



2	Wireless ( ) button and LED (wireless models only)	Press this button to turn the wireless feature on or off, or to configure a WiFi Direct connection.
	•	Press and hold this button to configure a WPS connection.
		If the wireless LED light is on, there is a stable wireless connection. If it is blinking, there is either a WPS or WiFi Direct configuration process in progress. If it is blinking rapidly, there is an issue with the wireless connection.
3	Attention LED	The Attention light blinks when the printer requires user attention. If the Attention light is on, the printer is in an error state.
4	Ready LED	The Ready light is on when the printer is ready to print. It blinks when the printer is receiving print data.
5	Resume button	Press this button to begin a print job.
		If the printer is in an error state, press the Resume button to clear the error and resume printing.





# Load Tray 1


### Introduction

The following information describes how to load paper into Tray 1. This tray holds up to 150 sheets of 75 g/m<sup>2</sup> (20 lb) paper.



- Never add or remove paper from the tray during printing.
- Before loading the tray, remove all of the paper from the input tray and straighten the stack.
- When loading the tray, do not fan the paper.
- Use paper that is not wrinkled, folded, or damaged.
- 1. Open the tray.


**NOTE:** Do not open this tray while it is in use.





2. Adjust the paper guides by squeezing the adjustment latches and sliding the guides to the size of the paper being used.

**NOTE:** To load legal-size paper, extend the tray front by pressing the blue latch and pulling the front of the tray. When loaded with legal-size paper, Tray 1 extends from the front of the printer approximately 57.5 mm (2.2 in).



3. Load the paper into the tray. For information about how to orient the paper, see <a href="Tray 1 paper orientation on page 15">Tray 1 paper orientation on page 15</a>.





4. Adjust the guides so that they lightly touch the paper stack, but do not bend it.

**NOTE:** Do not adjust the paper guides tightly against the paper stack.

**NOTE:** To prevent jams, adjust the paper guides to the correct size and do not overfill the tray.

5. Close the tray.

# Load and print envelopes

#### Introduction

The following information describes how to print and load envelopes. Tray 1 holds up to 5 envelopes.

To print envelopes using the manual feed option, follow these steps to select the correct settings in the print driver, and then load the envelopes into the tray after sending the print job to the printer.

### Print envelopes

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- 2. Select the printer from the list of printers, and then click or tap the **Properties** or **Preferences** button to open the print driver.
- NOTE: The name of the button varies for different software programs.
- NOTE: To access these features from a Windows 8 or 8.1 Start screen, select **Devices**, select **Print**, and then select the printer.
- 3. Click or tap the Paper/Quality tab.
- 4. In the **Paper size** drop-down list, select the correct size for the envelopes.
- 5. In the **Paper type** drop-down list, select **Envelope**.
- 6. In the Paper source drop-down list, select Manual feed.
- 7. Click the **OK** button to close the **Document Properties** dialog box.
- 8. In the **Print** dialog box, click the **OK** button to print the job.

# Load and print labels

#### Introduction

The following information describes how to print and load labels. Tray 1 holds up to 50 sheets of labels.

To print labels using the manual feed option, follow these steps to select the correct settings in the print driver, and then load the labels into the tray after sending the print job to the printer. When using manual feed, the printer waits to print the job until it detects that the tray has been opened.

### Manually feed labels

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- 2. Select the printer from the list of printers, and then click or tap the **Properties** or **Preferences** button to open the print driver.
  - NOTE: The name of the button varies for different software programs.
  - NOTE: To access these features from a Windows 8 or 8.1 Start screen, select **Devices**, select **Print**, and then select the printer.
- 3. Click the Paper/Quality tab.
- 4. In the **Paper size** drop-down list, select the correct size for the sheets of labels.
- 5. In the **Paper type** drop-down list, select **Labels**.
- 6. In the Paper source drop-down list, select Manual feed.
- 7. Click the **OK** button to close the **Document Properties** dialog box.
- 8. In the **Print** dialog box, click the **OK** button to print the job.








