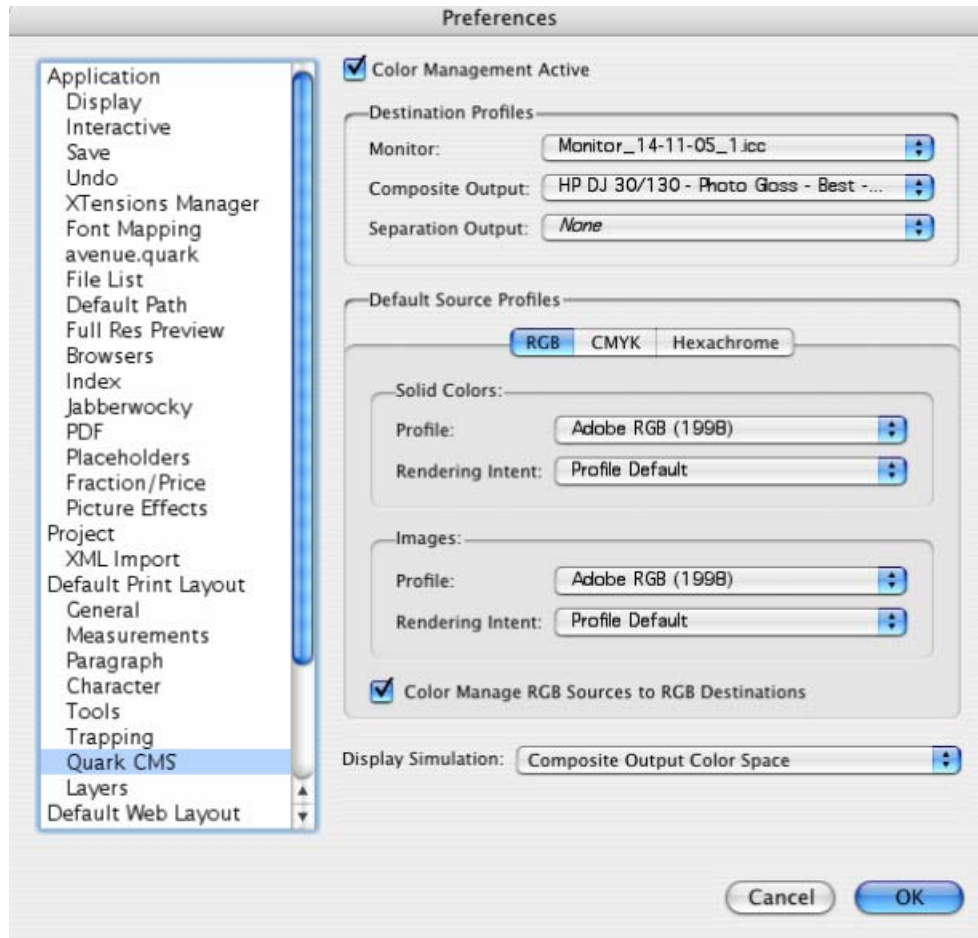

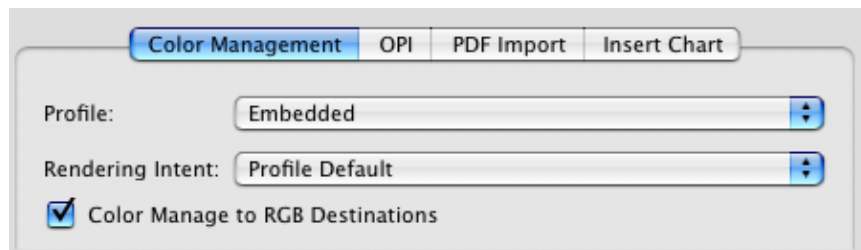

1. First recommendations:
 - See the [Media type functionality & features](#) and choose the most appropriate media.
 - It is essential that you have the media type correctly calibrated with the printer and print mode, consult the [Calibrate my printer](#) document.
 - In order to get a correct display, it's also essential that you have the monitor calibrated, consult the [Profile my monitor](#) document.
2. Open QuarkXpress.
3. Configure the color **Preferences, QuarkXPress menu > Preferences... > Quark CMS** (left hand menu):
 - Check the **Color Management Active** checkbox.
 - **Destination Profiles:**
 - **Monitor:** Select the monitor profile you have created.
 - **Composite Output:** Select the profile of the output device you want to proof on the monitor; the printer profile generally depends on the printer model and the media type. If you don't have it on the list, you should copy it in the next folder:
/Library/ColorSync/Profiles
 - **Default Source Profiles > RGB** tab:
 - **Profile** (Solid Colors/Images): Adobe RGB (1998).
 - **Rendering Intent** (Solid Colors/Images): Profile Default.
