


## Safety information

Before moving the machine, turn the power off and disconnect all cords. If you have a medical condition that prevents you from lifting, do not lift the machine. Ask for help, and always use the appropriate amount of people to lift the device safely.



Choose a flat surface with enough space for ventilation to place the machine. Also consider the space required to open the cover and trays.



Do not place the machine on an unstable surface.

The machine could fall, causing injury or machine damage.



Make sure you plug the power cord into a grounded electrical outlet.



Use the power cord supplied with your machine for safe operation.

Connect the power cord directly to the power outlet. Do not use extension cords or power strips.

- 2. Select the Menu button on the left to enter Menu mode.
- 3. Press the arrows until the needed menu item appears and press OK.
- 4. If the setting item has sub menus, repeat step 3.
- **5.** Press OK to save the selection.
- 6. Select the Back 5 button to return to the previous menu item.
- 7. Press the Stop/Clear 🗙 button to return to the ready mode.



### Preparing paper

- Use only print media that meets the specifications required by the machine.
- If you use print media that does not meet the specifications outlined in this user guide, the following problems may occur:
  - Low printing quality, paper jams, excessive wear on the machine.
- The weight, material, surface condition, and moisture content of the print media may affect the performance and printing quality of the machine.
- Some print media may not produce the desired result even if it meets the specifications outlined in this user guide.
  - This may occur due to mishandling of the print media, unsuitable temperature or humidity, or other uncontrollable factors.
- Using print media that does not meet the specifications outlined in this user guide may result in machine malfunctions that require repairs.
  - Such repairs are not covered by the warranty agreement.
- Do not use inkjet photo print media with this machine. Doing so may damage the machine.
- Do not use creased, torn, or damp print media.



## Preprinted paper

When loading preprinted paper, the printed side should be facing up with an uncurled edge at the front. If you experience problems with paper feeding, turn the paper around. Note that print quality is not guaranteed.



- Must be printed with heat-resistant ink that will not melt, vaporize, or release hazardous emissions when subjected to the machine's fusing temperature for 0.1 second (about 170°C (338°F)).
- Preprinted paper ink must be non-flammable and should not adversely affect machine rollers.
- Before you load preprinted paper, verify that the ink on the paper is dry. During the fusing process, wet ink can come off preprinted paper, reducing print quality.

# Loading the original

### Introduction

The following topics describe how to prepare originals for copying and how to load originals on the scanner glass or in the document feeder.

- Preparing originals

## Preparing originals

- Do not load documents that are smaller than  $125 \times 101.6$ mm ( $4.92 \times 4$  inches) or larger than  $297 \times 914$  mm ( $11.6 \times 36$  inches).
- Do not load documents printed on the following types of paper to avoid paper jams, low printing quality, and machine malfunctions:
  - Carbon-paper or carbon-backed paper
  - Coated paper
  - Tracing paper or thin paper
  - Wrinkled or creased paper
  - Curled or rolled paper
  - Torn paper
- Remove all staples and paper clips from the document before loading it.
- Make sure that any glue, ink, or correction fluid on the document is completely dry before loading it.
- Do not load original documents that include different sizes or weights of paper.
- Do not load booklets, pamphlets, transparencies, or documents with other unusual characteristics.




## On the scanner glass

Using the scanner glass, you can copy or scan originals. You can get the best scan quality, especially for colored or gray-scaled images. Make sure that no originals are in the document feeder. If an original is detected in the document feeder, the machine gives it priority over the original on the scanner glass.

1. Lift and open the scanner lid.

#### NOTE:

- Leaving the scanner lid open while copying may affect copy quality and toner consumption.
- Dust on the scanner glass may cause black spots on the printout. Always keep it clean.
- If you are copying a page from a book or magazine, lift the scanner lid until its hinges are caught by the stopper and then close the lid. If the book or magazine is thicker than 30 mm, start copying with the scanner lid open.

#### **CAUTION:**

- Be careful not to break the scanner glass. You may get hurt.
- Do not look into the light from inside of the scanner while copying or scanning. It is harmful to the eyes.


### In the document feeder

Using the automatic document feeder (ADF), you can load up to 100 sheets of paper (80 g/m2, 21 lbs bond) for one job.