5. Remove the toner cartridge from the opened packaging shell. Save all packaging for recycling the used toner cartridge.

**6.** Holding the toner on both ends, gently rock the toner cartridge end to end to distribute the toner evenly inside the cartridge.



Install the new toner cartridge. Make sure that the color chip on the cartridge matches the color chip on the drawer.

**NOTE:** Avoid touching the green imaging drum. Fingerprints on the imaging drum can cause print defects.



**8.** Close the toner cartridge drawer.





Wi-Fi Direct does not support all mobile operating systems. If the mobile device does not support Wi-Fi Direct, you must change the wireless network connection of the device to the Wi-Fi Direct connection of the printer before printing.

NOTE: For non-Wi-Fi Direct capable mobile devices, the Wi-Fi Direct connection only enables printing. After using Wi-Fi Direct to print, you must reconnect to a local network in order to access the Internet.

To access the printer Wi-Fi Direct connection, complete the following steps:

- 1. Print a configuration page to determine the IP address or host name.
  - a. Press and hold the Resume button until the Ready Ulight begins blinking.
  - **b.** Release the Resume button.



The following solutions can help solve problems if the printer is not picking up paper from the tray or is picking up multiple sheets of paper at one time. Either of these situations can result in paper jams.

- The product does not pick up paper
- The product picks up multiple sheets of paper

## The product does not pick up paper

If the product does not pick up paper from the tray, try these solutions.

- 1. Open the product and remove any jammed sheets of paper.
- 2. Load the tray with the correct size of paper for your job.
- 3. Make sure the paper size and type are set correctly on the product control panel.
- 4. Make sure the paper guides in the tray are adjusted correctly for the size of paper. Adjust the guides to the appropriate indentation in the tray.
- 5. Check the product control panel to see if the product is waiting for you to acknowledge a prompt to feed the paper manually. Load paper, and continue.
- 6. The rollers above the tray might be contaminated. Clean the rollers with a lint-free cloth dampened with warm water.

## The product picks up multiple sheets of paper

If the product picks up multiple sheets of paper from the tray, try these solutions.

- 1. Remove the stack of paper from the tray and flex it, rotate it 180 degrees, and flip it over. *Do not fan the paper*. Return the stack of paper to the tray.
- 2. Use only paper that meets HP specifications for this product.
- 3. Use paper that is not wrinkled, folded, or damaged. If necessary, use paper from a different package.
- 4. Make sure the tray is not overfilled. If it is, remove the entire stack of paper from the tray, straighten the stack, and then return some of the paper to the tray.
- 5. Make sure the paper guides in the tray are adjusted correctly for the size of paper. Adjust the guides to the appropriate indentation in the tray.
- 6. Make sure the printing environment is within recommended specifications.

## Update the printer firmware

Try upgrading the printer firmware. For more information, see the Update the firmware section of this User Guide.

## Print from a different software program

Try printing from a different software program. If the page prints correctly, the problem is with the software program from which you were printing.

## Check the paper-type setting for the print job

Check the paper type setting when printing from a software program and the printed pages have smears, fuzzy or dark print, curled paper, scattered dots of toner, loose toner, or small areas of missing toner.

### Check the paper type setting on the printer

- 1. Open the tray.
- 2. Verify that the tray is loaded with the correct type of paper.
- 3. Close the tray.

### Check the paper type setting (Windows)

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- 2. Select the printer, and then click the **Properties** or **Preferences** button.

- **6.** Expand the category of paper types that best describes your paper.

### Check the paper type setting (OS X)

## Check toner-cartridge status

Follow these steps to check the estimated life remaining in the toner cartridges and if applicable, the status of other replaceable maintenance parts.

#### Step one: Print the supplies status page

The printer prints the supplies summary page when it prints the configuration page.

- 1. Press and hold the Resume button until the Ready Ulight begins blinking.
- 2. Release the Resume 🕟 button.

#### Step two: Check supplies status

1. Look at the supplies status report to check the percent of life remaining for the toner cartridges and if applicable, the status of other replaceable maintenance parts.

