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1 Identifying hardware

- 1. Select Start > Computer > System properties.
- 2. In the left pane, click **Device Manager**.


You can also add hardware or modify device configurations using Device Manager.



		• Amber: TouchPad is disabled.	
(2)	TouchPad*	Moves the pointer and selects or activates items on the screen.	
(3)	Left TouchPad button*	Functions like the left button on an external mouse.	
(4)	TouchPad on/off button	Enables/disables the TouchPad.	
(5)	TouchPad scroll zone	Scrolls up or down.	
(6)	Right TouchPad button*	Functions like the right button on an external mouse.

(1)	Caps lock light	On: Caps lock is on.

(3)	Volume mute light	• White: Computer sound is turned on.	
		• Amber: Computer sound is turned off.	
(4)	Volume down light	On: The volume scroll zone is being used to decrease speaker volume.	
(5)	Volume up light	On: The volume scroll zone is being used to increase speaker volume.	
(6)	Treble light	On: The treble volume function is on.	
(7)	Bass light	On: The bass volume function is on.	
(8)	Treble or bass volume down light	On: The treble or bass volume scroll zone is being used to decrease treble or bass volume.

(10)	Wireless light	•	Blue: An integrated wireless device, such as a wireless local area network (WLAN) device and/or a Bluetooth® device, is on.
		•	Amber: All wireless devices are off.
(11)	Num lock light	On:	Num lock is on or the embedded numeric keypad is enabled.
(12)	Drive light	•	Blinking: The hard drive or optical drive (select models only) is being accessed.
		•	Amber: HP ProtectSmart Hard Drive Protection has temporarily parked the internal hard drive.
(13)	Battery light	•	On: A battery is charging.
		•	Blinking: A battery that is the only available power source has reached a low battery level or a critical battery level.
		•	Off: If the computer is plugged into an external power source, the light is turned off when all batteries in the computer are fully charged. If the computer is not plugged into an external power source, the light stays off until the battery reaches a low battery level.

*The 2 power lights display the same information. The light on the power button is visible only when the computer is open. The power light on the front of the computer is visible whether the computer is open or closed.



(1)	Power button*	 When the computer is off, press the button to turn on the computer.
		• When the computer is on, briefly press the button to initiate Sleep.
		 When the computer is in the Sleep state, briefly press the button to exit Sleep.
		 When the computer is in Hibernation, briefly press the button to exit Hibernation.
		If the computer has stopped responding and Windows® shutdow procedures are ineffective, press and hold the power button for a least 5 seconds to turn off the computer.
		To learn more about your power settings, select Start > Control Panel > System and Maintenance > Power Options.
(2)	Speakers (2)	Produce sound.
(3)	Media button	Launches the MediaSmart program.
		NOTE: If the computer has been set up to require a logon password, you may be asked to log on to Windows. MediaSmart launches after you log on. Refer to the MediaSmart software Help for more information.
(4)	Previous/rewind button	 Plays the previous track or chapter when the button is presse once.
		• Rewinds media when the button is pressed simultaneously with the fn key.
(5)	Stop button	Stops playback.
(6)	Play/pause button	Plays or pauses media.
(7)	Next/fast forward button	 Plays the next track or chapter when the button is pressed once.
		 Fast forwards media when pressed simultaneously with the fn key.
(8)	Optical drive button	Releases the media tray.
(9)	Volume mute button	Mutes and restores speaker sound.
(10)	Volume scroll zone	Adjusts speaker volume. Slide your finger to the left to decrease volume and to the right to increase volume. You can also press an hold the minus (-) sign to decrease volume, or press and hold the plus (+) sign to increase volume.
(11)	Treble/bass button	Alternates between treble and bass volume controls.
(12)	Treble or bass volume scroll zone	Adjusts treble or bass volume. Select the treble or bass volume b pressing the treble/bass button, and then slide your finger to the left to decrease volume and to the right to increase volume using the treble or bass volume scroll zone. You can also press and hol the minus (-) sign to decrease volume, or press and hold the plu (+) sign to increase volume.
(13)	Wireless button	Turns the wireless feature on or off but does not establish a wireless connection.

