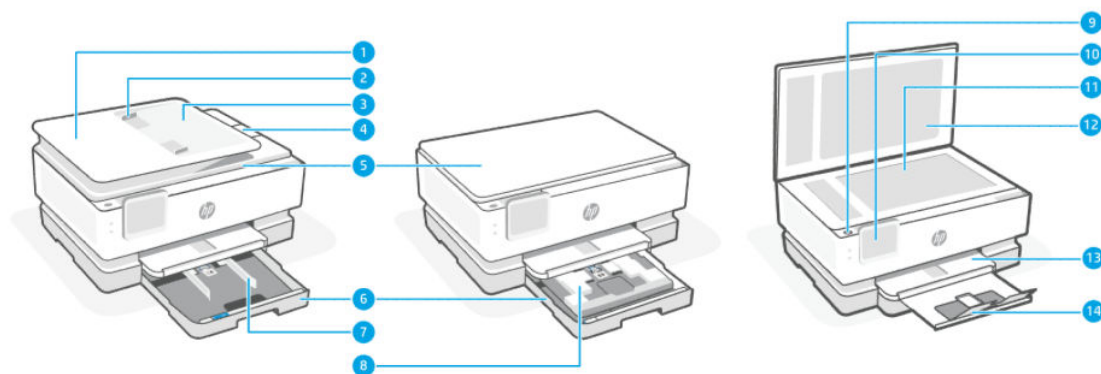

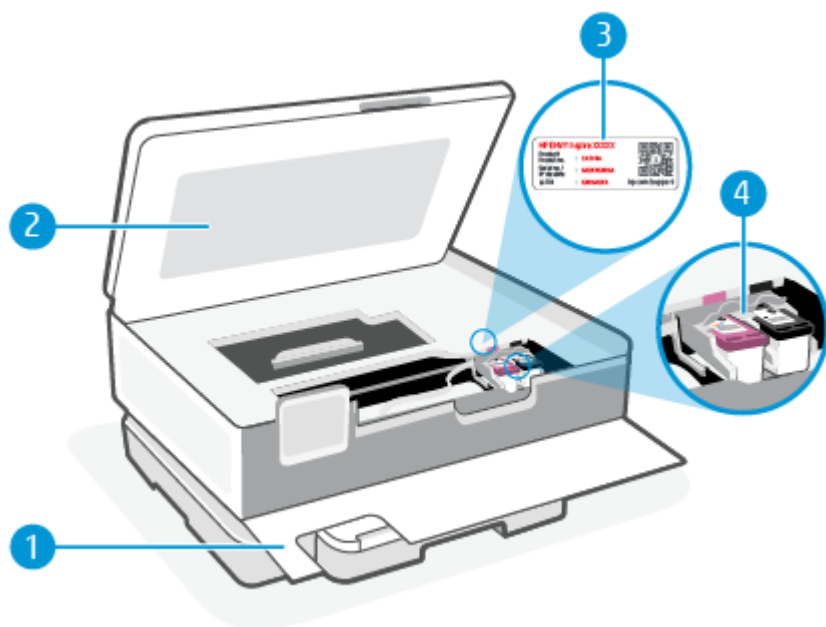

 **NOTE:** Cartridges should be kept in the printer to prevent possible print quality issues or printhead damage. Avoid removing supplies for extended periods of time. Do not turn the printer off when a cartridge is missing.

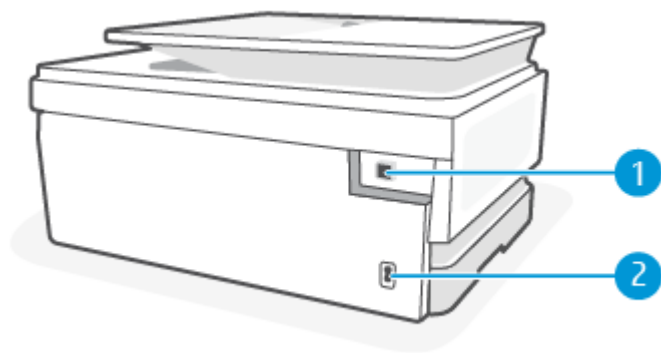

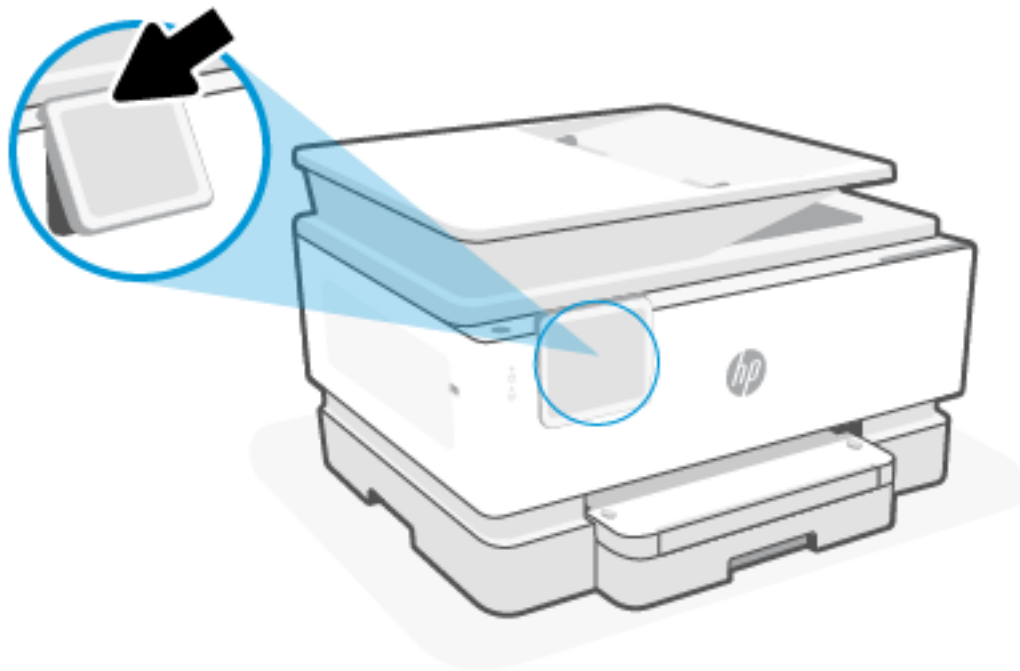

Control panel features

This topic describes the printer control panel features.

Tilt the control panel

Tilt the control panel for easier viewing. Push the upper part of the control panel to tilt it upwards and push the lower part to tilt it downwards.



Overview of buttons and lights

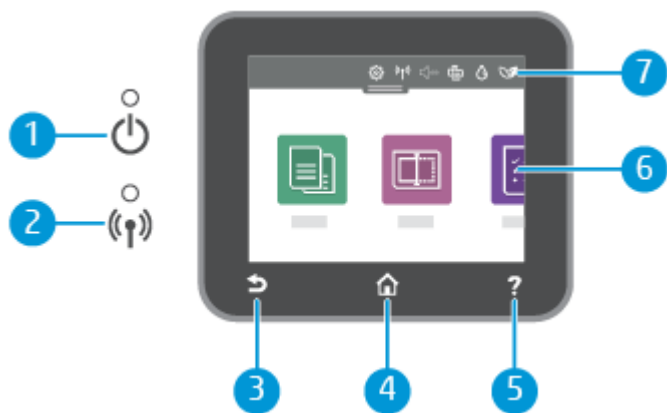


Table 1-4 Control panel overview

Feature	Description
1	Power light: Indicates whether the printer is turned on.
2	Wireless light: Indicates the status of the printer's wireless connection. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Solid blue light indicates that wireless connection has been established and you can print.• Slow blinking light with clear pause indicates that wireless is on, but not configured. To connect your printer, see Connect your printer.• Slow blinking light indicates that wireless is on, but the printer is not connected to a network. Make sure your printer is within the range of wireless signal.• Fast blinking light indicates wireless error. Refer to the message on the printer display.• If the wireless light is off, wireless is turned off.
3	Back button: Returns to the previous menu.
4	Home button: Returns to the home screen from any other screen.
5	Help button: Opens the Help menu when on the Home screen, or shows contextual help content if it is available for the current operation when on other screens.
6	Function buttons: Touch to perform common tasks. For more information, see Function buttons .
7	Dashboard: Swipe down for additional printer management options. For more information, see Dashboard icons .

