employing *perceptual encoding techniques* that retain elements of the original recording necessary to faithfully reproduce the music, but eliminate all of the elements not essential to human hearing (hence, the frequently used term *near CD quality*).

The bit rate determines the size of the file. A higher bit rate encodes more information, which makes for a larger file and in turn a higher fidelity recording. For a smaller file size and a higher level of compression, a lower bit rate is used. Bit rates are measured in kilobits per second (kbps) and can range from 96 kbps to 320 kbps, with 128 kbps MP3 being the generally accepted bit rate for near CD quality.

MP3 is one popular technique of compressing audio files.

Recording from a CD (continued)



Tip

For a smooth recording process, make sure the CD is recognized.



Tip

*To quickly record an entire CD, press the **Record** button twice. To deselect an entire CD, press the **Repeat** button .*

Note: You can cancel the recording process at any time by pressing the **Stop** button .




Did you know ...

When recording from a CD, the iPAQ Music Center uses a process called “Fast-Rip” that first copies tracks to the hard disk and then compresses the file later in the background.

Recording from a CD

1. Insert the CD into the iPAQ Music Center. The CD starts playing, and the *Music Player* screen is displayed.



2. Press the **Record** button on the remote, and the *Music Record* screen is displayed. All tracks on the CD are marked to be recorded. The red dot next to the track length indicates that the CD track is selected for recording.



Recording from a CD (continued)




At this point it is a good idea to record several CDs to your iPAQ Music Center. In the following chapters, you will use these recordings to make groups and playlists.



Recording from a CD (continued)

3. To remove a track, highlight the track and press the **Select** button .
4. To include a track, highlight an *unselected* track and press the **Select** button .
5. Press the **Record** button  again and the *Music Record Progress* screen is displayed. When the recording is complete, you are returned to the *Music Guide* screen.



Finding Your Music

Where is my music? After I record a CD, where does it go?

The iPAQ Music Center places every new recording in the **ALL** category and the group according to the genre information retrieved for the CD.

Listening to Internet Radio



Did you know ...


The technology which makes this all possible is called streaming audio. Streaming means that you don't have to download an audio file before the music starts to play.

Navigating the Radio Guide

You can access the iPAQ Music Center *Radio Guide* by pressing the **Radio** button  located on the upper right-hand side of the remote.

Use the navigation arrows on the remote to highlight stations on the *Radio Guide* screen. Press the select button and the station starts playing.



With just a few simple steps you can create a personalized, digital music library that allows you to access your entire collection by criteria such as artist, genre, and album. You can then set up groups and playlists quickly and easily.

This chapter guides you through the process of creating personalized groups and playlists.



Music Groups and Playlists

The iPAQ Music Center offers several easy-to-use, and very powerful tools for organizing your music:

- **MUSIC GROUP**—a collection of titles
- **TITLE**—a collection of individual tracks created when you record a CD
- **PLAYLIST**—collection of individual tracks
- **TRACKS**—individual songs


Note: The **TEXT** indicator is displayed in the upper right portion of the text box when the remote enters text mode.

Creating a Music Group OPTIONS

Genre-based groups are automatically set up for new titles with the information provided by OpenGlobe. The **ALL** group contains all the titles and tracks in your collection.

To create a new group:

1. Press the **Options** button OPTIONS on the remote. The *Music Options* screen is displayed.
2. Use the navigation arrows to highlight **more...**, and press the **Select** button SELECT.
3. From the *More Music Options* screen, highlight **new group** and press the **Select** button SELECT. The *New Group* screen is displayed.
4. Use the alphanumeric buttons to enter a name for the new group in the text box.





Music Groups and Playlists (continued)

Creating a Music Group (continued)

5. Press the **Select** button . The *Edit Music Group* screen is displayed.



6. Use the navigation arrows to highlight a title to be added and press the **Select** button . A check mark ✓ indicates a title is selected.
7. When you finish making your selections, press the **Record** button  to save.

Finding Your New Group






After I create a new group, where does it go?

The iPAQ Music Center places every new group alphabetically in the group filter bar.

Music Groups and Playlists (continued)

The *Edit Music Group* screen is displayed when the **edit group** option is first selected so the name of an existing group can be modified.

Editing a Music Group






1. In the *Music Guide* screen, highlight the group you want to edit.
2. Press the **Options** button  on the remote. The *Music Option* screen is displayed.
3. Use the navigation arrows to highlight **more...**, and press the **Select** button .
4. Use the navigation arrows to highlight **edit group**.
5. Press the **Select** button . The *Edit Group* screen is displayed.
6. Use the alphanumeric buttons to edit the group name.
7. Press the **Select** button  to continue. The *Edit Music Group* screen is displayed.
8. Highlight the titles you want to edit. A check mark ✓ indicates a title is selected.
9. When you finish editing, press the **Record** button  to save.




Note: When you delete a group, your titles are not deleted from your iPAQ Music Center.

Delete a Group

1. In the *Music Guide* screen, highlight the group you want to delete.
2. Press the **Options** button  on the remote. The *Music Options* screen is displayed.
3. Use the navigation arrows to highlight **more...**, and press the **Select** button .

When you registered your iPAQ Music Center, you also created an account with a free new service to enhance your music and radio experience called OpenGlobe. Through this service your iPAQ Music Center personalizes your music by automatically identifying all the CDs you play in your iPAQ Music Center. You can add new radio stations to your Internet radio guide as well as shop for more music securely.



The World of OpenGlobe

Through the OpenGlobe service you will be given opportunities to get more of what you already like. For example, music recommendations will be offered for you to purchase, based on your taste.



Did you know ...

