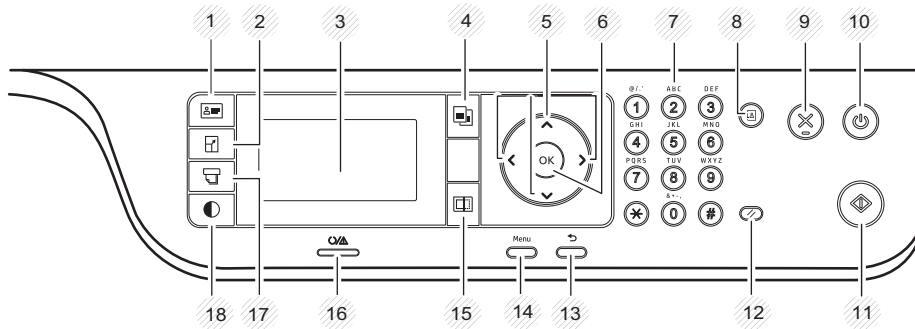
Control panel overview

1	ID Copy		Allows you to copy both sides of an ID card like a driver's license on a single side of paper.
2	Reduce/Enlarge		You can reduce or enlarge the size of a copied image from 25% to 400% when you copy original documents from the scanner glass.
3	Display screen		Shows the current status and prompts during an operation.
4	Copy		Switches to Copy mode.
5	Arrows		Scroll through the options available in the selected menu, and increase or decrease values.
6	OK		Confirms the selection on the screen.
7	Numeric keypad		Enter the number of copies.
8	Address book		Allows you to store a list of email addresses.
9	Stop/Clear		Stops and clears current operation.
10	Power / Wake Up		Turns the power on or off, or wakes up the machine from the power save mode. If you need to turn the machine off, press this button for more than three seconds.
11	Start		Begins a copying job.
12	Reset		Reset the copy settings to default values.
13	Back		Sends you back to the upper menu level.
14	Menu		Enters Menu mode and scrolls through the available menus.
15	Scan		Switches to Scan mode.

16	Status LED		Indicates the status of your machine.
17	Paper Select		Select the tray you want from the display screen.
18	Darkness		Adjusts the brightness level to make a copy for easier reading, when the original contains faint markings and dark images.

Accessing the menus

2. Select the Menu  button on the left to enter Menu mode.
3. Press the arrows until the needed menu item appears and press **OK**.

5. Press **OK** to save the selection.
6. Select the Back  button to return to the previous menu item.
7. Press the Stop/Clear  button to return to the ready mode.

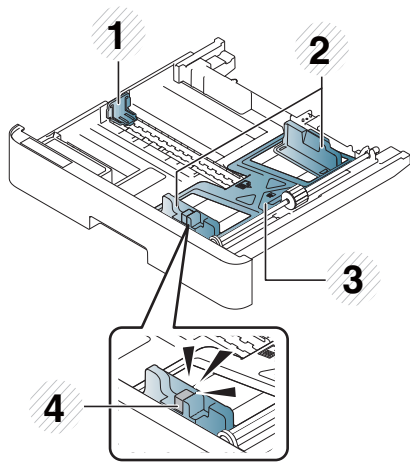

Preparing paper

- Use only print media that meets the specifications required by the machine.
- If you use print media that does not meet the specifications outlined in this user guide, the following problems may occur:
 - Low printing quality, paper jams, excessive wear on the machine.
- The weight, material, surface condition, and moisture content of the print media may affect the performance and printing quality of the machine.
- Some print media may not produce the desired result even if it meets the specifications outlined in this user guide.

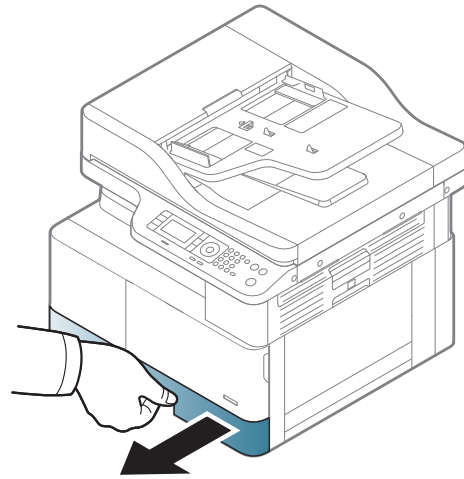
This may occur due to mishandling of the print media, unsuitable temperature or humidity, or other uncontrollable factors.
- Using print media that does not meet the specifications outlined in this user guide may result in machine malfunctions that require repairs.

Such repairs are not covered by the warranty agreement.
- Do not use inkjet photo print media with this machine. Doing so may damage the machine.
- Do not use creased, torn, or damp print media.

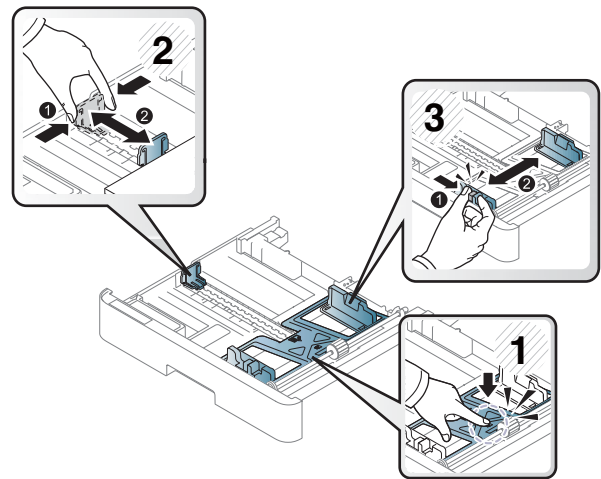
 **WARNING!** The use of inflammable media or foreign materials left in the printer may lead to overheating of the unit and, in rare cases may cause a fire.

Tray 2 / optional tray

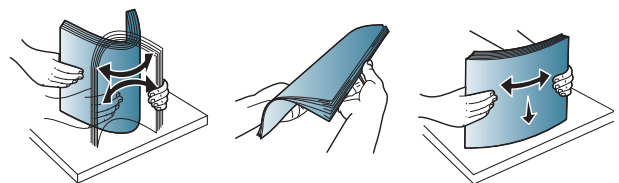
1. Pull out the paper tray.



2. Squeeze and slide the paper width guide and paper length lever to locate them in the correct paper size slot marked at the bottom of the tray to adjust to the size.

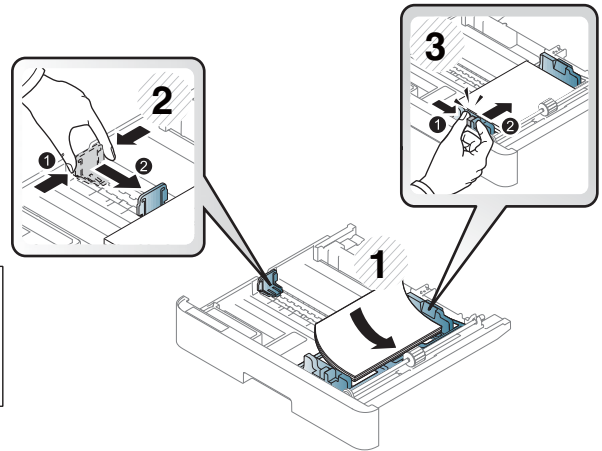
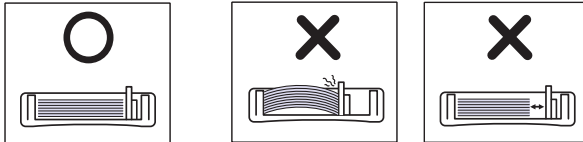