Function buttons

Feature	Description
Copy 	Copy document, ID card, or photo.
Scan 	Scan document.

Dashboard icons

The Dashboard on the printer control panel lets you access the icons on the display, check the status of the printer, or monitor and manage current and scheduled printer tasks.








To open the Dashboard, touch or swipe down the tab  at the top of a screen on the control panel.



Table 1-6 Dashboard icons

Feature	Description
Setup 	Setup displays the setup screen for changing preferences, network setup, Wi-Fi Direct, and other maintenance settings and generating reports.
Wireless 	Wireless displays wireless status and menu options. For more information, see Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using the printer control panel .
Quiet mode (if supported) 	Quiet Mode slows down printing to reduce overall noise without affecting print quality. Quiet Mode only works when printing on plain paper. To reduce printing noise, turn on Quiet Mode. To print at normal speed, turn Quiet Mode off. Quiet Mode is off by default.
Wi-Fi Direct 	Wi-Fi Direct displays the status, name, and password for Wi-Fi Direct, and the number of devices connected. You can also change settings and print a guide.
Ink Status 	Ink Status displays the estimated ink levels. NOTE: Ink level alerts and indicators provide estimates for planning purposes only. When you receive a low-ink alert, consider having a replacement cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not have to replace the cartridges until prompted to do so.
HP EcoSolutions 	HP EcoSolutions displays a screen where you can configure some of the printer's environmental features.

Change printer settings

Use the control panel to change the printer functions and settings, print reports, or get help for the printer.




TIP: You can also change the printer settings using the printer software. For more information, see [Print](#).

To change settings for a function

The **Home** screen of the control panel display shows the available functions for the printer. Some features of the functions allows you to change settings.


1. Select **Copy** or **Scan** and then select the desired option.



2. After selecting a function, touch **Settings** , scroll through the available settings, and then touch the setting you want to change.
3. Follow the prompts on the control panel display to change the settings.

 **TIP:** Touch the **Home**  to return to the **Home** screen.

To change the printer settings

To change the printer settings or print reports, use the options available on the **Setup** menu.

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
2. Touch and scroll through the screens.
3. Touch the screen items to select screens or options.


 **TIP:** Touch **Home**  to return to the **Home** screen.

Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage

The HP Smart app can help you perform many different printer tasks, including the following:

- Set up and connect your printer.
- Print and scan documents and photos.
- Share documents through email and other applications.
- Manage printer settings, check printer status, print reports, and order supplies.

HP Smart is supported on mobile devices and computers running on iOS, Android, Windows 10, and macOS 10.13 and later.

 **NOTE:** At this time, the HP Smart app might not be available in all languages. Some features are available only on specific printers or models. HP Smart does not support all file formats. For more information, see [Get more information about HP Smart](#).

To install HP Smart and open the app

Complete the following steps to install and open HP Smart, connect your printer, and begin using the app.

1. Visit 123.hp.com to download and install HP Smart on your device.

 **NOTE:**

- **iOS, Android, Windows 10, and macOS devices:** You can also download HP Smart from the respective app stores for the device.
 - **Windows 7:** You can download the HP printer software from 123.hp.com, install the software, and connect the printer wirelessly using the software. (Windows 7 Service Pack 1 (SP1) is required to install HP printer software.)

2. Open HP Smart after installation.
 - **iOS/Android:** From the mobile device desktop or app menu, tap HP Smart.
 - **Windows 10:** From the computer desktop, click **Start**, and then select **HP Smart** from the app list.
 - **macOS:** From the Launchpad, select HP Smart.

Turn the printer off

Press the Power button  to turn off the printer. Wait until the power light turns off before unplugging the power cord or turning off a power strip.

 **CAUTION:** If you incorrectly turn the printer off, the print carriage might not return to the correct position, causing problems with the cartridges and print quality issues.

2 Connect your printer

This section describes different ways to connect your printer.

Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using HP Smart

This topic describes how to connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using HP Smart.

Install the HP Smart app on your computer or mobile device and use the app to set up or connect the printer to your Wi-Fi network.

For information about HP Smart including where to download the app, see [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).

1. Make sure your computer or mobile device is connected to your Wi-Fi network. On your mobile device, turn on Bluetooth and location services.



NOTE: HP Smart uses Bluetooth for printer setup, and it does not support Print using Bluetooth.

2. If your printer Wi-Fi was previously turned off, make sure to turn it on. For more information about wireless status, see [Turn on or off the wireless capability of the printer](#).
3. If the printer is no longer in wireless setup mode, restore the printer network settings. For more information, see [To restore the printer to the original network settings](#).



NOTE: The wireless light will blink when the printer is in wireless setup mode.

4. Open the HP Smart app on your computer or mobile device. For more information, see [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
5. From HP Smart, click or touch the Plus icon **+** or **Add Printer**, and then choose the option to select or add a printer. If prompted, allow Bluetooth and location permissions.

Follow the instructions to add the printer to your network.

6. When prompted, create an HP account and register the printer.



NOTE: When the printer is connected successfully, the Wireless light stops blinking and remains lit (for all Wireless models). For more information, see [Printer views](#).

Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using the printer control panel

This topic describes how to connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using the printer control panel.

Before you begin

Ensure the following before you begin setting up the printer for wireless communication:

- The wireless network is set up and working properly.

- The printer and the computers that use the printer are on the same network (subnet).



NOTE: While connecting the printer, you might be prompted to enter the wireless network name (SSID) and a wireless password.

- The wireless network name is the name of your wireless network.
- The wireless password prevents other people from connecting to your wireless network without your permission. Depending on the level of security required, your wireless network might use either a WPA passphrase or WEP key.

If you have not changed the network name or the security passkey since setting up your wireless network, you can sometimes find them on the back or side of the wireless router.



If you cannot find the network name or the security password or cannot remember this information, see the documentation provided with your computer or with the wireless router. If you still cannot find this information, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the wireless network.

To connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using the printer control panel

Use the Wireless Setup Wizard or Wi-Fi Protected Setup from the printer control panel display to set up wireless communication.




NOTE: Before you proceed, go through the list at [Before you begin](#).

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Wireless** .
2. Touch **Settings** .
3. Touch **Wireless Settings**.
4. Touch **Wireless Setup Wizard** or **Wi-Fi Protected Setup**.
5. Follow the display instructions to complete the setup.

If you are already using the printer with a different type of connection, such as a USB connection, follow the instructions in [Change the connection type](#) to set up the printer on your wireless network.

To connect your printer using a USB cable

1. Connect the printer and computer using a USB cable.
2. Open the HP Smart app on your computer. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
3. From HP Smart, click or tap  (the Plus icon) or **Add Printer**, and then choose the option to select or add a printer.



Follow the instructions to add the printer.
4. When prompted, create an HP account and register the printer.

Change wireless settings

You can set up and manage the wireless connection for your printer. This includes printing information about network settings, turning the wireless function on or off, and restoring wireless settings.



Wireless status of the printer

Print the wireless test report for information about the printer wireless connection. The wireless test report provides information about the printer status, hardware (MAC) address, and IP address. If there is a problem with the wireless connection or if a wireless connection attempt failed, the wireless test report also provides diagnostic information. If the printer is connected to a network, the test report displays details about the network settings.

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, touch **Wireless** , and then touch **Settings** .
2. Touch **Print Details** or **Print Network Configuration**.

Turn on or off the wireless capability of the printer


The blue Wireless light on the printer control panel is lit when the wireless capability of the printer is on.

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, touch **Wireless** , and then touch **Settings** .
2. Touch **Wireless Settings**.
3. Touch the toggle button next to **Wireless** to switch it on or off.



NOTE: If the printer has never been configured to connect to a wireless network before, turning on the wireless capability will automatically start the Wireless Setup Wizard.

To restore the printer to the original network settings

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
2. Touch **Network Setup**.
3. Touch **Restore Network Settings**.

A message appears stating that the network defaults will be restored.