Your iPAQ Music Center will continue to evolve over time, adding new features and services, as they become available through the OpenGlobe service—so be sure to check often.

What Can OpenGlobe Do For Me?


OpenGlobe provides a simple way to find the music you want. After learning your personal musical and radio preferences, OpenGlobe will:

- Provide lists of other CDs currently available by the same artist, along with recommendations of similar CDs by other artists.
- Create “Artist of the Week” promotions based on your listening habits.
- Provide a simple way to purchase CDs.
- Collect Internet radio channels to assist you in expanding your collection of radio stations.

And that is only the beginning!

Note: In order to use the OpenGlobe service, your iPAQ Music Center must be connected to a TV. (Please refer to Chapter 2, *Connecting Your iPAQ Music Center*, for details on how to connect to your TV.)


Accessing OpenGlobe

All navigation is handled with the navigation arrows and **Select** button  on the remote control or on the front of the iPAQ Music Center.


When you choose OpenGlobe from the iPAQ Music Center Music mode, you have easy access to a variety of related information about the music that you are playing.

How Can I Access OpenGlobe?

There are three ways to access OpenGlobe:

- Press the OpenGlobe **Shopping Cart** button  on your remote, or on the optional IR keyboard while in any source and while in either the *Guide* or *Player* screens.
- Select the Radio Option - Tune Internet Radio Stations.
- From any PC on the Internet you can access your OpenGlobe account. In such cases, you will need to know your USERID and PASSWORD to access your account.

Music

Pressing the OpenGlobe button  on your remote while music is playing exits the player view and displays the “Now Playing” page within the OpenGlobe Music environment. The audio from the current title continues to play unless an audio sample is played.

The OpenGlobe *Now Playing* screen is displayed.




CE-Commerce™



What Can I Purchase Through OpenGlobe?

CE-Commerce is the ability for you to do electronic commerce in the comfort of your home through the iPAQ Music Center. The CE-Commerce experience is consistent with the usage of your iPAQ Music Center.

When you press the **OpenGlobe** button  on the remote while listening to an artist, you are presented with a list of albums that are available for you to purchase, securely, right from your iPAQ Music Center.

Through the OpenGlobe service, you are given opportunities to get more of what you already like. For example, music related to the music you listen to will be offered for you to purchase.



A network is a group of computers, printers, and other devices connected together to enable communication between them. The devices on a network can be connected in a variety of ways. The devices on a network can be physically connected by wires or connected by wireless technology. The iPAQ Music Center now introduces home networking to familiar home consumer electronics.

The most common reason for home networking is to share resources between devices on the network. For example, if your home has only one printer, every PC in the house can use this printer, replacing the need to purchase and maintain multiple printers. With the rise of broadband home Internet access, a popular reason to set up a home network is to share the high speed Internet connections that DSL and Cable modems provide.

Note: “Wireless telephone jack” products in the store do **NOT** work with HPNA; a physical telephone cable to the telephone wall jack is required.

Home Phoneline Networking Alliance

One type of wired network is called HPNA (short for Home Phoneline Networking Alliance, and also known as HomePNA). This type of wired network uses the same wiring in your home that your telephones use, while not interfering with normal telephone operation. This allows you to set up a network without having to worry about running additional wiring. HomePNA 2.0, a type of HPNA networking, allows for transfer speeds of up to 10 Mbps, the same speed as many Ethernet networks. Your iPAQ Music Center supports HomePNA 2.0 via the internal HPNA jack.

A communications gateway can be a PC running Internet sharing software such as Microsoft’s Internet Connection Sharing (“ICS” is included with Windows 98 second edition, Windows Me or Windows 2000). The communications gateway can also be a dedicated device such as Compaq’s Connection Point. Refer to your ICS or equivalent documentation to set up your PC or device as a communication gateway. If your PC is the communications gateway, you may have to set its power management configuration so that it does not power down automatically.

Connecting the iPAQ Music Center

1. Disconnect the telephone cable (if any) between the modem jack on the iPAQ Music Center and the telephone wall jack.
2. Connect a telephone cable between the HPNA jack on the iPAQ Music Center and the telephone wall jack (optimal home phoneline networking performance requires a minimum telephone cable of 6 ft.).

Note: If running software other than Windows 98 second edition or future versions, refer to your PC networking software to determine whether to select dynamic or static IP addressing.



Did you know ...

As features are added you will be able to transfer music files from your PC to your iPAQ Music Center via Home PNA.




Once the iPAQ Music Center is connected to the home network, it will no longer connect to the Internet using its dial-up modem. Make sure that there is a PC or other device on your home network which is acting as a communications gateway.

Setting up the iPAQ Music Center

1. Press the **Setup** button **SETUP** on the remote control. The *System Setup* screen is displayed.



2. Use the navigation arrows to highlight internet access, and press the **Select** button **SELECT**.
3. From the *Internet Service* screen select **Yes**. Highlight **Next** and press the **Select** button **SELECT**.
4. Use the navigation arrows to highlight **Home PNA**. Highlight next and press the **Select** button **SELECT**.
5. From the *Internet Settings* screen select **dynamic**.



Your iPAQ Music Center is now configured to access the Internet using your home network.

Programming your Remote Control

1. Press and hold the **Code Set** button  on the remote control for 3 seconds. The LED will blink twice.
2. Press the A/V PWR button and enter the first 4 digit code for your brand. The LED will blink twice to confirm a valid code has been programmed.
3. Press the A/V PWR button. Your A/V receiver should turn off. If your A/V receiver does not respond, repeat steps 2-3, trying each code listed for your brand until you find the correct one.
4. To program the TV, repeat steps 1-3 but press the TV PWR button on steps 2 and 3.