3. Flex or fan the edge of the paper stack to separate the pages before loading papers.

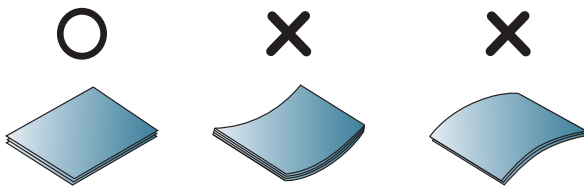


4. After inserting paper into the tray, squeeze and slide the paper width guides and paper length guide.

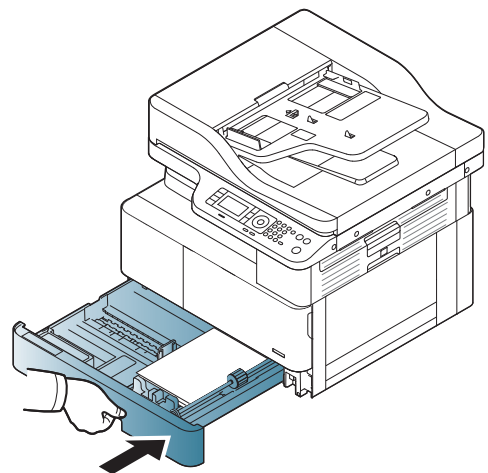
- Do not push the paper width guide too far causing the media to warp.
- If you do not adjust the paper width guide, it may cause paper jams.



- Do not use a paper with a leading-edge curl, it may cause a paper jam or the paper can be wrinkled.



5. Insert the tray back into the machine.



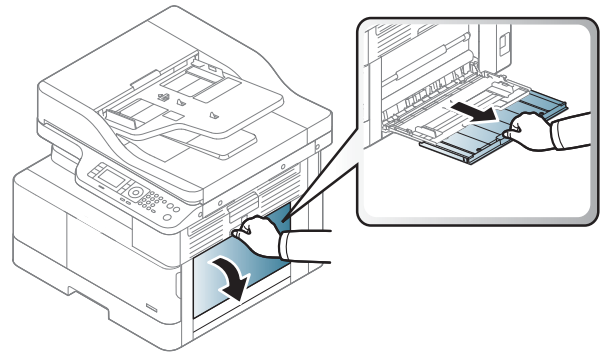
6. When you print a document, set the paper type and size for Tray 2/ optional tray.

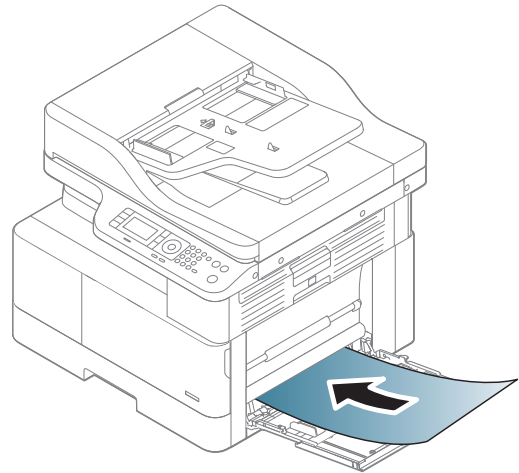
Multi-purpose Tray 1

The multi-purpose tray can hold special sizes and types of print material, such as postcards and note cards.

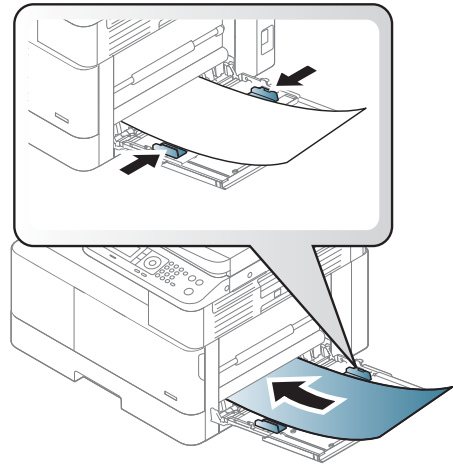
1. Hold the handle of multi-purpose tray and pull it down to open and pull out the multi-purpose tray paper extension.



2. Load the paper.

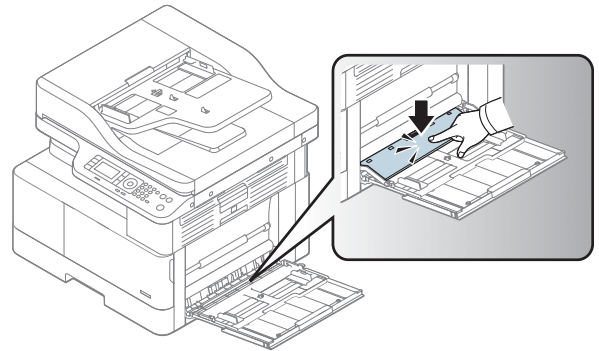


3. Squeeze the multi-purpose tray paper width guides and adjust them to the width of the paper. Do not force them too much, or the paper will bent resulting in a paper jam or skew.




4. When you print a document, set the paper type and size for the multipurpose tray.

CAUTION: To avoid paper jams, always press down the Tray 1 feed plate when reloading paper.



Printing on special media

The paper setting in the machine and driver should match to print without a paper mismatch error.

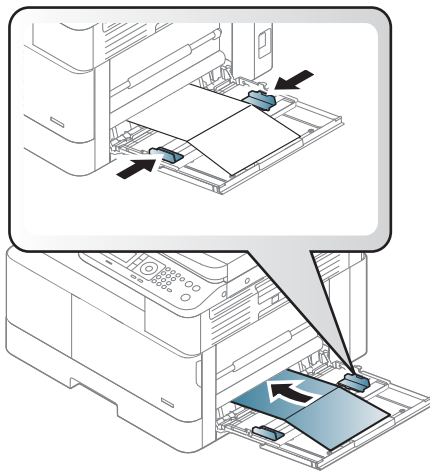
Or if your machine supports a display screen, you can set it using the Menu  button on the control panel.

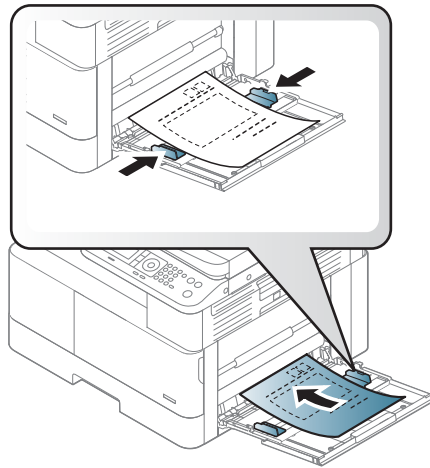
Card stock/Custom-sized paper



In the software application, set the margins to at least 6.4 mm (0.25 inches) away from the edges of the material.

Preprinted paper

When loading preprinted paper, the printed side should be facing up with an uncurled edge at the front. If you experience problems with paper feeding, turn the paper around. Note that print quality is not guaranteed.




- Must be printed with heat-resistant ink that will not melt, vaporize, or release hazardous emissions when subjected to the machine's fusing temperature for 0.1 second (about 170°C (338°F)).
- Preprinted paper ink must be non-flammable and should not adversely affect machine rollers.
- Before you load preprinted paper, verify that the ink on the paper is dry. During the fusing process, wet ink can come off preprinted paper, reducing print quality.





Setting the paper size and type

The paper setting in the machine and driver should match to print without a paper mismatch error.

From the print driver or application, set the paper type from the **Print Options** window > **Properties** > **Paper** tab > **Type**.

 **NOTE:** It may be necessary to press **OK** to navigate to lower-level menus for some models.

After loading paper in the paper tray, set the paper size and type using the control panel buttons.