4. Touch **Yes**.
5. Print the network configuration page and verify that the network settings have been reset.



NOTE: In order to get the list of detected wireless networks in the area, the wireless radio on the printer should be turned on. If it is off, the list is not displayed.

USB to a wireless connection

Windows 10/macOS

1. Unplug the USB cable from the printer.
2. Make sure your computer or mobile device is connected to your Wi-Fi network. On your mobile device, turn on Bluetooth and location services.
3. If your printer Wi-Fi was previously turned off, make sure to turn it on. For more information about wireless status, see [Turn on or off the wireless capability of the printer](#).
4. If the printer is no longer in wireless setup mode, restore the printer network settings. For more information, see [To restore the printer to the original network settings](#).
5. Open the HP Smart app on your computer or mobile device. For more information, see [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
6. When prompted, create an HP account and register the printer.
7. Follow the on-screen instructions to connect the printer to your Wi-Fi network.

Wireless to a USB connection

Windows/macOS

1. Connect the printer and computer using a USB cable.

3 Load media and paper basics

This section describes how to change paper settings and to load different media into the printer.

Load paper

This topic describes how to load paper, envelope, cards and photos.

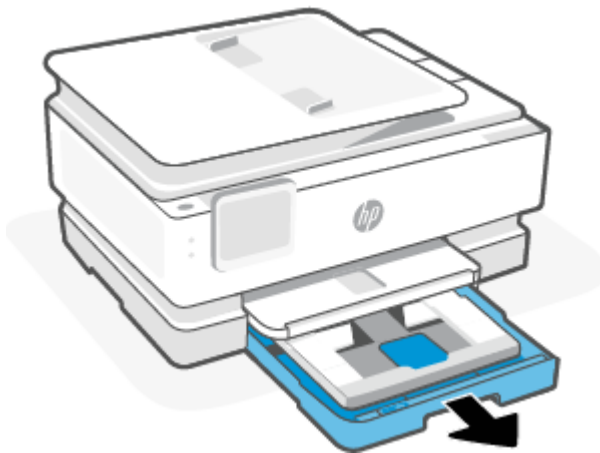


NOTE:

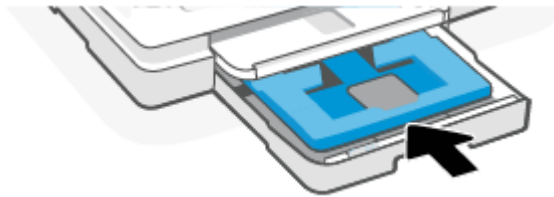
- Do not load paper while the printer is printing.
- If there is other paper in the printer tray, remove the paper before loading a different paper type or size.

To load standard paper

1. Open the main tray.



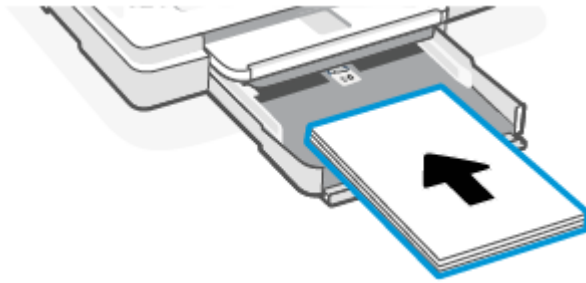
2. Push in the photo tray.



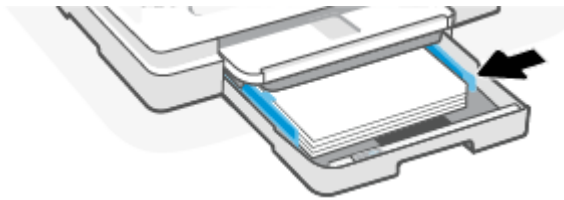
3. Slide the paper-width guides to the edges of the main tray.



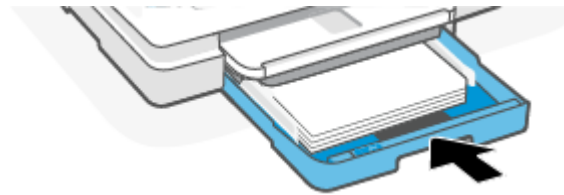
4. Insert the paper in portrait orientation with the side to be printed facing down. Make sure the stack of paper is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the front of the tray.



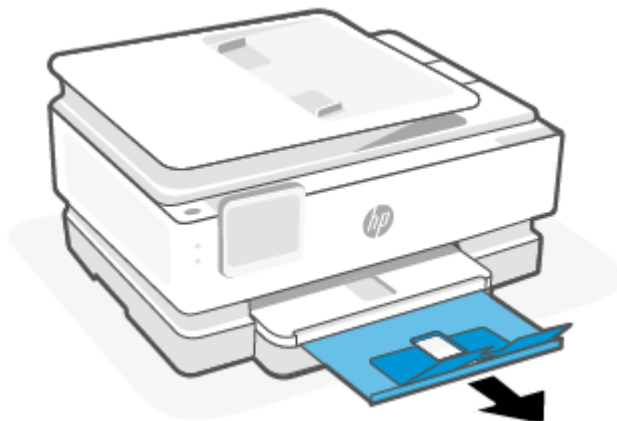
5. Adjust the paper-width guides until they touch the left and right edges of the stack of paper.



6. Close the main tray.

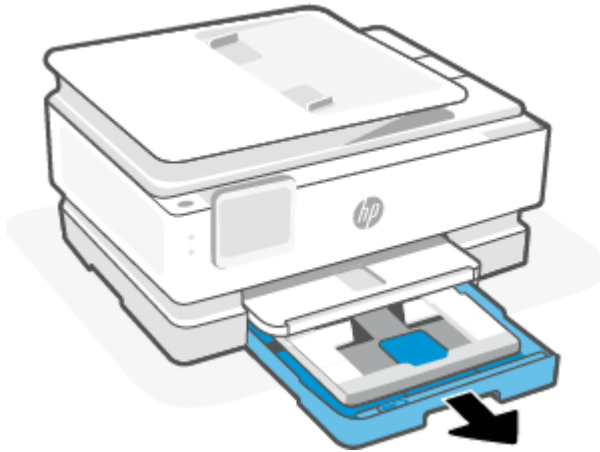


7. Change or retain the paper settings on the printer display.
8. Pull out the output tray extension.



To load legal paper (some models only)

1. Open the main tray.



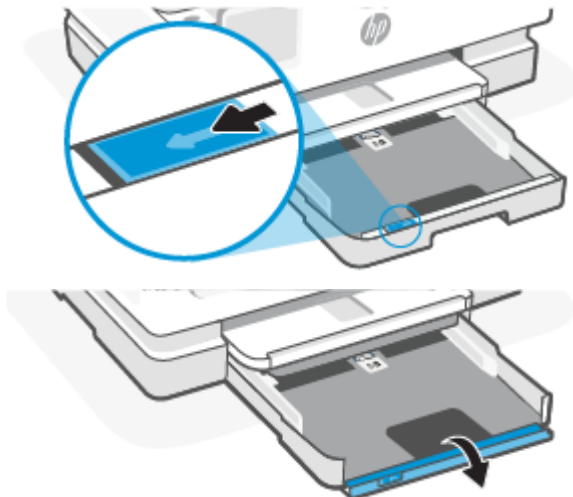
2. Push in the photo tray.



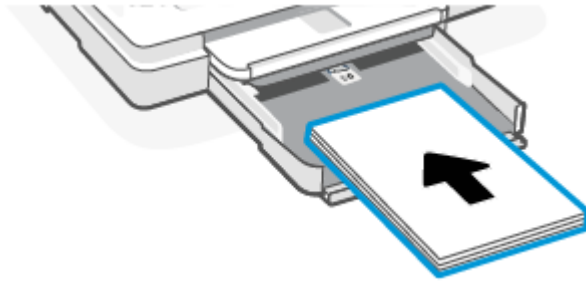
3. Slide the paper-width guides to the edges of the main tray.



