



If the OSD menu is open, press the button to move down. If the OSD menu is not open, press the button to decrease the volume. Press the input switch/up button to increase the volume. Press and hold the volume/down button to mute or unmute the volume.

Input


If the OSD menu is open, press the button to move up. If the switch/ OSD menu is not open, press the button to switch between **up button** the computer and HDMI-in.

Opens, selects from, or exits the OSD menu. If the OSD **OK button** menu is open, press the button again to make a selection.



Navigating the Windows Start Screen

The Windows Start screen provides a central location where you can access your information and email, browse the Web, stream videos, view photos, and access your social media websites.





Display the Start menu

Select the **Start** button in the lower-left corner of the taskbar.



Search

In the taskbar search box, begin typing the name of an app, setting, file, or Internet topic.



Select the **Start** button **,** and then select **All apps .**



Shut down your computer

Select the **Start** button , select the **Power** icon (1), and then select Shut down.



Select the **Task view** icon [] in the taskbar.

This product is an All-in-One desktop computer, desktop computer, thin client computer, or retail system and might feature a thin-panel display, TouchPad, processor, RAM, hard drive or solid state drive and internal power supply, and external AC adapter. Depending on your computer model, the products have a rating of 100-240 V ac, 200-240 V ac or 100-127/200-240 V ac, 50-60 Hz or 50/60 Hz, 1.5 A, 3 A, 4 A, 5.5 A, 6 A, or 8 A. The AC adapter has a rating of 100-240 Vac, 50-60 Hz or 50-60Hz, 0.5 A, 0.6 A, 0.8A, 1A, 1.2 A, 1.4 A, 1.5 A, 1.6 A, 1.7 A, 2 A, 2.2 A, 2.25 A, 2.4 A, 2.5 A, 2.7 A, 2.9 A, or 4 A.