1. Select Menu  > **System Setup** > **Paper Setup** > **Paper Size** or **Paper Type** on the control panel.
2. Select the tray and the option you want.
3. Press **OK** to save the selection.
4. Click the Back  button to the right of the Menu  button to return to the Paper Setup screen. Then select the paper type if desired.
5. Press the Stop/Clear  button to return to ready mode.

 **NOTE:** If you want to use special-sized paper such as billing paper, select the **Paper** tab > **Size** > **Edit...** and set **Custom Paper Size Settings** in the **Printing Preferences**.

Preparing originals

- Do not load documents that are smaller than 125 x 101.6mm (4.92 x 4 inches) or larger than 297 x 914 mm (11.6 x 36 inches).
- Do not load documents printed on the following types of paper to avoid paper jams, low printing quality, and machine malfunctions:
 - Carbon-paper or carbon-backed paper
 - Coated paper
 - Tracing paper or thin paper
 - Wrinkled or creased paper
 - Curled or rolled paper
 - Torn paper
- Remove all staples and paper clips from the document before loading it.
- Make sure that any glue, ink, or correction fluid on the document is completely dry before loading it.
- Do not load original documents that include different sizes or weights of paper.
- Do not load booklets, pamphlets, transparencies, or documents with other unusual characteristics.

Loading originals

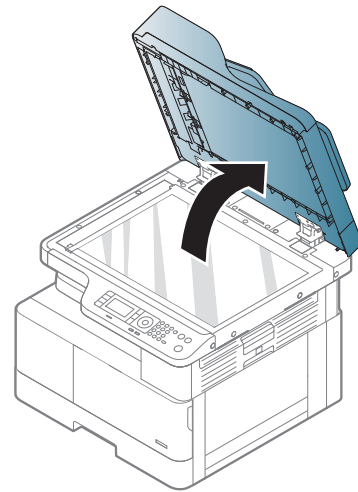
You can use the scanner glass or the document feeder to load an original for copying and scanning.

 **NOTE:** Illustrations on this user's guide may differ from your machine depending on its options or models. Check your machine type.

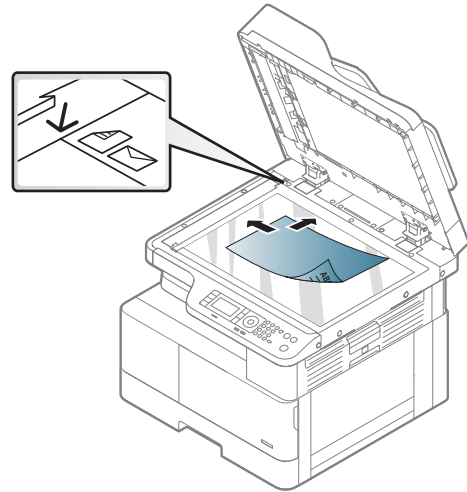
On the scanner glass

Using the scanner glass, you can copy or scan originals. You can get the best scan quality, especially for colored or gray-scaled images. Make sure that no originals are in the document feeder. If an original is detected in the document feeder, the machine gives it priority over the original on the scanner glass.

1. Lift and open the scanner lid.



2. Place the original face down on the scanner glass. Align it with the registration guide at the top left corner of the glass.



3. Close the scanner lid.

NOTE:

- Leaving the scanner lid open while copying may affect copy quality and toner consumption.
- Dust on the scanner glass may cause black spots on the printout. Always keep it clean.
- If you are copying a page from a book or magazine, lift the scanner lid until its hinges are caught by the stopper and then close the lid. If the book or magazine is thicker than 30 mm, start copying with the scanner lid open.

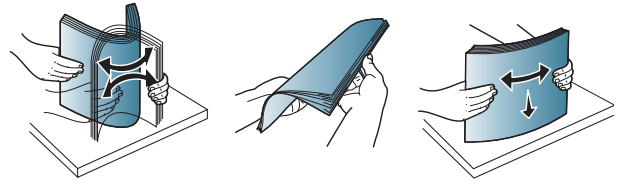
CAUTION:

- Be careful not to break the scanner glass. You may get hurt.
- Do not look into the light from inside of the scanner while copying or scanning. It is harmful to the eyes.

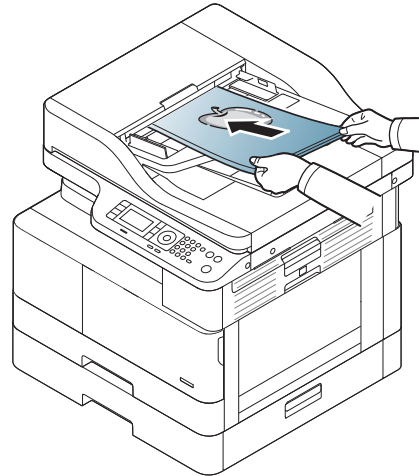
In the document feeder

Using the automatic document feeder (ADF), you can load up to 100 sheets of paper (80 g/m², 21 lbs bond) for one job.

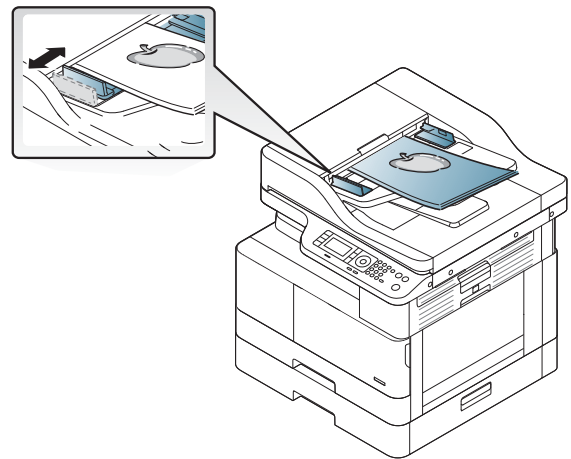
1. Flex or fan the edge of the paper stack to separate the pages before loading originals.



2. Load the original face up into the document feeder input tray. Make sure that the bottom of the original stack matches the paper size marked on the document input tray.



3. Adjust the document feeder width guides to the paper size.



NOTE: Dust on the document feeder glass may cause black lines on the printout. Always keep the glass clean.

Print setup on the control panel

Print secure documents from the control panel

PIN printing (Confidential printing by RAM disk) is a simple method of safeguarding print jobs at the printer until the end user enters the proper PIN to retrieve the private job. This method works with the **Job Storage** feature enabled in the printer driver and the private print jobs are stored in the RAM disk. Each print job is given a job name, user name, and a PIN number. An end user needs to have this information before being able to print the job to an output tray.

1. Make sure that the machine is connected to your computer and powered on.
2. On the HP UPD, select the **Personal Job** mode, and then enter a PIN and User name.
 - a. Select your printer from your Windows operating system, click the **Printing Preferences** menu, and then select the **Job Storage** tab.
 - b. Make sure to select **PIN to print** from the **Make Job Private/Secure** drop-down list to enter a PIN, and then select the User name.

The printer saves this job in the RAM disk.

 **NOTE:** If the RAM disk is full, the control panel will display the following message “**Memory Full.**”

The maximum number of confidential print jobs is 100. If the machine has 100 jobs stored in the printer, a new job will be stored after removing the oldest print job.

- c. Click the **Apply** button.
3. Select **Secured Job** menu on the control panel.

The control panel will display a list of secure print jobs.

 **NOTE:** If a user sends multiple confidential jobs, the user name is only listed one time on the printer.

4. Select the document to print.
5. Enter the PIN that you set for the printer driver.
6. Print or delete the document.




Basic copying

Changing the settings for each copy





Your machine provides default settings for copying so that you can quickly and easily make a copy.