(1)	esc key	Displays system information when pressed in combination with the fn key.
(2)	fn key	Executes frequently used system functions when pressed in combination with a function key or the esc key.
(3)	Windows logo key	Displays the Windows Start menu.
(4)	Windows applications key	Displays a shortcut menu for items beneath the pointer.
(5)	Integrated numeric keypad keys	Can be used like the keys on an external numeric keypad.
(6)	Function keys	Execute frequently used system functions when pressed in combination with the fn key.

(1)	Internal display switch	Turns off the display if the display is closed while the computer is turned on.





(3)	Optical drive	Reads optical discs and, on select models, also writes to optical discs.
(4)	Optical drive light	Blinking: The optical drive is being accessed.
(5)	Security cable slot	Attaches an optional security cable to the computer.
		NOTE: The security cable is designed to act as a deterrent, but it may not prevent the computer from being mishandled or stolen.
(6)	Power connector	Connects an AC adapter.

Left-side components



Component		Description
(1)	External monitor port	Connects an external VGA monitor or projector.
(2)	Expansion port 3	Connects the computer to an optional docking device or optional expansion product.
		NOTE: The computer has only one expansion port. The term <i>expansion port 3</i> describes the type of expansion port.
(3)	RJ-45 (network) jack	Connects a network cable.
(4)	HDMI port	Connects an optional video or audio device, such as a high- definition television, or any compatible digital or audio component.
(5)	eSATA/USB port	Connects high-performance eSATA components, such as an eSATA external hard drive, or connects an optional USB device.
(6)	USB port	Connects an optional USB device.
(7)	1394 port	Connects an optional IEEE 1394 or 1394a device, such as a camcorder.
(8)	ExpressCard slot	Supports optional ExpressCard/54 cards.

Bottom components



Component		Description
(1)	Subwoofer	Contains the subwoofer speaker.
(2)	Battery bay	Holds the battery.
(3)	Battery release latch	Releases the battery from the battery bay.
(4)	Vents (7)	Enable airflow to cool internal components.
		NOTE: The computer fan starts up automatically to cool internal components and prevent overheating. It is normal for the internal fan to cycle on and off during routine operation.
(5)	Hard drive, WLAN module, and memory module compartment	Holds the hard drive, the wireless LAN (WLAN) module, and the 2 memory module slots.
		CAUTION: To prevent an unresponsive system, replace the wireless module only with a wireless module authorized for use in the computer by the governmental agency that regulates wireless devices in your country or region. If you replace the module and then receive a warning message, remove the module to restore computer functionality, and then contact technical support through Help and Support.
(6)	Mini Card compartment	On select models, holds the TV tuner card.

Wireless antennae

Component		Description
(1)	Power cord*	Connects an AC adapter to an AC outlet.
(2)	AC adapter	Converts AC power to DC power.
(3)	RF coaxial cable adapter	Connects an RF coaxial cable to the TV antenna/cable jack.
(4)	Battery*	Powers the computer when the computer is not plugged into external power.
(5)	TV antenna (select models only)*	Receives digital and analog broadcast signals.

3 Labels

The labels affixed to the computer provide information you may need when you troubleshoot system problems or travel internationally with the computer.

• Service tag—Provides important information including:



- Product Name (1). This is the product name affixed to the front of your notebook.
- Serial Number (s/n) (2). This is an alphanumeric number that is unique to each product.
- Part Number/Product Number (p/n) (3). This number provides specific information about the product's hardware components. The part number helps a service technician to determine what components and parts are needed.
- Model Description (4). This is the most important number you need to locate documents, drivers, and support for your notebook.
- Warrant period **(5)**. This number describes the duration of the warranty period for this computer.

Have this information available when you contact technical support. The service tag label is affixed to the bottom of the computer.

- Microsoft® Certificate of Authenticity—Contains the Windows® Product Key. You may need the Product Key to update or troubleshoot the operating system. This certificate is affixed to the bottom of the computer.
- Regulatory label—Provides regulatory information about the computer. The regulatory label is affixed inside the battery bay.
- Wireless certification label(s) (select models only)—Provide information about optional wireless
 devices and the approval markings of some of the countries or regions in which the devices have
 been approved for use. An optional device may be a wireless local area network (WLAN) device
 or an optional Bluetooth® device. If your computer model includes one or more wireless devices,
 one or more certification labels are included with your computer. You may need this information
 when traveling internationally. Wireless certification labels are affixed inside hard drive, WLAN
 module, and memory module compartment.

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