# Print secure documents from the control panel

**PIN printing (Confidential printing by RAM disk)** is a simple method of safeguarding print jobs at the printer until the end user enters the proper PIN to retrieve the private job. This method works with the **Job Storage** feature enabled in the printer driver and the private print jobs are stored in the RAM disk. Each print job is given a job name, user name, and a PIN number. An end user needs to have this information before being able to print the job to an output tray.

- 1. Make sure that the machine is connected to your computer and powered on.
- 2. On the HP UPD, select the **Personal Job** mode, and then enter a PIN and User name.
  - Select your printer from your Windows operating system, click the Printing Preferences menu, and then select the Job Storage tab.
  - **b.** Make sure to select **PIN to print** from the **Make Job Private/Secure** drop-down list to enter a PIN, and then select the User name.

The printer saves this job in the RAM disk.

NOTE: If the RAM disk is full, the control panel will display the following message "Memory Full."

The maximum number of confidential print jobs is 100. If the machine has 100 jobs stored in the printer, a new job will be stored after removing the oldest print job.

# Changing the settings for each copy

Your machine provides default settings for copying so that you can quickly and easily make a copy.



- If you press the Stop/Clear button twice while setting the copy options, all of the options you have set for the current copy job will be canceled and returned to their default status. Or, they will automatically return to their default status after the machine completes the copy in progress.
- Accessing menus may differ from model to model.
- It may be necessary to press OK to navigate to lower-level menus for some models.

#### **Darkness**

If you have an original containing faint marking and dark images, you can adjust the brightness to make a copy that is easier to read.

- 1. Select Copy > Menu > Copy Feature > Darkness on the control panel.
  - Or press Darkness 
    on the control panel.
- 2. Select the option you want and press OK.
  - For example, the +5 being the lightest, and the -5 being the darkest.
- 3. Press the Stop/Clear button to return to ready mode.

## Original Type

The original setting is used to improve the copy quality by selecting the document for the current copy job.

- 1. Select Copy > Menu > Copy Feature > Original Type on the control panel.
  - Or select Menu > Copy Feature > Original Type on the control panel.
- 2. Select the option you want and press OK.
  - **Text**: Use for originals containing mostly text.
  - **Text/Photo**: Use for originals with mixed text and photographs.
  - NOTE: If texts in the printout is blurry, select **Text** to get the clear texts.
  - **Photo**: Use when the originals are photographs.
  - Map: Use when the originals are map.
- 3. Press the Stop/Clear button to return to ready mode.

## Reduced or enlarged copy

You can reduce or enlarge the size of a copied image from 25% to 400% from the document feeder or scanner glass.

## NOTE:

- This feature may not be available depending on model or optional goods.






# Scanning from the machine

## Introduction

The following topics describe how to set up the Scan menu options from the control panel and then scan a document.

NOTE: In order for the Scan To button to function, you must install the HP Scan Software on the PC.

To change the menu options:

Press Scan > Scan To PC on the control panel.

# Scanning from a computer

### Introduction

The following topics describe several methods for scanning a document from the scanner to a computer.



NOTE: The maximum resolution that can be achieved depends upon various factors, including computer speed, available disk space, memory, the size of the image being scanned, and bit depth settings. Thus, depending on your system and what you are scanning, you may not be able to scan at certain resolutions, especially using enhanced dpi.

#### Scan to PC

The HP LaserJet MFP M42523, MFP M42525 full software installation includes the HP Scan Application. The HP Scan Application enables the **Scan To** button on the printer's control panel.

The HP Scan Application includes the Scan to PC Setup utility for configuring the scan settings used when scanning is done using the **Scan To** button on the printer's control panel.

#### Configure scan settings using the Scan to PC Setup utility

- Open the **Scan to PC Setup** utility: 1.
  - Select the **Windows** icon in the left-bottom corner of the screen. a.
  - Select All Programs. b.
  - Select the **HP** or **HP LaserJet Printers** folder. c.
  - d. Select the **HP MFP Scan to PC Setup** application.
- Select your printer from the list in the Scan to PC Setup utility, and then click the Properties button. The following settings are available:
  - **Profile Name**—This is the name that displays on the printer's control panel to identify and select the profile.