NOTE:

- If you press the Stop/Clear  button twice while setting the copy options, all of the options you have set for the current copy job will be canceled and returned to their default status. Or, they will automatically return to their default status after the machine completes the copy in progress.
- Accessing menus may differ from model to model.
- It may be necessary to press **OK** to navigate to lower-level menus for some models.




Darkness

If you have an original containing faint marking and dark images, you can adjust the brightness to make a copy that is easier to read.


1. Select Copy  > Menu  > **Copy Feature** > **Darkness** on the control panel.
Or press Darkness  on the control panel.
2. Select the option you want and press **OK**.
For example, the **+5** being the lightest, and the **-5** being the darkest.
3. Press the Stop/Clear  button to return to ready mode.

Original Type

The original setting is used to improve the copy quality by selecting the document for the current copy job.

1. Select Copy  > Menu  > **Copy Feature** > **Original Type** on the control panel.
Or select Menu  > **Copy Feature** > **Original Type** on the control panel.
2. Select the option you want and press **OK**.
 - **Text**: Use for originals containing mostly text.
 - **Text/Photo**: Use for originals with mixed text and photographs.

 **NOTE:** If texts in the printout is blurry, select **Text** to get the clear texts.

- **Photo**: Use when the originals are photographs.
 - **Map**: Use when the originals are map.
3. Press the Stop/Clear  button to return to ready mode.






Reduced or enlarged copy

You can reduce or enlarge the size of a copied image from 25% to 400% from the document feeder or scanner glass.





NOTE:

- This feature may not be available depending on model or optional goods.
 - If the machine set to Eco mode, reduce and enlarge features are not available.

To select from the predefined copy sizes

1. Select Copy  > Menu  > **Copy Feature** > **Reduce/Enlarge** on the control panel.
Or select Menu  > **Copy Feature** > Reduce/Enlarge  button on the control panel.
2. Select the option you want and press **OK**.
3. Press the Stop/Clear  button to return to ready mode.

To scale the copy by directly entering the scale rate

1. Select Copy  > Menu >  > **Copy Feature** > **Reduce/Enlarge** > **Custom** on the control panel.
Or select Menu  > **Copy Feature** > **Reduce/Enlarge** > **Custom** on the control panel.
2. Enter the copy size you want using the numeric keypad.
3. Press **OK** to save the selection.
4. Press the Stop/Clear  button to return to ready mode.

 NOTE: When you make a reduced copy, black lines may appear at the bottom of your copy.

ID card copying

Your machine can print 2-sided originals on one sheet.

The machine prints one side of the original on the upper half of the paper and the other side on the lower half without reducing the size of the original. This feature is helpful for copying a small-sized item such as business card.

 **NOTE:**

- The original must be placed on the scanner glass to use this feature.
 - If the machine set to Eco mode, this feature is not available.

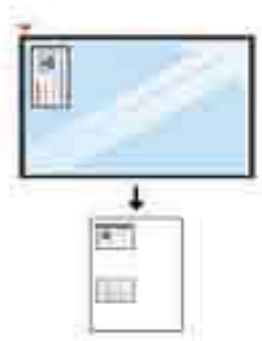
Depending on the model, the operating procedure may differ.

1. Press ID Copy  on the control panel.

Or select (Menu) > **Copy Feature** > **Layout** > **ID Copy** on the control panel.

2. Place the front side of an original facing down on the scanner glass where arrows indicate as shown. Then, close the scanner lid.

 **NOTE:** To get a better image, close the scanner lid and lightly press the scanner lid.

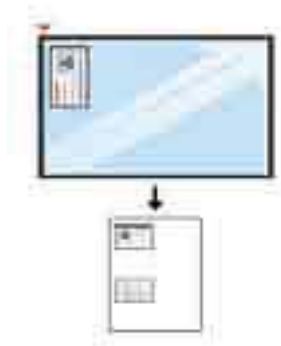


3. **Place Front Side Press [Start]** appears on the display.

4. Press Start .

Your machine begins scanning the front side and shows **Place Rear Side Press [Start]**.

5. Turn the original over and place it on the scanner glass where arrows indicate as shown. Then, close the scanner lid.

Scan feature

 **NOTE:** In order for the **Scan To** button to function, you must install the HP Scan Software on the PC.

Scan to PC

The HP LaserJet MFP M42523, MFP M42525 full software installation includes the HP Scan Application. The HP Scan Application enables the **Scan To** button on the printer's control panel.

The HP Scan Application includes the **Scan to PC Setup** utility for configuring the scan settings used when scanning is done using the **Scan To** button on the printer's control panel.

Configure scan settings using the Scan to PC Setup utility

1. Open the **Scan to PC Setup** utility:

3. Open an application, such as Adobe Photoshop.

Scanning using the WIA driver

Your machine supports the Windows Image Acquisition (WIA) driver for scanning images. WIA is one of the standard components provided by Microsoft Windows and works with digital cameras and scanners. Unlike the TWAIN driver, the WIA driver allows you to scan and easily adjust images without using additional software:


1. Make sure that the machine is connected to your computer and powered on.
2. Place a single document face down on the document glass, or load the documents face up into the document feeder.
3. Open a WIA-compliant application, for example Microsoft Paint, and then do the following:
 - a. Select **File**
 - b. Select **From Scanner or Camera**.
 - c. Select **M42523/M42525 Scan**.
4. From the **WIA Scan** screen select **Flatbed** or **Document Feeder** as the **Paper Source**.

 **NOTE:** When using the document feeder as the paper source the **File Type** and **Page Size** must be configured in the **Settings** menu.

5. Click the **Scan** button.

Scanning via WSD

Scans the originals and saves the scanned data on a connected computer if the computer supports the WSD (Web Service for Device) feature. To use the WSD feature, you need to install the WSD printer driver on your computer. For Windows, you can install the WSD driver by **Control Panel > Devices and Printers > Add a printer**. Click **Add a network printer** from the wizard.

 **IMPORTANT:** To use the WSD feature the computer must have **Network Discovery** and **File and Print Sharing** enabled.

 **NOTE:**

- **Device Discovery** and **File and Print Sharing** must be enabled on the computer for WSD to work.
 - The machine that does not support the network interface, it will not be able to use this feature.
 - The WSD feature works only with Windows Vista® or later version that are the WSD-compliant computer.

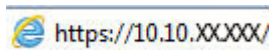

Access the EWS

If the Web browser displays a **There is a problem with this website's security certificate** message when attempting to open the EWS, click **Continue to this website (not recommended)**.

 **NOTE:** Choosing **Continue to this website (not recommended)** will not harm the computer while navigating within the EWS for the HP printer.

Modify settings in the EWS


The EWS displays printer settings in a “Read-only” view by default. Users must log in to the EWS to change any settings. Use the following steps to log into the EWS:

2. Type `admin` for both the **ID** and **Password**.

Otherwise, new toner cartridges or other supplies will be incompatible with your machine due to different configurations of toner cartridges and other supplies according to the specific country/region conditions.

 **CAUTION:** HP does not recommend using non-genuine HP toner cartridge such as refilled or remanufactured toner. HP cannot guarantee non-genuine HP toner cartridge's quality. Service or repair required as a result of using non-genuine HP toner cartridges will not be covered under the machine's warranty.

Available accessories

Available maintenance parts

To purchase maintenance parts, contact the source where you bought the machine. Replacing maintenance parts can be performed only by an authorized service provider, dealer, or the retailer where you bought the machine. The warranty does not cover the replacement of any maintenance parts once it has reached its "Average yield".

Maintenance parts are replaced at specific intervals to avoid print quality and paper feed problems resulting from worn parts, see table below. The purpose of which is to maintain your machine in top working condition. The maintenance parts below should be replaced when the life span of each item has been met.