Print quality problems can occur when using a toner cartridge that is at its estimated end of life. The supplies status page indicates when a supply level is very low.

HP's Premium Protection Warranty expires when a message indicating that HP's Premium Protection Warranty on this supply has ended appears on the Supplies Status Page or the EWS.

The toner cartridge does not need to be replaced now unless the print quality is no longer acceptable. Consider having a replacement available to install when print quality is no longer acceptable.

If you determine that you need to replace a toner cartridge or other replaceable maintenance parts, the supplies status page lists the genuine HP part numbers.

2. Check to see if you are using a genuine HP cartridge.

A genuine HP toner cartridge has "HP" on it, or has the HP logo on it. For more information on identifying HP cartridges go to www.hp.com/go/learnaboutsupplies.

## Print a cleaning page

During the printing process paper, toner, and dust particles can accumulate inside the printer and can cause print-quality issues such as toner specks or spatter, smears, streaks, lines, or repeating marks.

Use the following procedure to print a cleaning page.

  - Windows 10: From the Start menu, click All Apps, click HP, and then select the printer name.
  - Windows 8.1: Click the down arrow in lower left corner of the Start screen, and then select the printer name.

### Visually inspect the toner cartridge or cartridges

Follow these steps to inspect each toner cartridge.

- 1. Remove the toner cartridges from the printer, and verify that the sealing tape has been removed.
- 2. Check the memory chip for damage.
- **3.** Examine the surface of the green imaging drum.
  - ⚠ CAUTION: Do not touch the imaging drum. Fingerprints on the imaging drum can cause print-quality problems.
- 4. If you see any scratches, fingerprints, or other damage on the imaging drum, replace the toner cartridge.
- 5. Reinstall the toner cartridge, and print a few pages to see if the problem has resolved.

### Check paper and the printing environment

### Step one: Use paper that meets HP specifications

Some print-quality problems arise from using paper that does not meet HP specifications.

- Always use a paper type and weight that this printer supports.
- Use paper that is of good quality and free of cuts, nicks, tears, spots, loose particles, dust, wrinkles, voids, staples, and curled or bent edges.
- Use paper that has not been previously printed on.
- Use paper that does not contain metallic material, such as glitter.
- Use paper that is designed for use in laser printers. Do not use paper that is designed only for use in Inkjet printers.
- Use paper that is not too rough. Using smoother paper generally results in better print quality.

#### Step two: Check the environment

The environment can directly affect print quality and is a common cause for print-quality or paper-feeding issues. Try the following solutions:

- Move the printer away from drafty locations, such as open windows or doors, or air-conditioning vents.
- Make sure the printer is not exposed to temperatures or humidity outside of printer specifications.
- Do not place the printer in a confined space, such as a cabinet.
- Place the printer on a sturdy, level surface.
- Remove anything that is blocking the vents on the printer. The printer requires good air flow on all sides, including the top.
- Protect the printer from airborne debris, dust, steam, grease, or other elements that can leave residue inside the printer.

### Step three: Set the individual tray alignment

Follow these steps when text or images are not centered or aligned correctly on the printed page when printing from specific trays.

## Check the EconoMode settings

HP does not recommend the full-time use of EconoMode. If EconoMode is used full-time, the toner supply might outlast the mechanical parts in the toner cartridge. If print quality begins to degrade and is no longer acceptable. consider replacing the toner cartridge.



NOTE: This feature is available with the PCL 6 print driver for Windows. If you are not using that driver, you can enable the feature by using the HP Embedded Web Server.





- If streaks appear in multiple color bands, contact HP. A component other than the toner cartridge is probably causing the problem.



Image defects, no matter the cause, can often be resolved using the same steps. Use the following steps as a starting point for solving image defect issues.