#### Scan to PC

- Place a single document face down on the document glass, or load the documents face up into the document feeder.
- 2. Touch Scan to PC on the control panel.
- 3. Select your registered computer ID, and enter the Password if necessary.
- 4. Select the option you want and then touch OK.
- **5.** Scanning begins.
- NOTE: Scanned images are saved in C:\Users\users name\My Documents. The saved folder may differ, depending on your operating system or the application you are using.

### Scanning from the HP Scan Software

The full software solution available at hp.com, includes a TWAIN compliant scan application.

- 1. Open the HP Scan Application:
  - a. Click the **Start** button.
  - b. Click All Programs.
  - c. Click HP or HP LaserJet Printers.
  - d. Click HP MFP Scan.
- 2. Use the Quick Scan, Advanced Scan or Configuration features to scan documents or to adjust scan settings.

### Scanning from image editing program

You can scan and import documents in the image editing software such as Adobe Photoshop, if the software is TWAIN-compliant. Follow the steps below to scan with TWAIN-compliant software:

- 1. Make sure that the machine is connected to your computer and powered on.
- 2. Place a single document face down on the document glass, or load the documents face up into the document feeder.
- 3. Open an application, such as Adobe Photoshop.
- 4. Click **File** > **Import**, and select the scanner device.
- 5. Set the scan options.
- **6.** Scan and save your scanned image.

### Scanning using the WIA driver

Your machine supports the Windows Image Acquisition (WIA) driver for scanning images. WIA is one of the standard components provided by Microsoft Windows and works with digital cameras and scanners. Unlike the TWAIN driver, the WIA driver allows you to scan and easily adjust images without using additional software:

- 1. Make sure that the machine is connected to your computer and powered on.
- 2. Place a single document face down on the document glass, or load the documents face up into the document feeder.
- 3. Open a WIA-compliant application, for example Microsoft Paint, and then do the following:
  - a. Select File
  - b. Select From Scanner or Camera.
  - c. Select M42523/M42525 Scan.
- 4. From the **WIA Scan** screen select **Flatbed** or **Document Feeder** as the **Paper Source**.
- NOTE: When using the document feeder as the paper source the File Type and Page Size must be configured in the Settings menu.
- 5. Click the **Scan** button.

### Scanning via WSD

Scans the originals and saves the scanned data on a connected computer if the computer supports the WSD (Web Service for Device) feature. To use the WSD feature, you need to install the WSD printer driver on your computer. For Windows, you can install the WSD driver by **Control Panel > Devices and Printers > Add a printer**. Click **Add a network printer** from the wizard.

IMPORTANT: To use the WSD feature the computer must have **Network Discovery** and **File and Print Sharing** enabled.

#### NOTE:

- Device Discovery and File and Print Sharing must be enabled on the computer for WSD to work.
- The machine that does not support the network interface, it will not be able to use this feature.
- The WSD feature works only with Windows Vista® or later version that are the WSD-compliant computer.
- The following installation steps are based on a Windows computer.

#### Installing a WSD Printer Driver

- 1. Select Start > Control Panel > Devices and Printers > Add a printer.
- 2. Click **Add a network, wireless or Bluetooth printer** from the wizard.
- 3. In the printers list, select the one you want to use, and then click **Next**.

- If no WSD printer is displayed in the list, click **The printer that I want isn't listed > Add a printer using a TCP/IP address or hostname** and select **Web Services Device** from **Device type**. Then enter the printer's IP address.
- 4. Follow the instructions in the installation window.

#### Scanning using the WSD feature

- 1. Make sure that the machine is connected to your computer and powered on.
- 2. Place a single document face down on the document glass, or load the documents face up into the document feeder.
- 3. Select Scan :> Scan To WSD on the control panel.
- NOTE: If you see **Not Available** message, check the port connection. Or check the printer driver for WSD is correctly installed.
- 4. Select your computer name from **Destination List**.
- 5. Select the option you want and press OK.
- **6.** Scanning begins.



Network-connected MFPs have an Embedded Web Server available to view and modify printer settings.

#### Access the EWS

Use the following steps to open the EWS:

- 1. Print a configuration page to obtain your printer's IP address or host name.
- 2. Open a Web browser, and in the address line, type the IP address or host name exactly as it displays on the configuration page. Press the Enter key on the computer keyboard. The EWS opens.