Storing the consumables

Consumables contain components that are sensitive to light, temperature, and humidity. HP suggests users follow these recommendations to ensure optimal performance, highest quality, and longest life from your new HP consumables.

Store the consumables in the same environment in which the printer will be used. This should be in controlled temperature and humidity conditions. The consumables should remain in their original and unopened package until installation.

If the consumables are removed from the printer, follow the instructions below to store the imaging unit properly.

- Store the cartridge inside the protective bag from the original package.
- Store lying flat (not standing on end) with the same side facing up as if it were installed in the machine.
- Do not store consumables in any of the following conditions:
 - Temperature greater than 40°C (104°F).
 - Humidity range less than 20% or greater than 80%.
 - An environment with extreme changes in humidity or temperature.
 - Direct sunlight or room light.
 - Dusty places.
 - A car for a long period of time.
 - An environment where corrosive gases are present.
 - An environment with salty air.

Imaging unit handling instructions

- Opening the imaging unit package prior to use dramatically shortens its useful shelf and operating life. Do not store on the floor.
- If original packaging is not available, cover the top opening of the imaging unit with paper and store in a dark cabinet.
- Do not touch the surface of the photoconductive drum in the imaging unit.
- Do not expose the imaging unit to unnecessary vibrations or shock.
- Never manually rotate the drum, especially in the reverse direction; this can cause internal damage and toner spillage.

Toner cartridge usage

HP cannot recommend the use of non-HP toner cartridges, either new or remanufactured.



NOTE: For HP printer products, the use of a non-HP toner cartridge or a refilled toner cartridge does not affect either the warranty to the customer or any HP support contract with the customer. However, if product failure or damage is attributable to the use of a non-HP toner cartridge or refilled toner cartridge, HP will charge its standard time and materials charges to service the product for the particular failure or damage.

Estimated toner cartridge life


Print cartridge life is approximate, based on average A4 /Letter-size page count with ISO coverage. Declared cartridge yield value in accordance with ISO/IEC 19798. Redistributing toner

When the toner cartridge is near the end of its life:

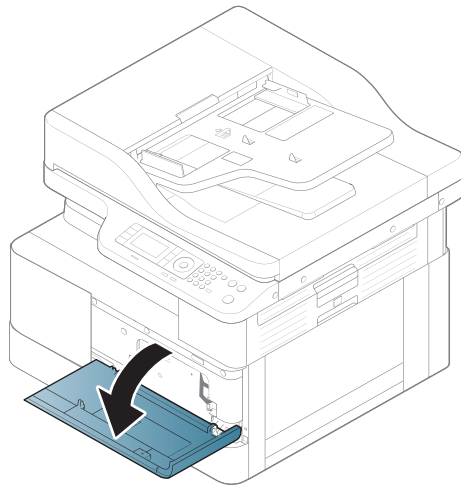
- White streaks or light printing occurs and/or density varies from side to side.
- The Status LED blinks red. The toner-related message saying that the toner is low may appear on the display.
- The computer's Printing Status program window appears on the computer telling you which cartridge is low on toner.

If this happens, you can temporarily improve print quality by redistributing the remaining toner in the cartridge. In some cases, white streaks or light printing will still occur even after you have redistributed the toner.

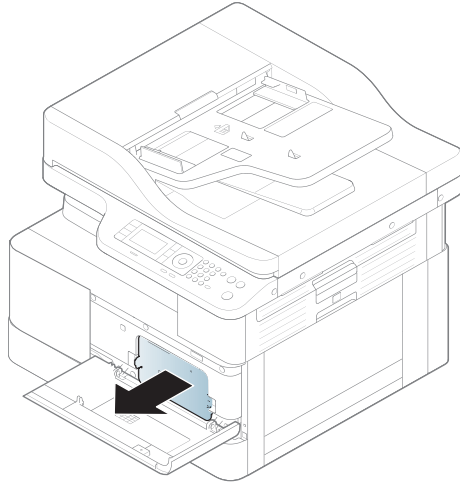

Toner cartridge installation

1. Remove toner cartridge from shipping bag.

Monitoring the supplies life

If you experience frequent paper jams or printing problems, check the number of pages the machine has printed or scanned. Replace the corresponding parts, if necessary.



NOTE:

- Some menus may not appear in the display depending on options or models. If so, it is not applicable to your machine.
- It may be necessary to press **OK** to navigate to lower-level menus for some models.


1. Select Menu  > **System Setup** > **Maintenance** > **Supplies Life** on the control panel.
2. Select the option you want and press **OK**.
3. Press the Stop/Clear  button to return to ready mode.

Setting the toner low alert

If the amount of toner in the cartridge is low, a message or LED informing the user to change the toner cartridge appears. You can set the option for whether or not this message or LED appears.



NOTE: It may be necessary to press **OK** to navigate to lower-level menus for some models.

1. Select Menu  > **System Setup** > **Maintenance** > **Toner Low Alert** on the control panel.
2. Select the option you want.
3. Press **OK** to save the selection.

Cleaning the machine

If printing quality problems occur or if you use your machine in a dusty environment, you need to clean your machine regularly to keep it in the best printing condition and use your machine longer.

CAUTION:

- Cleaning the cabinet of the machine with cleaning materials containing large amounts of alcohol, solvents, or other strong substances can discolor or distort the cabinet.
 - If your machine or the surrounding area is contaminated with toner, we recommend you use a cloth or tissue dampened with water to clean it. If you use a vacuum cleaner, toner blows in the air and might be harmful to you.

Cleaning the outside

Clean the machine cabinet with a soft, lint-free cloth. Dampen the cloth slightly with water, but be careful not to let any water drip onto or into the machine.

Cleaning the inside

During the printing process, paper, toner, and dust particles can accumulate inside the machine. This buildup can cause print quality problems, such as toner specks or smearing. Cleaning the inside of the machine clears and reduces these problems.

CAUTION:

- To prevent damage to the toner cartridge, do not expose it to light for more than a few minutes. Cover it with a piece of paper, if necessary.
- Do not touch the green area of the toner cartridge. Use the handle on the cartridge to avoid touching this area.
- Use a dry lint free cloth when cleaning the inside of the machine, be careful not to damage the transfer roller or any other inside parts. Do not use solvents such as benzene or thinner. Printing quality problems can occur and cause damage to the machine.

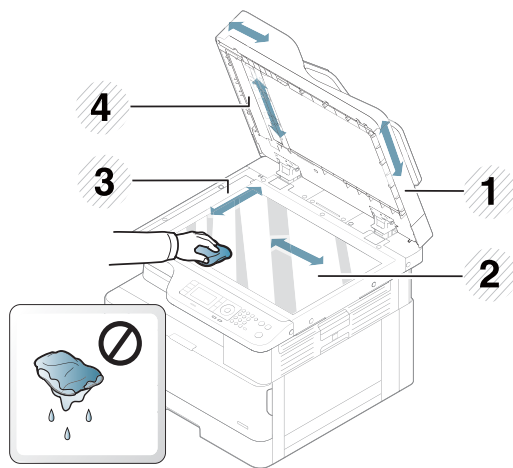
Cleaning the scan unit

Keeping the scan unit clean helps ensure the best possible copies. We suggest that you clean the scan unit at the start of each day and during the day as needed.

NOTE:

- Turn the machine off and unplug the power cord. Wait for the machine to cool down.
- Illustrations on this user's guide may differ from your machine depending on its options or models. Check your machine type

1. Slightly dampen a soft, lint-free cloth or paper towel with water.
2. Lift and open the scanner lid.
3. Wipe the surface of the scanner until it is clean and dry.

Update the firmware

The following steps explain how to download and update the firmware on the printer.