4. Unlock and then open the front side of the paper tray.

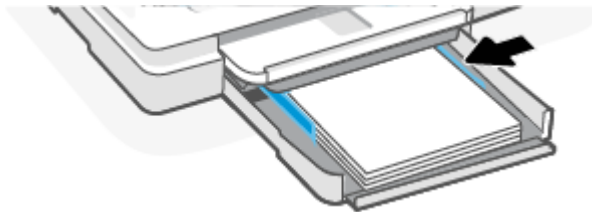


5. Insert the paper in portrait orientation with the side to be printed facing down.

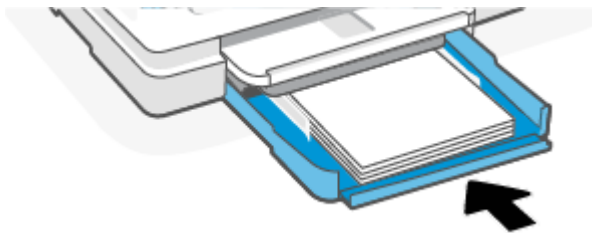


Make sure the stack of paper is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the front of the tray.

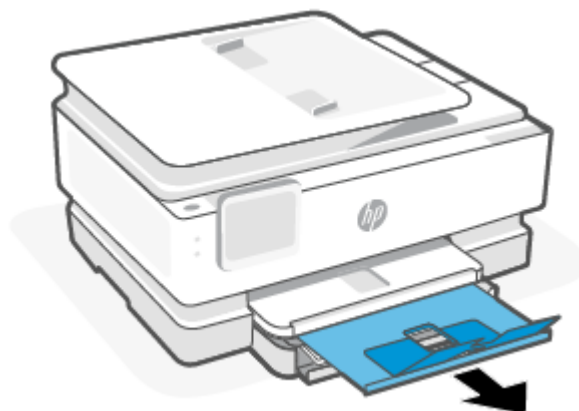
6. Adjust the paper-width guides until they touch the left and right edges of the stack of paper.



7. Close the main tray.

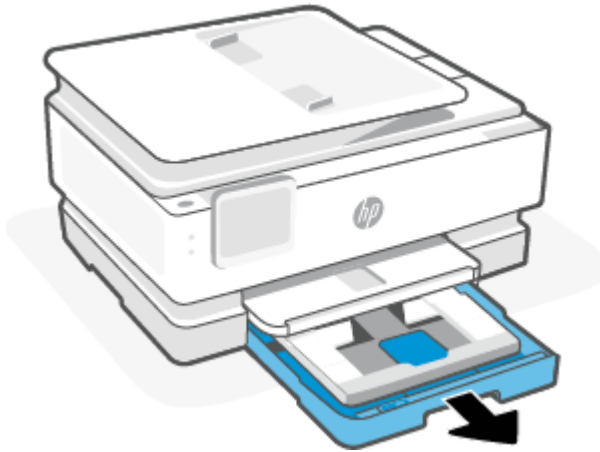


8. Change or retain the paper settings on the printer display.
9. Pull out the output tray extension.



To load an envelope

1. Open the main tray.



2. Push in the photo tray.



3. Slide the paper-width guides to the edges of the main tray.

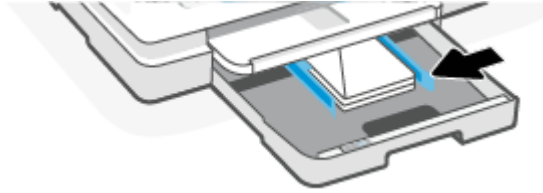


4. Insert the envelope in portrait orientation and with the side to be printed facing down.

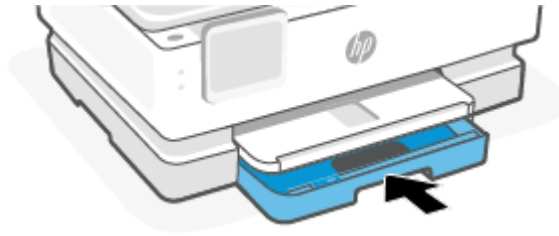

5. Adjust the paper-width guides until they touch the left and right edges of the stack of envelope.

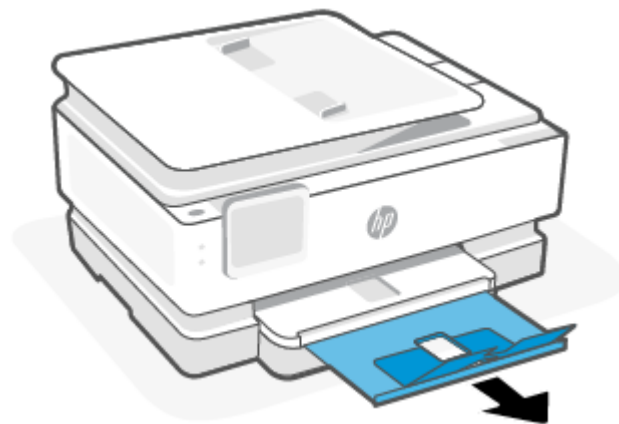


6. Close the main tray.



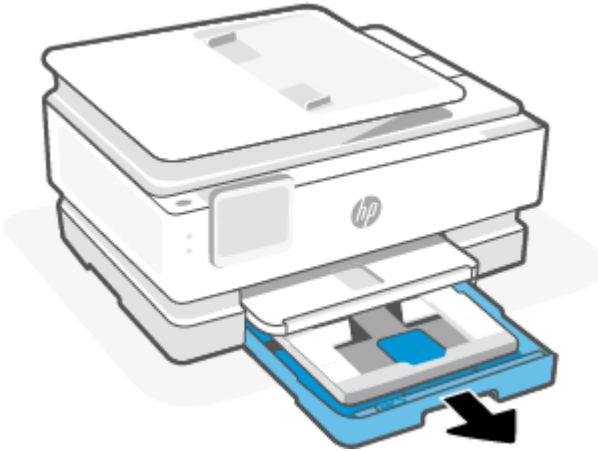
7. Change or retain the paper settings on the printer display.

To load cards and photo paper

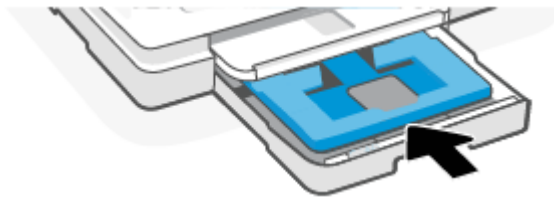
1. Open the main tray.



NOTE:

- Remove the paper before loading a different paper type or size.
- For printing on panoramic photo paper (4 x 12 inches), load photo paper in the main tray.

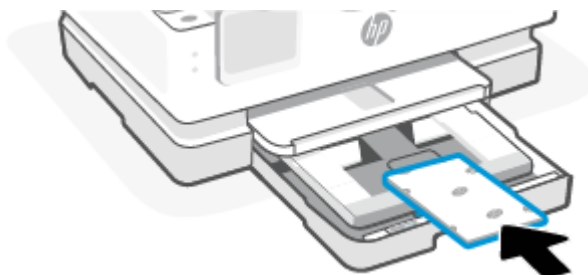
2. Pull out the photo tray, if necessary.



3. Slide the paper-width guides to the edges of the photo tray.



4. Insert the cards or photo paper in portrait orientation and with the side to be printed facing down.

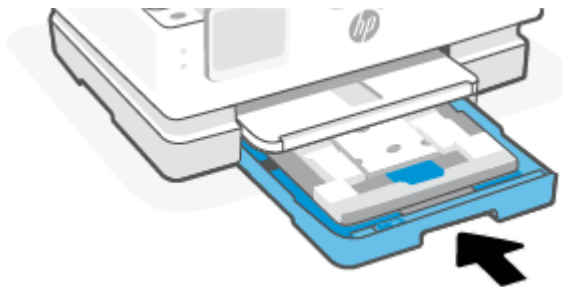


Make sure the stack of card or photo is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the front of the tray.