 - Check **Color Manage RGB Sources to RGB Destinations.**
 - **Default Source Profiles > CMYK** tab:
 - **Profile** (Solid Colors/Images): SWOP Press.
 - **Rendering Intent** (Solid Colors/Images): Profile Default.
 - Check **Color Manage CMYK Sources to CMYK Destinations.**
 - **Display simulation:** Select **Composite Output Color Space** to emulate the output device on the monitor.



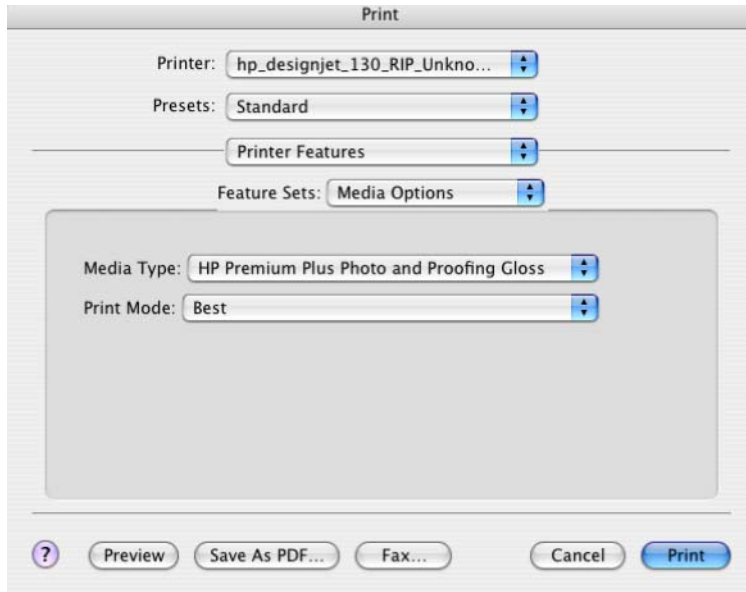
- Click **OK**.
4. Open your project, **File menu > Open...**, and browse it. To insert images, draw a box with the **Rectangle Picture Box** and insert the image, **File menu > Get Picture...**:
 - Browse to the file.
 - **Color Management** tab:
 - **Profile:** If the image has an Embedded profile, preserve it, if not, select Default.
 - **Rendering Intent:** Profile Default.
 - Check **Color Manage to RGB/CMYK Destinations**.



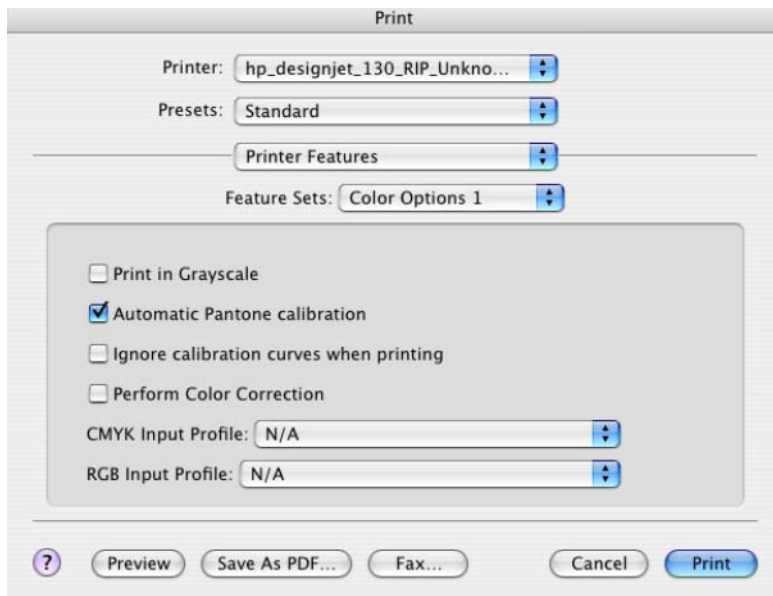
- Click **Open**.
5. So that you get a good display select the image, and then, **Item menu > Preview Resolution: Full Resolution**.
 6. You can now retouch your image and the monitor will show you how it's going to look once you've printed it.