Step one: Download the firmware from HP.com

1. Go to www.hp.com/support, select **Software and Drivers**, type the printer name in the search field, click **Find**, and then select the model from the list of search results.
2. If it is not automatically detected, select or change the operating system.
3. Under the **Firmware** or **Firmware-system** section, locate the Firmware Update Utility file.
4. Click **Download** and save the file to a location such as your Desktop or Downloads folder.
5. Open the location where the firmware file was saved, right-click the .zip file, and then extract the files.

Step two: Update the firmware




Follow the appropriate steps for either a USB cable connection or a wired network connection.

Method one: Update the firmware for a USB-connected printer (Windows XP/Vista/7/8/8.1/10)

Use this method to update the firmware if the printer is connected to the computer via a USB cable.



NOTE: In order to use this method, you must have a driver or full software solution installed.

1. Make sure the printer is connected to the computer via a USB cable and can successfully copy or print.
2. Turn the printer off.
3. Press and hold the Stop/Clear  button on the device control panel.
4. Turn the printer on, keeping the Stop/Clear  button pressed in until the control panel displays the following message: **Download mode, press stop or cancel key.**
5. Press the Stop/Clear  button again to enter Emergency Mode. A **Wait Image** messages displays on the control panel.
6. On your computer, navigate to the folder containing the files downloaded from HP.com.
7. Select the *.hd firmware file and drag and drop it onto the usblast2.exe file. The firmware update will start automatically on the printer.
8. Once completed, the firmware update will reboot the printer automatically.
9. Print a configuration page to verify the installed firmware version after the update process.

Method two: Update the firmware for a network-connected printer

Use this method to update the firmware if the printer is connected to the computer via a wired network.




NOTE: In order to use this method, you must use a computer browser to open the Embedded Web Server (EWS).

1. Print a configuration page to obtain your printer's IP address or host name.

2. Open a Web browser, and in the address line, type the IP address or host name exactly as it displays on the configuration page. Press the **Enter** key on the computer keyboard. The EWS opens.

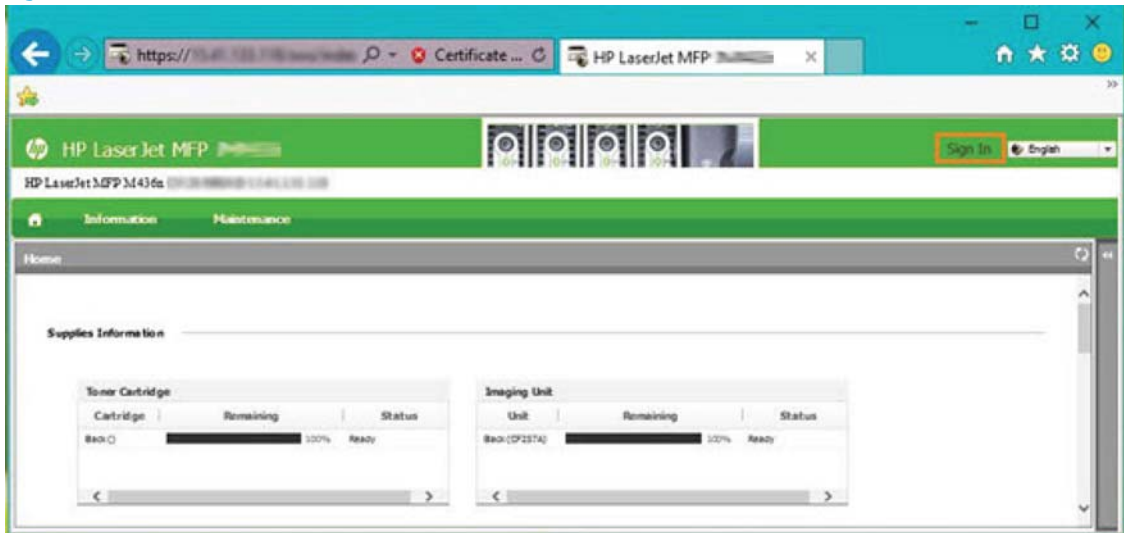

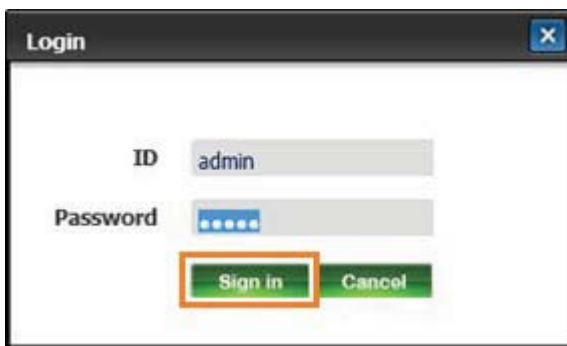

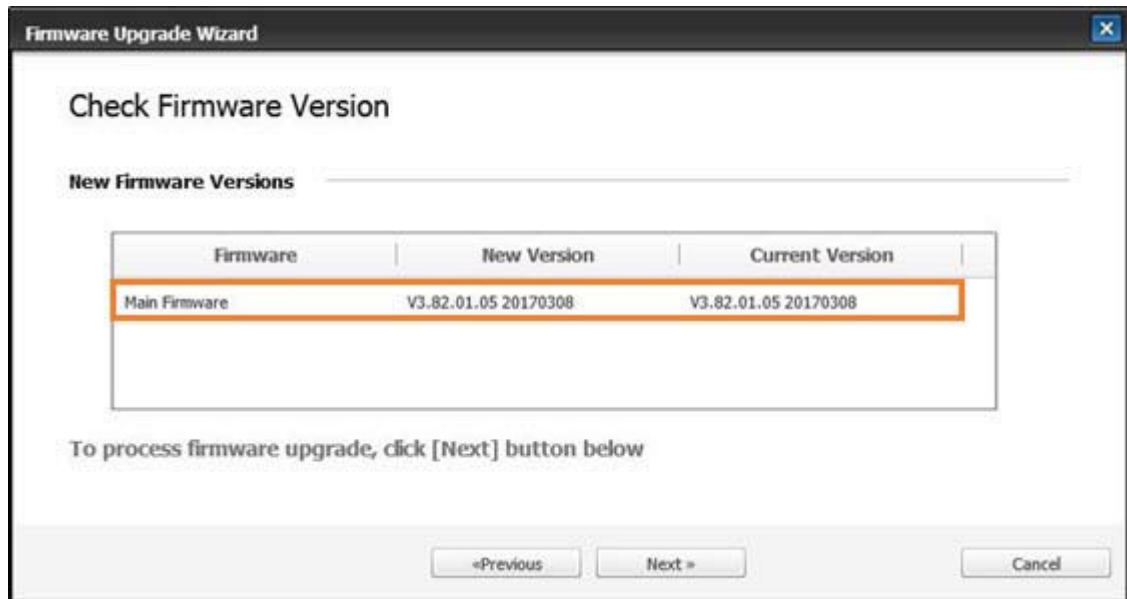

11. Wait for the firmware programming process to complete and for the printer to restart.

 **NOTE:** This process will take several minutes. Do not close the browser window or interrupt communication until the HP Embedded Web Server (EWS) displays the confirmation page.

12. Follow any remaining on-screen instructions to complete the installation.
13. Print a configuration page to verify the installed firmware version after the update process.

Machine's initial set up

After setting up the printer and connecting the printer to a power cable, follow these steps to set up a password:

1. Select your country from the list of countries.



NOTE: Depending on the country selected, the system will select the language.


2. Enter an eight-digit numerical pin code as a password, and then type the password again to confirm the password.



NOTE: If a password is not valid, “**Invalid input**” error message will display on the screen. Press the **OK** button.