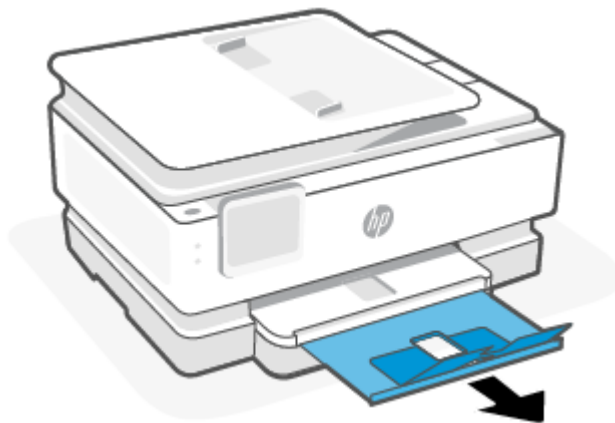
5. Adjust the paper-width guides until they touch the left and right edges of the stack of paper.



6. Close the main tray.



7. Change or retain the paper settings on the printer display.
8. Pull out the output tray extension.



Load an original on the scanner glass

This topic describes how to load an original into the printer.



NOTE:

- The scanner might not work correctly if the scanner glass and lid backing are not clean. For more information, see [Maintain the printer](#).


- Remove all originals from the document feeder tray (some models only) before lifting the lid on the printer.

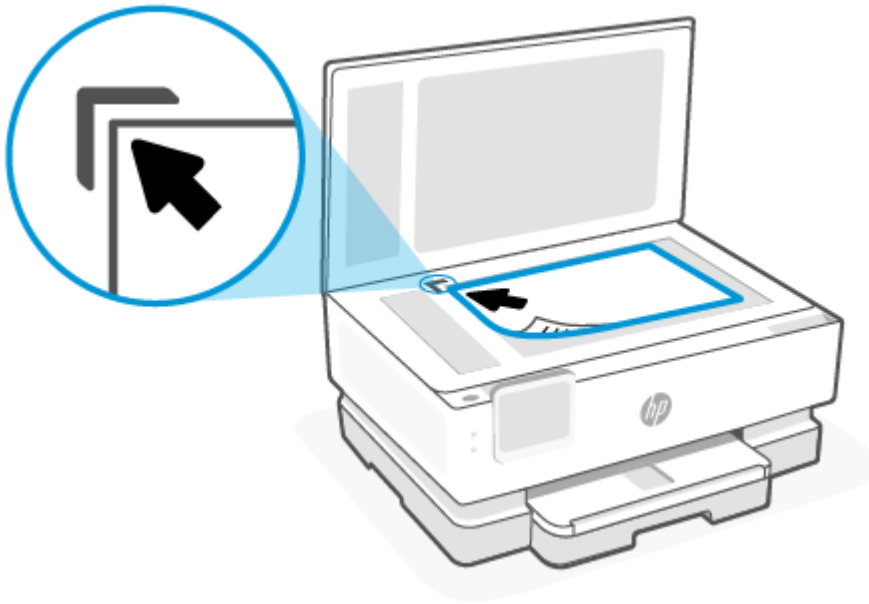
To load an original on the scanner glass

1. Lift the scanner lid.



2. Load your original print-side down and align it with the marking on the rear left corner of the glass.

 **TIP:** For more help on loading an original, refer to the engraved guides along the edge of the scanner glass.



3. Close the lid.

Load an original in the document feeder (some models only)

You can copy or scan a document by placing it in the document feeder.

CAUTION: Do not load photos in the document feeder, this might cause damage to your photos. Use only paper that is supported by the document feeder.

NOTE: Some features, such as the **Fit to Page** copy feature, do not work when you load your originals in the document feeder. For those features to work, load your originals on the scanner glass.

To load an original in the document feeder

1. Load your original print-side up into the document feeder.
 - a. If you are loading an original printed in portrait orientation, place the pages so that the top edge of the document goes in first. If you are loading an original printed in landscape orientation, place the pages so that the left edge of the document goes in first.
 - b. Slide the paper into the document feeder until you hear a tone or see a message on the printer control panel display indicating that the loaded pages were detected.

TIP: For more help on loading originals in the document feeder, refer to the diagram on the document feeder tray.



2. Slide the paper-width guides inward until they stop at the left and right edges of the paper.

Paper basics

The printer is designed to work well with most types of office paper. It is best to test a variety of print paper types before buying large quantities.

Use HP paper for optimum print quality. Visit the HP website at www.hp.com for more information about HP paper.



HP recommends plain papers with the ColorLok logo for printing everyday documents. All papers with the ColorLok logo are independently tested to meet high standards of reliability and print quality, and produce documents with crisp, vivid color, bolder blacks, and that dry faster than ordinary plain papers. Look for papers with the ColorLok logo in a variety of weights and sizes from major paper manufacturers.

Tips for selecting and using paper

For the best results, observe the following guidelines.

- Load only one type and one size of paper at a time into a tray or document feeder.
- Make sure the paper is loaded correctly when loading from the main tray or document feeder.
- Do not overload the tray or document feeder.
- To prevent jams, poor print quality, and other printing problems, avoid loading the following paper in the tray or document feeder:
 - Multipart forms
 - Media that is damaged, curled, or wrinkled
 - Media with cutouts or perforations
 - Media that is heavily textured, embossed, or does not accept ink well
 - Media that is too lightweight or stretches easily
 - Media that contains staples or clips

4 Configure your printer

This section describes how to configure your printer.

Use Web Services

The printer offers innovative, cloud-based solutions, such as print anywhere, scan-and-save to cloud, and other services (including supplies auto replenishment).

NOTE: To use these cloud-based solutions, the printer must be connected to the Internet. Unless otherwise agreed, HP can modify or cancel these cloud-based solution offerings at its discretion.

Set up Web Services

Before you set up Web Services, make sure your printer is connected to the Internet using a wireless connection.

To set up Web Services

1. Before you set up Web Services, make sure your printer is connected to the Internet.
2. Open the printer home page (the embedded web server or EWS). For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
3. Click the **HP Web Services** tab.
4. In **Web Services Settings**, click **Enable**, and follow the on-screen instructions to accept the terms of use.
5. If prompted, choose to allow the printer to check for and install printer updates.



NOTE:

- If prompted for a password, enter the PIN from the label on your printer. For more information, see [Things to note when accessing EWS](#).
 - If prompted for proxy settings and if your network uses proxy settings, follow the on-screen instructions to set up a proxy server. If you do not have the details, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the network.
 - If a printer update is available, the printer downloads and installs the update and then restarts automatically. Repeat the instructions above to set up **HP Web Services**.
-
6. After the printer is connected to the HP server, the printer prints an information sheet. Follow the instructions on the information sheet to finish setting up Web Services.

Remove Web Services

1. Open the printer home page (the embedded web server or EWS). See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **HP Web Services** tab.

3. In **Web Services Settings**, click **Disable Web Services**.

Update the printer

HP periodically releases firmware updates to enhance product functionality and fix issues. By default, if the printer is connected to the Internet, the printer automatically checks for updates at regular intervals. You can change the default setting for automatic updates or manually check for updates immediately.


Dynamic security enabled printers

This printer is intended to work only with cartridges that have new or reused HP electronic circuitry. Reused HP electronic circuitry enables the use of reused, remanufactured, and refilled cartridges.

The printer uses dynamic security measures to block cartridges using modified or non-HP circuitry. Periodic firmware updates delivered over the internet will maintain the effectiveness of the dynamic security measures and block cartridges that previously worked.

Updates can improve, enhance, or extend the printer's functionality and features, protect against security threats, and serve other purposes, but these updates can also block cartridges using modified or non-HP electronic circuitry from working in the printer, including cartridges that work today. Unless you are enrolled in certain HP programs such as Instant Ink or use other services that require automatic online firmware updates, most HP printers can be configured to receive updates either automatically or with a notification that allows you to choose whether to update or not. To update the printer using the printer control panel

1. From the top of the screen, touch or swipe down the tab to open the Dashboard, touch **Setup** .
2. Touch **Printer Maintenance**.
3. Touch **Update the Printer**.
4. Touch **Check for Printer Updates Now**.

To enable the printer to automatically check for updates



NOTE: The default setting of **Auto Update** is **On**.

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
2. Touch **Printer Maintenance**.
3. Touch **Update the Printer**.
4. Touch **Printer Update Options**.
5. Select **Install Automatically (Recommended)**, **Alert When Available** or **Do Not Check**.