If the Web browser displays a **There is a problem with this website's security certificate** message when attempting to open the EWS, click **Continue to this website (not recommended)**.

NOTE: Choosing Continue to this website (not recommended) will not harm the computer while navigating within the EWS for the HP printer.

#### Modify settings in the EWS

The EWS displays printer settings in a "Read-only" view by default. Users must log in to the EWS to change any settings. Use the following steps to log into the EWS:

- 6. Select the check box next to **SMTP Requires Authentication** to require authentication.
- 7. Enter the SMTP server login name and password.
- 8. Click the **Apply** button.

#### Set up a server destination

NOTE: Make sure the network is connected to the printer.

Follow these steps to set up an email account:

- 1. Access the EWS, and then click the **Sign In** button in the upper-right of the EWS page.
- 2. Type in the correct **ID** and **Password** to log into the EWS.
- 3. Click the **Address Book** tab, and then select **Individual** > **Add**.
- 4. Select the check box next to Add FTP or Add SMB.
- 5. Enter the IP address in dotted decimal notation or as a host name.
- **6.** Enter the server port number, from 1 to 65535.
- 7. Select the check box next to **Anonymous**, to enable the server permit access of unauthorized people.
- 8. Enter the login name and password.

- Enter the domain name if your server is joined to the certain domain, otherwise just enter your computer name which is registered to the SMB.
- **10.** Enter the path for saving the scanned image.
  - NOTE: The folder to save the scanned image must be on the root.

The folder properties need to be setup as a share.

Your user name should have the rights to read and write the folder.

# Available maintenance parts

To purchase maintenance parts, contact the source where you bought the machine. Replacing maintenance parts can be performed only by an authorized service provider, dealer, or the retailer where you bought the machine. The warranty does not cover the replacement of any maintenance parts once it has reached its "Average yield".

Maintenance parts are replaced at specific intervals to avoid print quality and paper feed problems resulting from worn parts, see table below. The purpose of which is to maintain your machine in top working condition. The maintenance parts below should be replaced when the life span of each item has been met.

### Storing the consumables

Consumables contain components that are sensitive to light, temperature, and humidity. HP suggests users follow these recommendations to ensure optimal performance, highest quality, and longest life from your new HP consumables.

Store the consumables in the same environment in which the printer will be used. This should be in controlled temperature and humidity conditions. The consumables should remain in their original and unopened package until installation.

If the consumables are removed from the printer, follow the instructions below to store the imaging unit properly.

- Store the cartridge inside the protective bag from the original package.
- Store lying flat (not standing on end) with the same side facing up as if it were installed in the machine.
- Do not store consumables in any of the following conditions:
  - Temperature greater than 40°C (104°F).
  - Humidity range less than 20% or greater than 80%.
  - An environment with extreme changes in humidity or temperature.
  - Direct sunlight or room light.
  - Dusty places.
  - A car for a long period of time.
  - An environment where corrosive gases are present.
  - An environment with salty air.

### Imaging unit handling instructions

- Opening the imaging unit package prior to use dramatically shortens its useful shelf and operating life. Do
  not store on the floor.
- If original packaging is not available, cover the top opening of the imaging unit with paper and store in a dark cabinet.
- Do not touch the surface of the photoconductive drum in the imaging unit.
- Do not expose the imaging unit to unnecessary vibrations or shock.
- Never manually rotate the drum, especially in the reverse direction; this can cause internal damage and toner spillage.

### Toner cartridge usage

HP cannot recommend the use of non-HP toner cartridges, either new or remanufactured.

NOTE: For HP printer products, the use of a non-HP toner cartridge or a refilled toner cartridge does not affect either the warranty to the customer or any HP support contract with the customer. However, if product failure or damage is attributable to the use of a non-HP toner cartridge or refilled toner cartridge, HP will charge its standard time and materials charges to service the product for the particular failure or damage.



# Redistributing toner

When the toner cartridge is near the end of its life:


- White streaks or light printing occurs and/or density varies from side to side.
- The Status LED blinks red. The toner-related message saying that the toner is low may appear on the display.
- The computer's Printing Status program window appears on the computer telling you which cartridge is low on toner.