- Reprint the document. Print quality defects can be intermittent in nature or can go away completely with 1. continued printing.
- Check the condition of the cartridge or cartridges. If a cartridge is in a **Very Low** state (it has passed the 2. rated life), replace the cartridge.
- Make sure that the driver and tray print mode settings match the media that is loaded in the tray. Try using 3. a different ream of media or a different tray. Try using a different print mode.
- Make sure that the printer is within the supported operating temperature/humidity range. 4.
- Make sure that the paper type, size, and weight are supported by the printer. See the printer support page 5. at support.hp.com for a list of the supported paper sizes and types for the printer.



NOTE: The term "fusing" refers to the part of the printing process where toner is affixed to paper.





#### Hot fuser offset (shadow):


Slight shadows, or offsets, of the image repeated down the page. The repeated image might fade with each recurrence.



- Reprint the document.
- Check the paper type in the paper tray and adjust the printer settings to match. If necessary, select a lighter paper type.
- **3.** If the problem persists, go to support.hp.com.

#### Poor fusing:

Toner rubs off along either edge of page. This defect is more common at the edges of high-coverage jobs and on light media types but can occur anywhere on the page.



- Reprint the document.
- Check the paper type in the paper tray and adjust the printer settings to match. If necessary, select a heavier paper type.
- Enterprise models only: From the printer control panel, go to the Edgeto-Edge menu and then select Normal. Reprint the document.
- Enterprise models only: From the printer control panel, select Auto Include Margins and then reprint the document.
- . If the problem persists, go to support.hp.com.

### Margins and skew:

The image is not centered, or is skewed on the page. The defect occurs when the paper is not positioned properly as it is pulled from the tray and moves through the paper path.



- . Reprint the document.
- Remove the paper and then reload the tray. Make sure that all the paper edges are even on all sides.
- Make sure that the top of the paper stack is below the tray full indicator. Do not overfill the tray.
- Make sure that the paper guides are adjusted to the correct size for the paper. Do not adjust the paper guides tightly against the paper stack. Adjust them to the indentations or markings in the tray.
- **5.** If the problem persists, go to support.hp.com.

#### Color plane registrations:

One or more color of the planes is not aligned with the other color planes. The primary error will typically occur with yellow.



- Reprint the document.
- From the printer control panel, calibrate the printer.
- If a cartridge has reached a Very Low state or the printed output is severely faded, replace the cartridge.
- From the printer control panel use the Restore Calibration feature to reset the printer's calibration settings to the factory defaults.
- If the problem persists, go to support.hp.com.

#### Output curl:

Printed paper has curled edges. The curled edge can be along the short or long side of the paper. Two types of curl are possible:

- Positive curl: The paper curls toward the printed side. The defect occurs in dry environments or when printing high coverage pages.
- Negative curl: The paper curls away from the printed side. The defect occurs in high-humidity environments or when printing low coverage pages.



- . Reprint the document.
- Positive curl: From the printer control panel, select a heavier paper type. The heavier paper type creates a higher temperature for printing.

**Negative curl:** From the printer control panel, select a lighter paper type. The lighter paper type creates a lower temperature for printing. Try storing the paper in a dry environment prior or use freshly opened paper.


- 3. Print in duplex mode.
- **4.** If the problem persists, go to support.hp.com.

#### Output stacking:

The paper does not stack well in the output tray. The stack might be uneven, skewed, or the pages might be pushed out of the tray and onto the floor. Any of the following conditions can cause this defect:

- Extreme paper curl
- The paper in the tray is wrinkled or deformed
- The paper is a non-standard paper type, such as envelopes
- The output tray is too full

- 1. Reprint the document.
- 2. Extend the output bin extension.
- If the defect is caused by extreme paper curl, complete the troubleshooting steps for Output curl.
- 4. Use a different paper type.
- 5. Use freshly opened paper.
- Remove the paper from the output tray before the tray gets too full.
- If the problem persists, go to support.hp.com.

## Solve wired network problems

### Introduction

Certain types of problems can indicate there is a network communication problem. These problems include the following issues:

- The periodic loss of ability to communicate with the printer
- The printer cannot be found during driver installation
- A periodic failure to print



NOTE: If you have been experiencing intermittent loss of network productivity, first update the printer firmware. For instructions on how to update the printer firmware, go to http://support.hp.com, search for your printer, and then search on "update the firmware."