Machine's basic settings

To change the machine's default settings, follow these steps:

 **NOTE:** It may be necessary to press **OK** to navigate to lower-level menus for some models.

1. Select Menu  > **System Setup** > **Machine Setup** on the control panel.
2. Select the option you want, then press **OK**.

 **NOTE:** When you press the Power/Wake Up  button or start printing, the product will wake up from the power saving mode.

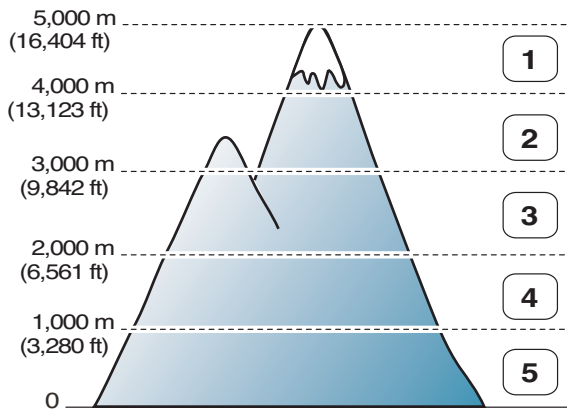

Altitude adjustment

Print quality is affected by atmospheric pressure, which is determined by the height of the machine above sea level. The following information will guide you on how to set your machine for the best print quality.

Paper feeding problems

The following table describes common paper feeding problems and suggested solutions for each one.

Condition	Suggested solutions






Condition	Possible cause	Suggested solutions
The machine does not print.	The machine is not receiving power.	Connect the machine to the electricity supply first. If the machine has a Power / Wake Up  button on the control, press it.
	The machine is not selected as the default machine.	Select your machine as your default machine in Windows.
	Check the machine for the following:	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The cover is not closed. Close the cover. • Paper is jammed. Clear the paper jam. • No paper is loaded. Load paper. • The toner cartridge is not installed. Install the toner cartridge. • Make sure the protective cover and sheets are removed from the toner cartridge. 	
	If a system error occurs, contact your service representative.	
	The connection cable between the computer and the machine is not connected properly.	Disconnect the machine cable and reconnect it.
	The connection cable between the computer and the machine is defective.	If possible, attach the cable to another computer that is working properly and print a job. You can also try using a different machine cable.
	The port setting is incorrect.	Check the Windows printer settings to make sure that the print job is sent to the correct port. If the computer has more than one port, make sure that the machine is attached to the correct one.
	The machine may be configured incorrectly.	Check the Printing Preferences to ensure that all of the print settings are correct.
	The printer driver may be incorrectly installed.	Uninstall and reinstall the machine's driver.
The machine is malfunctioning.	Check the display message on the control panel to see if the machine is indicating a system error. Contact a service representative.	
The document size is so big that the hard disk space of the computer is insufficient to access the print job.	Get more hard disk space and print the document again.	
The output tray is full.	Once the paper is removed from the output tray, the machine resumes printing.	
The machine selects print materials from the wrong paper source.	The paper option that was selected in the Printing Preferences may be incorrect.	For many software applications, the paper source selection is found under the Paper tab within the Printing Preferences . Select the correct paper source. See the printer driver help screen.
A print job is extremely slow.	The job may be very complex.	Reduce the complexity of the page or try adjusting the print quality settings.
Half the page is blank.	The page orientation setting may be incorrect.	Change the page orientation in your application.






Condition	Possible cause	Suggested solutions
	The paper size and the paper size settings do not match.	Ensure that the paper size in the printer driver settings matches the paper in the tray. Or, ensure that the paper size in the printer driver settings matches the paper selection in the software application settings you use.
The machine prints, but the text is wrong, garbled, or incomplete.	The machine cable is loose or defective.	Disconnect the machine cable and reconnect. Try a print job that you have already printed successfully. If possible, attach the cable and the machine to another computer that you know works and try a print job. Finally, try a new machine cable.
	The wrong printer driver was selected.	Check the application's printer selection menu to ensure that your machine is selected.
	The software application is malfunctioning.	Try printing a job from another application.
	The operating system is malfunctioning.	Exit Windows and reboot the computer. Turn the machine off and back on again.
Pages print, but they are blank.	The toner cartridge is defective or out of toner.	Redistribute the toner, if necessary. If necessary, replace the toner cartridge.
	The file may have blank pages.	Check the file to ensure that it does not contain blank pages.
	Some parts, such as the controller or the board, may be defective.	Contact a service representative.
The machine does not print PDF files correctly. Some parts of graphics, text, or illustrations are missing.	Incompatibility between the PDF file and the Acrobat products.	Printing the PDF file as an image may enable the file to print. Turn on Print As Image from the Acrobat printing options. NOTE: It will take longer to print when you print a PDF file as an image.
The print quality of photos is not good. Images are not clear.	The resolution of the photo is very low.	Reduce the photo size. If you increase the photo size in the software application, the resolution will be reduced.
Before printing, the machine emits vapor near the output tray.	Using damp/wet paper can cause vapor [white smoke] during printing.	This is not a problem, just keep printing. If you are bothered by the smoke [vapor], then replace the paper with fresh paper from an unopened ream.
The machine does not print special-sized paper, such as billing paper.	Paper size and paper size setting do not match.	Set the correct paper size in the Custom in Paper tab in Printing Preferences .
The printed billing paper is curled.	The paper type setting does not match.	Change the printer option and try again. Go to Printing Preferences , click Paper tab, and set type to Thin .






Printing quality problems





The following table describes common printing quality problems, shows examples of each one, and lists suggested solutions.

Condition	Example	Suggested solutions
Light or faded print		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If a vertical white streak or faded area appears on the page, the toner supply is low. Install a new toner cartridge. • The paper may not meet paper specifications; for example, the paper may be too moist or rough. • If the entire page is light, the print resolution setting is too low or the toner save mode is on. Adjust the print resolution and turn the toner save mode off. See the help screen of the printer driver. • A combination of faded or smeared defects may indicate that the toner cartridge needs cleaning. Clean the inside of your machine. • The surface of the LSU part inside the machine may be dirty. Clean the inside of your machine. If cleaning does not correct the problem, contact a service representative.
The top half of the paper is printed lighter than the rest of the paper		<p>The toner might not adhere properly to this type of paper.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Change the printer option and try again. Go to Printing Preferences, click the Paper tab, and set the paper type to Recycled.
Toner specks		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The paper may not meet specifications; for example, the paper may be too moist or rough. • The transfer roller may be dirty. Clean the inside of your machine. • The paper path may need cleaning. If these steps do not correct the problem, contact a service representative.
Dropouts		<p>If faded areas, generally rounded, occur randomly on the page:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A single sheet of paper may be defective. Try reprinting the job. • The moisture content of the paper is uneven or the paper has moist spots on its surface. Try a different brand of paper. • The paper lot is bad. The manufacturing processes can cause some areas to reject toner. Try a different kind or brand of paper. • Change the printer option and try again. Go to Printing Preferences, click the Paper, and set type to Thick. <p>If these steps do not correct the problem, contact a service representative.</p>

Condition	Example	Suggested solutions
White Spots		<p>If white spots appear on the page:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The paper is too rough and a lot of dirt from paper falls to the inner components within the machine, so the transfer roller may be dirty. Clean the inside of your machine. The paper path may need cleaning. Clean the inside of your machine. <p>If these steps do not correct the problem, contact a service representative.</p>
Vertical lines		<p>If black vertical streaks appear on the page:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The surface (drum part) of the cartridge inside the machine has probably been scratched. Remove the cartridge and install a new one. <p>If white vertical streaks appear on the page:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The surface of the LSU part inside the machine may be dirty. Clean the inside of your machine. If cleaning does not correct the problem, contact a service representative.
Black or color background		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Change to a lighter weight paper. Check the environmental conditions: very dry conditions or a high level of humidity (higher than 80% RH) can increase the amount of background shading. Remove the old toner cartridge and install a new one. Thoroughly redistribute the toner.
Toner smear		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Clean the inside of the machine. Check the paper type and quality. Remove the toner cartridge and install a new one.
Vertical repetitive defects		<p>If marks repeatedly appear on the printed side of the page at even intervals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The toner cartridge may be damaged. If you still have the same problem, remove the toner cartridge and, install a new one . Parts of the machine may have toner on them. If the defects occur on the back of the page, the problem will likely correct itself after a few more pages. The fusing assembly may be damaged. Contact a service representative.