If this happens, you can temporarily improve print quality by redistributing the remaining toner in the cartridge. In some cases, white streaks or light printing will still occur even after you have redistributed the toner.





# Cleaning the machine

If printing quality problems occur or if you use your machine in a dusty environment, you need to clean your machine regularly to keep it in the best printing condition and use your machine longer.

#### **A** CAUTION:

- Cleaning the cabinet of the machine with cleaning materials containing large amounts of alcohol, solvents, or other strong substances can discolor or distort the cabinet.
- If your machine or the surrounding area is contaminated with toner, we recommend you use a cloth or tissue dampened with water to clean it. If you use a vacuum cleaner, toner blows in the air and might be harmful to you.

### Cleaning the outside

Clean the machine cabinet with a soft, lint-free cloth. Dampen the cloth slightly with water, but be careful not to let any water drip onto or into the machine.

### Cleaning the inside

During the printing process, paper, toner, and dust particles can accumulate inside the machine. This buildup can cause print quality problems, such as toner specks or smearing. Cleaning the inside of the machine clears and reduces these problems.

#### **↑** CAUTION:

- To prevent damage to the toner cartridge, do not expose it to light for more than a few minutes. Cover it with a piece of paper, if necessary.
- Do not touch the green area of the toner cartridge. Use the handle on the cartridge to avoid touching this
  area.
- Use a dry lint free cloth when cleaning the inside of the machine, be careful not to damage the transfer
  roller or any other inside parts. Do not use solvents such as benzene or thinner. Printing quality problems
  can occur and cause damage to the machine.

- Use a dry lint-free cloth to clean the machine.
- Turn the machine off and unplug the power cord. Wait for the machine to cool down.

### Cleaning the scan unit

Keeping the scan unit clean helps ensure the best possible copies. We suggest that you clean the scan unit at the start of each day and during the day as needed.

#### NOTE:

- Turn the machine off and unplug the power cord. Wait for the machine to cool down.
- Illustrations on this user's guide may differ from your machine depending on its options or models. Check your machine type
- 1. Slightly dampen a soft, lint-free cloth or paper towel with water.
- 2. Lift and open the scanner lid.
- 3. Wipe the surface of the scanner until it is clean and dry.

### Update the firmware

The following steps explain how to download and update the firmware on the printer.

#### Step one: Download the firmware from HP.com

- 1. Go to <a href="www.hp.com/support">www.hp.com/support</a>, select **Software and Drivers**, type the printer name in the search field, click **Find**, and then select the model from the list of search results.
- 2. If it is not automatically detected, select or change the operating system.
- 3. Under the **Firmware** or **Firmware-system** section, locate the Firmware Update Utility file.
- 4. Click **Download** and save the file to a location such as your Desktop or Downloads folder.
- 5. Open the location where the firmware file was saved, right-click the .zip file, and then extract the files.

#### Step two: Update the firmware

Follow the appropriate steps for either a USB cable connection or a wired network connection.

#### Method one: Update the firmware for a USB-connected printer (Windows XP/Vista/7/8/8.1/10)

Use this method to update the firmware if the printer is connected to the computer via a USB cable.



- 1. Make sure the printer is connected to the computer via a USB cable and can successfully copy or print.
- 2. Turn the printer off.
- 3. Press and hold the Stop/Clear button on the device control panel.
- 4. Turn the printer on, keeping the Stop/Clear button pressed in until the control panel displays the following message: **Download mode, press stop or cancel key**.
- 5. Press the Stop/Clear button again to enter Emergency Mode. A **Wait Image** messages displays on the control panel.
- 6. On your computer, navigate to the folder containing the files downloaded from HP.com.
- 7. Select the \*.hd firmware file and drag and drop it onto the usblist2.exe file. The firmware update will start automatically on the printer.
- 8. Once completed, the firmware update will reboot the printer automatically.
- 9. Print a configuration page to verify the installed firmware version after the update process.

#### Method two: Update the firmware for a network-connected printer

Use this method to update the firmware if the printer is connected to the computer via a wired network.

NOTE: In order to use this method, you must use a computer browser to open the Embedded Web Server (EWS).