Check the following items to verify that the printer is communicating with the network. Before beginning, print a configuration page from the printer control panel and locate the printer IP address that is listed on this page.

- Poor physical connection
- The computer is unable to communicate with the printer
- The printer is using incorrect link and duplex settings for the network
- New software programs might be causing compatibility problems
- The computer or workstation might be set up incorrectly
- The printer is disabled, or other network settings are incorrect



NOTE: HP does not support peer-to-peer networking, as the feature is a function of Microsoft operating systems and not of the HP print drivers. For more information, go to Microsoft at www.microsoft.com.

## Poor physical connection

- Verify that the printer is attached to the correct network port using a cable of the correct length.
- 2. Verify that cable connections are secure.
- Look at the network port connection on the back of the printer, and verify that the amber activity light flashes indicating network traffic, and the green link-status light is continuously lit indicating a network link.
- If the problem continues, try a different cable or port on the hub.

## The computer is unable to communicate with the printer

- Test network communication by pinging the network.
  - Open a command-line prompt on your computer.

- For Windows, click **Start**, click **Run**, type cmd, and then press **Enter**.
- For OS X, go to **Applications**, then **Utilities**, and open **Terminal**.
- **b.** Type ping followed by the IP address for your printer.
- c. If the window displays round-trip times, the network is working.
- 2. If the ping command failed, verify that the network hubs are on, and then verify that the network settings, the printer, and the computer are all configured for the same network (also known as subnet).
- 3. Open the printer properties and click the **Ports** tab. Verify that the current IP address for the printer is selected. The printer IP address is listed on the printer configuration page.
- 4. If you installed the printer using the HP standard TCP/IP port, select the box labeled **Always print to this** printer, even if its IP address changes.
- 5. If you installed the printer using a Microsoft standard TCP/IP port, use the printer's hostname instead of the IP address.
- 6. If the IP address is correct, delete the printer and then add it again.

## The printer is using incorrect link and duplex settings for the network

HP recommends leaving these settings in automatic mode (the default setting). If you change these settings, you must also change them for your network.

## New software programs might be causing compatibility problems

Verify that any new software programs are correctly installed and that they use the correct print driver.

## The computer or workstation might be set up incorrectly

- 1. Check the network drivers, print drivers, and the network redirection settings.
- 2. Verify that the operating system is configured correctly.

## The printer is disabled, or other network settings are incorrect

- 1. Review the printer's configuration/networking pages to check the status of the network settings and protocols.
- 2. Reconfigure the network settings if necessary.

## Wireless connectivity checklist

- Verify that the network cable is not connected.
- Verify that the printer and the wireless router are turned on and have power. Also make sure that the wireless radio in the printer is turned on.
- Verify that the service set identifier (SSID) is correct. Print a configuration page to determine the SSID. If you are not sure the SSID is correct, run the wireless setup again.
- With secured networks, verify that the security information is correct. If the security information is incorrect, run the wireless setup again.
- If the wireless network is working correctly, try accessing other computers on the wireless network. If the network has Internet access, try connecting to the Internet over a wireless connection.
- Verify that the encryption method (AES or TKIP) is the same for the printer as it is for the wireless access point (on networks using WPA security).
- Verify that the printer is within the range of the wireless network. For most networks, the printer must be within 30 m (100 ft) of the wireless access point (wireless router).
- Verify that obstacles do not block the wireless signal. Remove any large metal objects between the access point and the printer. Make sure poles, walls, or support columns containing metal or concrete do not separate the printer and wireless access point.

- Verify that the printer is located away from electronic devices that might interfere with the wireless signal. Many devices can interfere with the wireless signal including motors, cordless phones, security system cameras, other wireless networks, and some Bluetooth devices.
- Verify that the print driver is installed on the computer.
- Verify that you have selected the correct printer port.
- Verify that the computer and printer connect to the same wireless network.
- For OS X, verify that the wireless router supports Bonjour.