7. Print settings, **File menu > Print...**:

- **Printer...** button:
 - **Printer:** Select the printer (ex. EFISoftwarePrinter).
 - **Printer Features > Media Option:**
 - Select the **Media Type** that is loaded on the printer.
 - **Print Mode:** Best.

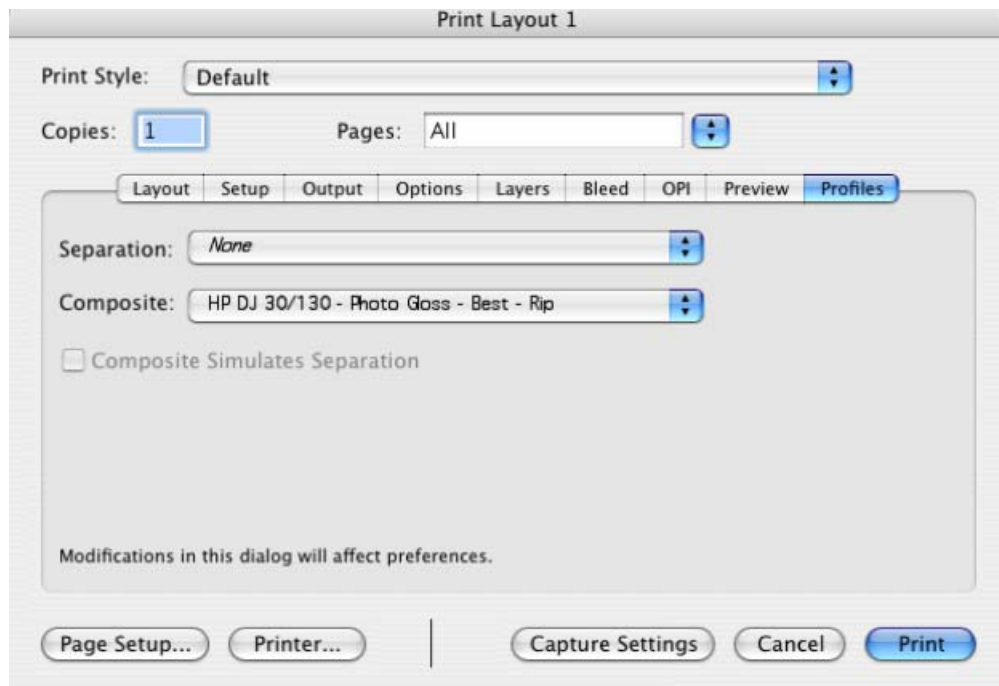


- **Color Options 1:**
 - Uncheck **Perform Color Correction.**



- Click **Print**.
- **Page Setup...** button:
 - **Format for:** Select the printer RIP.
 - **Paper Size:** Select the paper size of the media loaded on the printer.

- **Orientation:** Select the orientation of your image on the paper.
- Click **OK**.
- **QuarkXPress** print settings:
 - **Layout tab:** Uncheck **Separations**.
 - **Setup tab:**
 - **Printer Description:** Select the printer RIP.
 - **Paper size:** Select the paper size you have already selected on the Page Setup window.
 - **Reduce or Enlarge:** Select the scaling factor you need.
 - **Page Position:** Select the page position you need if the image is smaller than the paper size.
 - **Output tab > Print Colors:** Composite CMYK.
 - **Preview tab:** Check the preview of your image on the paper.
 - **Profiles tab > Composite:** Select the output device you want to emulate on the monitor (the profile of the printer and media type you have selected on the printer RIP).



- Click **Print**.
