**Cleaning Cloth** Use to clean the touch screen.






### **Connecting the Power Source**

Route the power cord through the opening in the device stand and plug output of the power adopter plug directly into the power jack at the back of the product. Plug the power cord into an AC power source through a surge protector/uninterruptible power supply (UPS). Surge protector or UPS is not included with the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>.




### HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> Stand

The HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> is shipped with the product stand secured against the back of the product. To assure that the product is in a stable position on your desktop, pull the product stand open. Then, if you want to change the angle of the DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>, tilt the LCD display to an angle of between 14 and 24 degrees to suit your preference. This helps to reduce your eye strain and muscle fatigue.



# Orientation

Your HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> is designed to be operated in a landscape orientation (A). When wall-mounted, the product should remain with the display in landscape orientation, not portrait (B), or laid horizontal (C)



### $\triangle$ CAUTION

Placing your product in portrait orientation (B) or horizontal orientation (C) may result in damage to the hardware components.

# **USB Keyboard and Mouse**

#### Select models only

Connect the keyboard and mouse to the USB ports on your HP DreamScreen<sup>400.</sup>



### Wireless Keyboard and Mouse

#### Select models only

Your wireless keyboard and mouse are easy to set up. Just remove the battery tabs from both the keyboard and the mouse. Also, make sure the Power Switch on the bottom of the mouse is in the On position (the keyboard does not have a Power Switch). Insert the wireless keyboard and mouse receiver to the product USB port. Then, turn on the Product. If you have trouble using the keyboard and mouse, manually synchronize them as explained in the next procedure.

#### PNOTE

Select models may have a wireless keyboard and mouse.

#### ♦ IMPORTANT

For better mouse battery life and performance, avoid using your mouse on a dark or high-gloss surface, and turn mouse off when not in use.

# Synchronizing the Wireless Keyboard or Mouse

The wireless keyboard and mouse are pre-synchronized for your convenience, to work with your HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>. The keyboard and mouse should work immediately after you pull the battery tabs to activate the pre installed batteries, and then turn on the mouse **(B)**.

You may need to manually synchronize the wireless keyboard or mouse if they are not functioning.

To synchronize them:


- Make sure the keyboard and mouse are next to the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>, within 30 cm (1 foot) and away from interference from other devices.
- **Keyboard:** Press the Connect button on the bottom of the keyboard (A) for five seconds. The blue activity LED on the wireless receiver illuminates when the synchronization command has been received and turns off when synchronization is complete.
- Mouse: Press the Connect button on the bottom of the mouse (C) for five seconds. The blue activity LED on the wireless receiver illuminates when the synchronization command has been received and turns off when synchronization is complete.



If this does not work, remove and then re-insert the wireless keyboard and mouse receiver from the product and then synchronize the keyboard and mouse again.

# **Optical Disc Drive**

Use your CD/DVD drive to play CDs and DVDs. To insert a disc, press eject button, turn the data side of the disc toward the back of the computer (label side forward) and insert the CD/DVD disc. Close the tray.



To eject a disc, make sure the power is turned on and then press the Eject button (A) on the side of the disc drive.

If pressing the eject button on the drive does not eject the disc, please press eject button on the screen. This will eject the disc.

### **Connecting to the Internet**

Your HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> is designed to connect to the Internet through a wired or wireless network. The network connection to the Internet is usually through a broadband modem (digital subscriber line [DSL] or cable), which requires a separate subscription.

For a wired Internet connection, connect an Ethernet cable (sold separately) to the Ethernet connector on the back of the device, and then connect the other end to the broadband modem.

### Wireless Home Network

Wireless access point and Internet service are required. Availability of public wireless access points may be limited.

First-time wireless network installation requires that you:

- 1 Purchase high-speed Internet service from an Internet service provider (ISP).
- 2 Purchase a broadband modem (DSL or cable). This may be provided by the ISP.
- 3 Purchase and install a wireless router (sold separately), if one is required.
- PNOTE

Broadband modem and router installation procedures vary, depending on the manufacturer. Follow the manufacturer's instructions.

4 Connect your computer to the wireless network by following the instructions in the product videos (which can be accessed by touching or clicking on the "Take a tour" button on your screen).

#### **NOTE**

A DSL wall connection is shown here. If you have a cable modem, the modem will be connected to the wall using a coaxial cable.