Condition	Example	Suggested solutions
Background scatter		<p>Background scatter results from bits of toner randomly distributed on the printed page.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The paper may be too damp. Try printing with a different batch of paper. Do not open packages of paper until necessary so that the paper does not absorb too much moisture. If background scatter covers the entire surface area of a printed page, adjust the print resolution through your software application or in Printing Preferences. Ensure the correct paper type is selected. For example: If Thicker Paper is selected, but Plain Paper actually used, an overcharging can occur causing this copy quality problem. If you are using a new toner cartridge, redistribute the toner first.
Toner particles are around bold characters or pictures		<p>The toner might not adhere properly to this type of paper.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Change the printer option and try again. Go to Printing Preferences, click the Paper tab, and set the paper type to Recycled. Ensure the correct paper type is selected. For example: If Thicker Paper is selected, but Plain Paper actually used, an overcharging can occur causing this copy quality problem.
Misformed characters		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If characters are improperly formed and producing hollow images, the paper stock may be too slick. Try different paper.
Page skew		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure that the paper is loaded properly. Check the paper type and quality. Ensure that the guides are not too tight or too loose against the paper stack.
Curl or wave		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure that the paper is loaded properly. Check the paper type and quality. Both high temperature and humidity can cause paper curl. Turn the stack of paper over in the tray. Also try rotating the paper 180° in the tray.

Condition	Example	Suggested solutions
Wrinkles or creases		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure that the paper is loaded properly. • Check the paper type and quality. • Turn the stack of paper over in the tray. Also try rotating the paper 180° in the tray.
Back of printouts are dirty		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check for leaking toner. Clean the inside of the machine.
Solid color or black pages		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The toner cartridge may not be installed properly. Remove the cartridge and reinsert it. • The toner cartridge may be defective. Remove the toner cartridge and install a new one. • The machine may require repairing. Contact a service representative.
Loose toner		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clean the inside of the machine. • Check the paper type, thickness, and quality. • Remove the toner cartridge and install a new one. <p>If the problem persists, the machine may require repair. Contact a service representative.</p>
Character voids		<p>Character voids are white areas within parts of characters that should be solid black:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You may be printing on the wrong surface of the paper. Remove the paper and turn it around. • The paper may not meet paper specifications.

Condition	Example	Suggested solutions
<p>Horizontal stripes</p>		<p>If horizontally aligned black streaks or smears appear:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The toner cartridge may be installed improperly. Remove the cartridge and reinsert it. • The toner cartridge may be defective. Remove the toner cartridge and install a new one. Remove the toner cartridge and install a new one. <p>If the problem persists, the machine may require repairing. Contact a service representative.</p>
<p>Curl</p>		<p>If the printed paper is curled or paper does not feed into the machine:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Turn the stack of paper over in the tray. Also try rotating the paper 180° in the tray. • Change the printer's paper option and try again. Go to Printing Preferences, click the Paper tab, and set type to Thin.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An unknown image repetitively appears on a few sheets • Loose toner • Light print or contamination occurs 		<p>Your machine is probably being used at an altitude of 1,000 m (3,281 ft) or above. The high altitude may affect the print quality, such as loose toner or light imaging.</p>
<p>Vertical Streaks</p> <p>When using Century Star media, it may contaminate the OPC surface. This will cause light vertical streaks during printing.</p>		<p>Use the control panel to initiate OPC Cleaning mode.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. On the control panel, press Menu  > System Setup > Machine Setup > OPC Cleaning. 2. Select Automatic to initiate a cleaning every 1,000 pages. <p>NOTE: The OPC cleaning takes approximately 5 minutes to complete.</p>

Copying problems

The following table describes common copying problems and suggested solutions.

Condition	Suggested solutions
Copies are too light or too dark.	Adjust the darkness in copy feature to lighten or darken the backgrounds of copies.
Smears, lines, marks, or spots appear on copies.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• If the defects are on the original, adjust darkness in copy feature to lighten the background of your copies.• If there are no defects on the original, clean the scan unit.
Copy image is skewed.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ensure that the original is aligned with the registration guide.• The transfer roller may be dirty. Clean the inside of your machine.
Blank copies print out.	Ensure that the original is face down on the scanner glass or face up in the document feeder. If these steps do not correct the problem, contact a service representative.
Image rubs off the copy easily.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Replace the paper in the tray with paper from a new package.• In high humidity areas, do not leave paper in the machine for extended periods of time.
Frequent copy paper jams occur.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Fan the paper, then turn it over in the tray. Replace the paper in the tray with a fresh supply. Check/adjust the paper guides, if necessary.• Ensure that the paper is the proper type and weight.• Check for copy paper or pieces of copy paper remaining in the machine after a paper jam has been cleared.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Your originals may contain pictures, solids, or heavy lines. For example, your originals may be forms, newsletters, books, or other documents that use more toner.• The scanner lid may be left open while copies are being made.• Turn the machine off and back on.

Scanning problems

The following table describes common scanning problems and suggested solutions.

Condition	Suggested solutions
The scanner does not work.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make sure that you place the original to be scanned face down on the scanner glass, or face up in the document feeder.• There may not be enough available memory to hold the document you want to scan. Try the Prescan function to see if that works. Try lowering the scan resolution rate.• Check that the machine printer cable is connected properly.• Make sure that the machine printer cable is not defective. Switch the printer cable with a known good cable. If necessary, replace the printer cable.• Check that the scanner is configured correctly. Check scan setting in the application you want to use to make certain that the scanner job is being sent to the correct port (for example, USB001).
The unit scans very slowly.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Check if the machine is printing received data. If so, scan the document after the received data has been printed.• Graphics are scanned more slowly than text.
Message appears on your computer screen: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Device can't be set to the H/W mode you want.• Port is being used by another program.• Port is disabled.• Scanner is busy receiving or printing data. When the current job is completed, try again.• Invalid handle.• Scanning has failed.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• There may be a copying or printing job in progress. Try your job again when that job is finished.• The selected port is currently being used. Restart your computer and try again.• The machine printer cable may be improperly connected or the power may be off.• The scanner driver is not installed or the operating environment is not set up properly.• Ensure that the machine is properly connected and the power is on, then restart your computer.• The USB cable may be improperly connected or the power may be off.

Operating system problems

Condition	Suggested solutions
"File in Use" message appears during installation.	Exit all software applications. Remove all software from the startup group, then restart Windows. Reinstall the printer driver.
"General Protection Fault", "Exception OE", "Spool 32", or "Illegal Operation" messages appear.	Close all other applications, reboot Windows and try printing again.
"Fail To Print", "A printer timeout error occurred" message appear.	These messages may appear during printing. Just keep waiting until the machine finishes printing. If the message appears in ready mode or after printing has completed, check the connection and/or whether an error has occurred.
Machine information is not displayed when you click the device in the Devices and Printers.	Check the Printer properties . Click the Ports tab. (Control Panel > Devices and Printers > Right-click on your printer icon and select Printer properties) If the port is set to File or LPT, uncheck them and select TCP/IP, USB, or WSD.