To update the printer using the embedded web server (EWS)

1. Open the EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Tools** tab.

3. In the **Printer Updates** section, click **Firmware Updates**, and then follow the onscreen instructions.

**NOTE:**

- If prompted for a password, enter the PIN from the label on your printer. The PIN label can be found inside the cartridge access area.
- If prompted for proxy settings and if your network uses proxy settings, follow the onscreen instructions to set up a proxy server. If you do not have the details, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the network.
- If a printer update is available, the printer downloads and installs the update, and then restarts.

Configure the printer using EWS

Use EWS to manage printing functions from your computer.

- View printer status information
- Check the information and status of the printing supplies
- Receive notification of printer and supplies events
- View and change the network and the printer settings

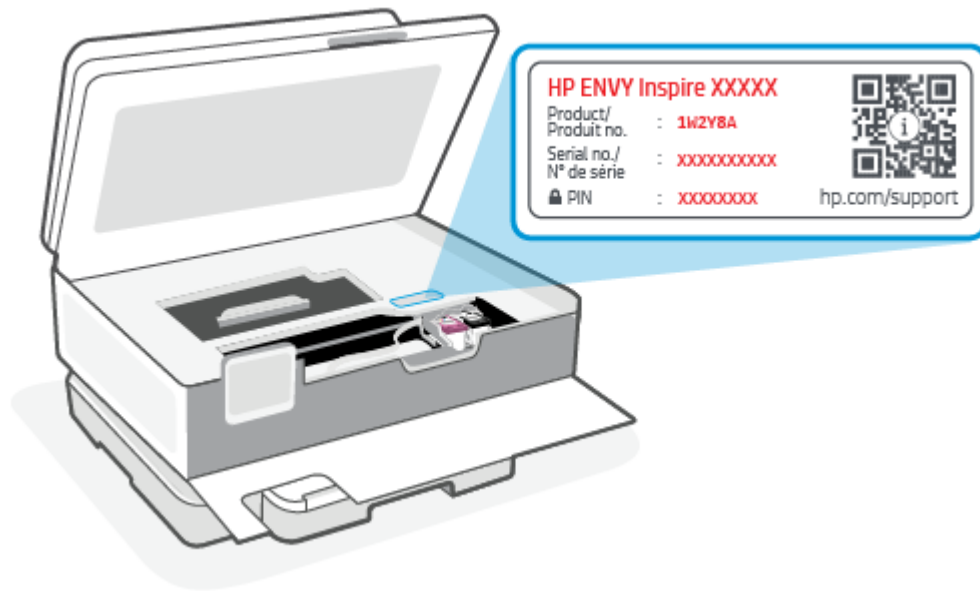
To access and use EWS

You can open EWS using one of the following:

- HP Smart app
- HP printer software
- Web browser using IP address
- Web browser using Wi-Fi Direct connection

Things to note when accessing EWS

- If the web browser displays a message indicating that the website is unsafe, select the option to continue. Accessing the website will not harm your device.
- If prompted, enter the password of the printer.
 - **Password:** Open the cartridge access door, see the label inside the printer.



- Depending on how the printer is connected, some features in EWS might not be available.
- EWS is not accessible beyond the network firewall.

To open EWS using HP Smart (iOS, Android, and Windows 10)

1. Open the HP Smart app on your computer or mobile device. For more information, see [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
2. From HP Smart, select your printer, and then click or tap **Advanced Settings**.

To open EWS using an IP address (Wi-Fi connection)

1. Find out the IP address of the printer. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, touch **Wireless** (📶), and then touch **Settings** (⚙️).
2. Open a web browser, type the IP address or hostname in the address bar, and then click or tap **Enter**.

To open EWS using an IP address (Wi-Fi Direct connection)

1. Make sure your device and the printer are connected using Wi-Fi Direct. For more information, see [Print without connecting to same Wi-Fi network \(Wi-Fi Direct\)](#).
2. Open a web browser, type the following IP address or hostname of the printer in the address bar, and then click or tap **Enter**.

To open EWS using HP Printer software (Windows 7)

1. From the computer desktop, click **Start**, select **All Programs**, click **HP**, click the folder for the printer, select the icon with the printer's name, and then open **HP Printer Assistant**.
2. In the **HP Printer Assistant**, select **Print** tab.

3. Select **Printer Home Page (EWS)**.

Configure IP network settings

View or change network settings

Use EWS to view or change IP configuration settings.

1. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Networking** tab to obtain network information. Change settings as needed.

Rename the printer on a network

To rename the printer on a network so that it can be uniquely identified, use the Embedded Web Server.

1. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Open the **System** tab.
3. On the **Device Information** page, the default printer name is in the **Device Description** field. You can change this name to uniquely identify this printer.



NOTE: Completing the other fields on this page is optional.

4. Click the **Apply** button to save the changes.

Manually configure IPv4 TCP/IP parameters

Use EWS to manually set an IPv4 address, subnet mask, and default gateway.

1. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. On the **Networking** tab, click **IPv4 Configuration** in the left navigation pane.
3. From the **IP Preferred Address Method** drop-down, select **Manual**, and then edit the IPv4 configuration settings.
4. Click the **Apply** button.

Assign or change the system password using EWS

Assign an administrator password for access to the printer and EWS so that unauthorized users cannot change the printer settings.

1. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. On the **System** tab, click the **Administration** link in the left navigation pane.
3. In the area labeled **Product Security**, enter the password in the **Password** field.
4. Re-enter the password in the **Confirm Password** field.
5. Click the **Apply** button.



NOTE: Make note of the password and store it in a safe place.

Change energy-conservation settings

The printer includes several economy features to conserve energy and supplies.

Set the Sleep/Auto Off After Inactivity setting

Use EWS to set the amount of idle time before the printer enters sleep mode.

Complete the following procedure to change the Sleep/Auto Off After Inactivity setting:

1. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **System** tab, and then select **Energy Settings**.
3. From the **Sleep/Auto Off After Inactivity** drop-down, select the time for the delay.
4. Click the **Apply** button.

Set the Shut Down After Inactivity delay and configure the printer to use 1 watt or less of power

Use EWS to set the amount of time before the printer shuts down.



NOTE: After the printer shuts down, the power consumption is 1 watt or less.

Complete the following procedure to change the Shut Down After Inactivity setting:

1. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **System** tab, and then select **Energy Settings**.
3. From the **Shut Down After Inactivity** drop-down, select the time for the delay.



NOTE: The default value is **4 hours**.

4. Click the **Apply** button.

Set the Delay Shut Down setting

Use the EWS to select whether or not the printer delays shutting down after the Power button  is pressed.

Complete the following procedure to change the Delay Shut Down setting:

1. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **System** tab, and then select **Energy Settings**.
3. Select or clear the **Delay when ports are active** option.



NOTE: When this option is selected the printer will not shut down unless all ports are inactive. An active network link will prevent the printer from shutting down.

5 Print

This printer is designed to work with the HP Smart app, a software application that makes it easy to print, scan, and manage your printer from a smartphone, laptop, desktop computer, or other devices. You can print and manage the printer from all of your devices by installing the app on each device. The HP Smart app is compatible with iOS, Android, Windows 10, and Mac.

Read this section to learn more about printing with the HP Smart app as well as printing from within other software applications using the HP printer driver installed at setup. You will also find basic instructions for printing with Apple AirPrint on a Mac and printing from mobile devices using the print commands provided in the device software.

Be sure to check out the tips for successful printing to ensure you get the best results every time you print.

Print from a Windows computer

1. Make sure you have installed the HP Smart app. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
2. Open the document you wish to print.
3. From the **File** menu in your software program, select the **Print** option.
4. Click the button that opens the **Properties** dialog box.

Depending on your software application, this button might be called **Properties**, **Options**, **Setup**, or **Preferences**.
5. Make sure your printer is selected.
6. Change any print settings, and Click **OK**.
7. Click **Print** or the **OK** button to print the job.

Print from a Mac computer

1. Make sure you have installed the HP Smart app. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
2. From the computer, open **System Preference**, and select **Printers and Scanners**.
3. Click the Add button/icon +, select the printer from the printer list, and then click **Add**.
4. Once connected, open the document you wish to print and use the **Print** command.
5. Make sure the desired printer is selected.
6. Change any print settings.
7. Click **Print** to print the document.