### Wired home network

First-time wired network installation requires that you:

- 1 Purchase high-speed Internet service from an Internet service provider (ISP).
- 2 Purchase a broadband modem (DSL or cable). This may be provided by the ISP.
- 3 Purchase and install a wired router (sold separately), if one is required.

#### **NOTE**

Broadband modem and router installation procedures vary, depending on the manufacturer. Follow the manufacturer's instructions.


- 4 Connect the DSL cable (shown) or coaxial cable (not shown) from the wall to the modem.
- 5 Connect the modem to the Ethernet port on your HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> with an Ethernet cable.

The Ethernet port on the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> is located on the back of the product.



# Adjusting speaker volume

■ Use the Volume buttons on the left side of the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>.



- If you are playing music in HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>, use the Volume controls from the Music application that remain on-screen in the upper-right of the screen.
- The volume control button adjusts the sound level.

# Headphones

Use your headphones by connecting them to the headphones connector on the back side of the product. When the headphones connector is being used, the internal speakers are muted.

# Microphone

Your HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> comes with a built-in microphone near the webcam on the front of the product.

# Cleaning the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> Screen

Before cleaning the touch screen, you must disable it by turning off the unit. If the unit is not turned off, the touch screen is enabled, and you could lose data while cleaning it.

For optimal touch performance, the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> screen requires periodic cleaning to remove any particles on the sides and surface of the screen. The touch screen has a glass surface that can be cleaned by using the cleaning cloth that came with your HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>.

To achieve the best touch sensitivity, keep the screen clean from foreign objects. Avoid excessive dust accumulation on all sides and edges of the screen.

To clean the touch screen:

- 1 Turn off the product.
- 2 Disconnect the power cord from the wall.
- 3 Spray a small amount of a mild glass cleaner onto the cleaning cloth that came with your HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>.
- 4 Wipe the surface and each side of the touch screen to remove any dirt, fingerprints, or other debris that could hinder the touch recognition of the screen.

#### $\triangle$ CAUTION

Do not spray or place the cleaner directly on the screen; spray the cleaner into the cloth, and then wipe the sides and surface of the touch screen.

Do not use an abrasive cleaner or cloth when cleaning the sides or the surface of the screen, because this could cause damage to the touch screen.

# Using the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> with Safety and Comfort

To reduce the risk of serious injury, read the Safety & Comfort Guide. It describes proper workstation setup, posture, and health and work habits for product users. It also provides important electrical and mechanical safety information.

Locate the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> in the room to minimize glare from the screen. You can also reduce glare by tilting the monitor.

The HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> screen can be used as an input device; therefore, the monitor should be placed so that your shoulders and neck are comfortable.

The monitor may need to be moved close to your body to keep your shoulders relaxed while you are touching the screen. Keep your shoulders low and your upper arm close to your body when you touch the screen. The more the screen is used for input, the more important this is.

You can position the monitor in a variety of ways to provide a balance between relaxing your shoulders and keeping your head balanced comfortably over your neck. If you feel discomfort in your shoulders, try moving the monitor closer to your body or lowering the height of the monitor by lowering the work surface.

If you feel discomfort in your upper back muscles and neck, try increasing the height of the monitor by increasing the work surface height.






### Installation Combination

1. Remove the two plastic cups on the back stand using a flat screwdriver.







3. Unscrew these screws and pull out the stand and keep aside for future use.




- 4. Screw the Mount Adapter (using the screws supplied with the Wall Mount Kit) on to the space created by removing the back stand.




5. Screw the Wall Mount Plate on to the Mount Adapter using the screws supplied.






### **Missed Calls Button**

The number on this button indicates the number of video calls you have missed. Touching or clicking on this button will show you who called and at what time.



### Home Icon

Touching or clicking on Home icon will always take you to the Home Screen.



Help Button Touch or click on the Question Mark icon on top right of screen for Help on your HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>.



Add User Button Touch or click on this button to add users in your household to the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>.



#### **Volume Button**

Allows you to mute or unmute the speakers. Touching or clicking on the down arrow will bring up a volume slider that can be used to raise or lower the volume.



### **Network Status Indicator**

The Network status icon will be green when you have a network connection and will turn red when there is no network connection.



### **Guest Log In Button**

Allows you to access the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup> as a guest. Please note that some features will be disabled in guest mode.



### Log Out Button

Touching or clicking on this button will log you out of the HP DreamScreen<sup>400</sup>.