## The printer does not print after the wireless configuration completes

- 1. Make sure that the printer is turned on and in the ready state.
- 2. Turn off any third-party firewalls on your computer.
- 3. Make sure that the wireless network is working correctly.
- 4. Make sure that your computer is working correctly. If necessary, restart the computer.
- 5. Verify that you can open the printer HP Embedded Web Server from a computer on the network.

## The printer does not print, and the computer has a third-party firewall installed

- 1. Update the firewall with the most recent update available from the manufacturer.
- 2. If programs request firewall access when you install the printer or try to print, make sure you allow the programs to run.
- 3. Temporarily turn off the firewall, and then install the wireless printer on the computer. Enable the firewall when you have completed the wireless installation.

## The wireless connection does not work after moving the wireless router or printer

- 1. Make sure that the router or printer connects to the same network that your computer connects to.
- 2. Print a configuration page.

- 3. Compare the service set identifier (SSID) on the configuration page to the SSID in the printer configuration for the computer.
- 4. If the numbers are not the same, the devices are not connecting to the same network. Reconfigure the wireless setup for the printer.

## Cannot connect more computers to the wireless printer

- 1. Make sure that the other computers are within the wireless range and that no obstacles block the signal. For most networks, the wireless range is within 30 m (100 ft) of the wireless access point.
- 2. Make sure that the printer is turned on and in the ready state.
- 3. Make sure there are not more than 5 concurrent Wi-Fi Direct users.
- 4. Turn off any third-party firewalls on your computer.

- 5. Make sure that the wireless network is working correctly.
- **6.** Make sure that your computer is working correctly. If necessary, restart the computer.

### The wireless printer loses communication when connected to a VPN

• Typically, you cannot connect to a VPN and other networks at the same time.

## The network does not appear in the wireless networks list

- Make sure the wireless router is turned on and has power.
- The network might be hidden. However, you can still connect to a hidden network.

## The wireless network is not functioning

- 1. Make sure that the network cable is not connected.
- 2. To verify if the network has lost communication, try connecting other devices to the network.
- **3.** Test network communication by pinging the network.
  - **a.** Open a command-line prompt on your computer.
    - For Windows, click **Start**, click **Run**, type cmd, and then press **Enter**.
    - For OS X, go to **Applications**, then **Utilities**, and open **Terminal**.
  - **b.** Type ping followed by the router IP address.
  - **c.** If the window displays round-trip times, the network is working.
- **4.** Make sure that the router or printer connects to the same network that the computer connects to.
  - **a.** Print a configuration page.
  - **b.** Compare the service set identifier (SSID) on the configuration report to the SSID in the printer configuration for the computer.
  - **c.** If the numbers are not the same, the devices are not connecting to the same network. Reconfigure the wireless setup for the printer.

## Perform a wireless network diagnostic test

From the printer control panel, you can run a diagnostic test that provides information about the wireless network settings.

- 1. Open the HP Embedded Web Server (EWS):
  - **a.** Print a configuration page to determine the IP address or host name.
    - i. Press and hold the Resume [ ▶] button until the Ready ♥ light begins blinking.
    - ii. Release the Resume 🕟 button.

**b.** Open a web browser, and in the address line, type the IP address or host name exactly as it displays on the printer configuration page. Press the Enter key on the computer keyboard. The EWS opens.



- NOTE: If the displays a message indicating that accessing the website might not be safe, select the option to continue to the website. Accessing this website will not harm the computer.
- 2. Select the **Networking** tab.
- 3. On the **Wireless Configuration** page, verify that the On option is selected.
- 4. Click the **Print Test Report** button to print a test page that shows test results.

#### Reduce interference on a wireless network

The following tips can reduce interference in a wireless network:

- Keep the wireless devices away from large metal objects, such as filing cabinets, and other electromagnetic devices, such as microwaves and cordless telephones. These objects can disrupt radio signals.
- Keep the wireless devices away from large masonry structures and other building structures. These objects can absorb radio waves and lower signal strength.
- Position the wireless router in a central location in line of sight with the wireless printers on the network.