Print with mobile devices

This topic describes how to print from mobile devices.

You can use the HP Smart app to print documents and photos from your mobile device, social media account, or cloud storage. For more information, see [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).

You can also print directly from your mobile devices using AirPrint (iOS) or HP Print Service Plugin (Android):

- **iOS:** Devices running iOS 4.2 or later have AirPrint pre-installed.
- **Android:** Download the HP Print Service Plugin from the Google Play Store or your favorite app store, and then enable it on your device.



NOTE: You can print using HP Smart or AirPrint/HP Print Service Plugin when the mobile device is on the same network as the printer or a different network (using Wi-Fi Direct).

Print while connected to same Wi-Fi network

You can print documents and photos from your mobile device when the device is on the same Wi-Fi network as the printer.

NOTE: Make sure your mobile device and printer are connected to the same Wi-Fi network. For more information, see [Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using HP Smart](#).


Print without connecting to same Wi-Fi network (Wi-Fi Direct)

With Wi-Fi Direct, you can directly connect your computer or mobile device to the printer and print wirelessly—without connecting your computer or mobile device to an existing wireless network.

NOTE:

- Make sure Wi-Fi Direct on your printer is turned on. If Wi-Fi Direct is turned on, then **Wi-Fi Direct**  appears on the Dashboard control panel display.
- Up to 5 computers and mobile devices can connect to the printer using Wi-Fi Direct connection.




To turn Wi-Fi Direct on or off from the control panel:

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Wi-Fi Direct** .
2. Touch **Settings** .
3. If the display shows that Wi-Fi Direct is **Off**, touch **Wi-Fi Direct**  and then switch it on.



TIP: You can also turn on Wi-Fi Direct from the EWS. For more information about using the EWS, see [To access and use EWS](#).

To turn on Wi-Fi Direct

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Wi-Fi Direct** .
2. Touch **Settings** .
3. If the display shows that Wi-Fi Direct is **Off**, touch **Wi-Fi Direct**  and then switch it on.



TIP: You can also turn on Wi-Fi Direct from the EWS. For more information about using the EWS, see [To access and use EWS](#).

Tips for successful printing

To print successfully, the HP cartridges should be functioning properly with sufficient ink, the paper should be loaded correctly, and the printer should have the appropriate settings.

You can check the printer settings from HP Smart, EWS, and your software applications.

Ink tips

Following are the ink tips for successful printing:

- If the print quality is not acceptable, see [Printing issues](#) for more information.
- Use Original HP cartridges.

Original HP cartridges are designed and tested with HP printers and papers to help you easily produce great results, time after time.



NOTE: HP cannot guarantee the quality or reliability of non-Original HP supplies. Product service or repairs required as a result of using a non-Original HP supply will not be covered under warranty.

If you believe you purchased Original HP cartridges, go to hp.com/go/anticounterfeit.

- Install both the black and color cartridges correctly.
- Check the estimated ink levels in the cartridges to make sure there is sufficient ink.

For more information, see [Check the estimated ink levels](#).



NOTE: Ink level warnings and indicators provide estimates for planning purposes only. When an indicator shows low ink levels, consider having a replacement cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not need to replace cartridges until you are prompted to.

- Always turn off the printer with the Power button  to allow the printer to protect the nozzles.

Paper loading tips

For more information, also see [Load paper](#).

- Ensure the paper is loaded in the main tray properly, and set the correct media size and media type. Upon loading paper in main tray, you will be prompted to set the media size and media type from the control panel.
- Load a stack of paper (not just one page). All the paper in the stack should be of the same size and type to avoid a paper jam.
- Load paper with the print-side down.
- Ensure that paper loaded in the main tray lays flat and the edges are not bent or torn.
- Adjust the paper-width guides in the main tray to fit snugly against all paper. Make sure the guides do not bend the paper in the tray.

Printer settings tips (Windows)

- To change default print settings, open the HP printer software, click **Print, Scan & Fax**, and then click **Set Preferences**. For information how to open the printer software, see [To install HP Smart and open the app](#).
- To understand paper and paper tray settings:
 - **Paper Size:** Select the paper size you loaded in the main tray.
 - **Media:** Select the paper type you are using.
- To understand color or black and white settings:
 - **Color:** Uses ink from all cartridges for full color prints.
 - **Black & White** or **Black Ink Only:** Uses the black ink only for normal or lower quality black and white prints.
 - **High Quality Grayscale:** Uses ink from both the color and black cartridges to produce a wider range of black and grey tones for high quality black and white prints.
- To understand print quality settings:
 - **Draft:** Lowest dpi typically used when ink levels are low or when high quality prints are not needed.
 - **Better:** Suitable for most print jobs.
 - **Best:** Better dpi than **Better**.
 - **Max DPI Enabled:** Highest dpi setting available for print quality.
- To understand page and layout settings:
 - **Orientation:** Select **Portrait** for vertical prints or **Landscape** for horizontal prints.
 - **Print on Both Sides:** Automatically flip the pages after one side of the paper prints out so that you can print on both sides of the paper.
 - **Flip on Long Edge:** Select it if you want to flip pages by the long edge of the paper when printing on both sides of the paper.

- **Flip on Short Edge:** Select it if you want to flip pages by the short edge of the paper when printing on both sides of the paper.
- **Pages per Sheet:** Helps you specify the order of the pages if you print the document with more than two pages per sheet.

6 Copy, Scan, and Mobile Fax

You can scan documents, photos, and other paper types, and send them to a variety of destinations, such as a computer or an email recipient.

When scanning documents with the HP printer software, you can scan to a format that can be searched and edited.

When scanning a borderless original, use the scanner glass and not the document feeder.



NOTE: Some scan functions are only available after you have installed the HP printer software.




TIP: If you have problems scanning documents, see [Copy and scan issues](#).

Copy from the printer

1. Make sure you have paper loaded in the input tray. For more information, see [Load paper](#).
2. Place your original print-side down on the scanner glass or print-side up in the document feeder.
3. From the printer control panel display, touch **Copy**.
4. Select the desired option.
5. Enter the number of copies by using the keypad or make changes to other settings.




TIP: To save your settings as defaults for future jobs, touch **Copy Settings** , and then touch **Save Current Settings**.

6. Touch **Copy** .



TIP:

- By default, the printer is set to copy in color. If you want to copy in black-and-white, touch **Copy Settings**  to change the default color.
 - If your device has a camera, you can use the HP Smart app to scan a printed document or photo with the device camera. You can then use HP Smart to edit, save, print, or share the image.
-

Scan using HP Smart (iOS/Android, Windows 10, and macOS)

You can use the HP Smart app to scan documents or photos from the printer's scanner, and you can also scan using your device camera. HP Smart includes editing tools that allow you to adjust the scanned image before saving or sharing. You can print, save your scans locally or in cloud storage, and share them via email, SMS,

Facebook, Instagram, etc. To scan with HP Smart, follow the instructions provided in the appropriate section below, depending on the type of device you are using.



TIP: Sign up for HP Smart Advance to experience premium HP Smart service such as scan documents as editable text. For more information, see hpsmart.com.



NOTE: An HP account is required to use HP Smart, and not all mobile devices or regions have access to all settings at this time. Some features are available only on specific printers or models.

- **iOS/Android:** hp.com/go/hpsmart-help
- **Windows 10:** hp.com/go/hpsmartwin-help
- **macOS:** hp.com/go/hpsmartmac-help

Scan using the HP Scan software (Windows 7)

Use the HP Scan software to initiate scanning from software on your computer. You can save the scanned image as a file or send it to another software application.



NOTE: Windows 7 Service Pack 1 (SP1) is required to install HP Scan software.

1. Load the document on the scanner glass according to the indicators on the printer.
2. Open the HP Printer software. From the computer desktop, click **Start**, select **All Programs**, click **HP**, click the folder for the printer, and then select the printer name.
3. Select **Scan**, and then select **Scan a Document or Photo**.
4. Adjust the settings if necessary.
5. Click **Scan**.

Scan using Webscan

Webscan is a feature of EWS that lets you scan photos and documents from your printer to your computer using a web browser.

This feature is available even if you did not install the printer software on your computer.

For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).



NOTE: By default, Webscan is off. You can enable this feature from the EWS.

If you are unable to open Webscan in the EWS, your network administrator might have turned it off. For more information, contact your network administrator or the person who set up your network.

To enable Webscan

1. Open the embedded web server. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Settings** tab.
3. In the **Security** section, click **Administrator Settings**.
4. Select **Webscan from EWS** to enable Webscan.

5. Click **Apply**.

To scan using Webscan

Scanning using Webscan offers basic scan options. For additional scan options or functionality, scan from the HP printer software.

1. Load the original into the document feeder or on the scanner glass. For information about how to load paper, see [Load paper](#).
2. Open the embedded web server. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
3. Click the **Scan** tab.
4. Click **Webscan** in the left pane, change any settings, and then click **Start Scan**.

Tips for copy and scan success

Use the following tips to copy and scan successfully:

- Keep the glass and the back of the lid clean. The scanner interprets anything it detects on the glass as part of the image.
- Load your original print-side down on the scanner glass and align it with the marking on the rear left corner of the glass.
- To make a large copy of a small original, scan the original into the computer, resize the image in the scanning software, and then print a copy of the enlarged image.
- If you want to adjust scan size, output type, scan resolution, or file type, and so on, start scan from the printer software.
- To avoid incorrect or missing scanned text, make sure the brightness is set appropriately in the software.
- If you want to scan a document with several pages into one file instead of multiple files, start the scan with the printer software instead of selecting **Scan** from the printer display, or use document feeder to scan.
- If you scan from a mobile camera, make sure to scan in a well-lit area so that the original has good contrast with the surface it is lying on.

Mobile Fax

Use the HP Smart app to quickly scan and fax multiple pages at once from your mobile device or computer.

Use Mobile Fax in the HP Smart app

1. Make sure your mobile device or computer are connected to a network. Launch the HP Smart app and sign into or create your HP Account.
2. Select the Mobile Fax tile.

If you do not see the **Mobile Fax** tile, enable it as follows:

- On a mobile device: Tap **Personalize Tiles**, tap the **Mobile Fax** toggle to enable the tile, and then go back to the Home screen.
- On a Windows 10 device: Click the **Settings**, select **Personalize Tiles**, and click the **Mobile Fax** toggle to enable the tile. Then, go back to the Home screen.
- On a Mac device: From the menu bar, select **HP Smart >Personalize Tiles**. Set the Mobile Fax option to **On**.



NOTE: Mobile Fax is available in specific countries/regions. If you do not see a Mobile Fax option in the Personalize Menu, Mobile Fax might not be available in your country/region.

3. Fill out the necessary mobile fax information.
4. To add a cover page, tap the **Add a cover page** toggle, and then type a subject and message.
5. Scan the item you want to fax using your printer or mobile device camera, or attach a supported file type. Send the fax when ready.

Your fax will be securely delivered and you can track the status in the HP Smart app.

7 Manage cartridges

This section describes how to manage and order supplies.

To ensure the best print quality from the printer, you need to perform some simple maintenance procedures.

 **TIP:** If you have problems copying documents, see [Printing issues](#).

Dynamic security enabled printers


This printer is intended to work only with cartridges that have new or reused HP electronic circuitry. Reused HP electronic circuitry enables the use of reused, remanufactured, and refilled cartridges.

The printer uses dynamic security measures to block cartridges using modified or non-HP circuitry. Periodic firmware updates delivered over the internet will maintain the effectiveness of the dynamic security measures and block cartridges that previously worked.

Updates can improve, enhance, or extend the printer's functionality and features, protect against security threats, and serve other purposes, but these updates can also block cartridges using modified or non-HP electronic circuitry from working in the printer, including cartridges that work today. Unless you are enrolled in certain HP programs such as Instant Ink or use other services that require automatic online firmware updates, most HP printers can be configured to receive updates either automatically or with a notification that allows you to choose whether to update or not. For more information on dynamic security and how to configure online firmware updates, please go to www.hp.com/learn/ds.

Information on cartridges and the printhead

The following tips help maintain HP cartridges and ensure consistent print quality.

- The instructions in this guide are for replacing cartridges, and are not intended for first time installation.
- Keep all cartridges in the original sealed packages until they are needed.
- Be sure to turn off the printer properly. For more information, see [Turn the printer off](#).
- Store cartridges at room temperature (15-35° C or 59-95° F).
- Do not clean the printhead unnecessarily. This wastes ink and shortens the life of the cartridges.
- Handle cartridges carefully. Dropping, jarring, or rough handling during installation can cause temporary printing problems.
- If you are transporting the printer, do the following to prevent ink leaking from the printer or other damage from occurring to the printer:
 - Make sure you turn off the printer by pressing the Power button . Wait until all sounds of internal motion stop before unplugging the printer.
 - Make sure you leave the cartridges installed.
 - The printer must be transported sitting flat; it should not be placed on its side, back, front, or top.

Some color ink is used even when printing with black cartridge only


Ink is used in a number of ways throughout the inkjet printing process.

In general, ink in a cartridge is used for printing documents, photographs and other such materials. Some ink, however, must be used to maintain the health of the printhead; some ink is residual; and some ink evaporates. For more information on ink usage, visit hp.com/go/learnaboutsupplies and click **HP Ink**. (You might need to select your country/region using the **Select Country** button on the page.)

Check the estimated ink levels

You can check the estimated ink levels from the printer software or from the printer control panel.

To check the estimated ink levels from the printer control panel

- From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Ink**  to check the estimated ink levels.



NOTE:

- Ink level alerts and indicators provide estimates for planning purposes only. When you receive a low-ink alert, consider having a replacement cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not have to replace the cartridges until prompted to do so.
- If you have installed a refilled or remanufactured cartridge, or a cartridge that has been used in another printer, the ink level indicator might be inaccurate or unavailable.
- Ink from the cartridges is used in the printing process in a number of different ways, including in the initialization process, which prepares the printer and cartridges for printing, and in printhead servicing, which keeps print nozzles clear and ink flowing smoothly. In addition, some residual ink is left in the cartridge after it is used. For more information, see hp.com/go/inkusage.

Order cartridges

This topic describes how to order cartridges.

To order cartridges, go to www.hp.com. (At this time, some portions of the HP website are available in English only.) Ordering cartridges online is not supported in all countries/regions. However, many countries have information on ordering by telephone, locating a local store and printing a shopping list. In addition, you can visit the hp.com/buy/supplies page to obtain information about purchasing HP products in your country.

Use only the replacement cartridges that have the same cartridge number as the cartridge you are replacing. You can find the cartridge number in the following places:

- Open HP Smart. Click or tap the printer image, and then click or tap **Supported Supplies**.
- In the embedded web server, click the **Tools** tab, and then click **Supply Status** under **Product Information**. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
- On the printer status report (see [Understand printer reports](#)).
- On the label of the cartridge you are replacing.

- On a sticker inside the printer. Open the cartridge access door to locate the sticker.



NOTE: The **Setup** cartridge that comes with the printer is not available for separate purchase.

Replace the cartridges

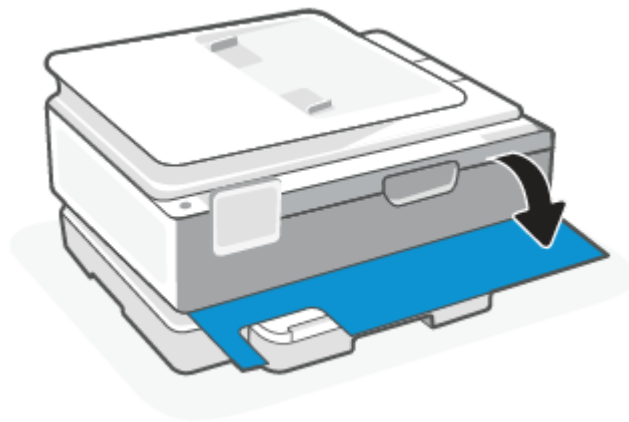

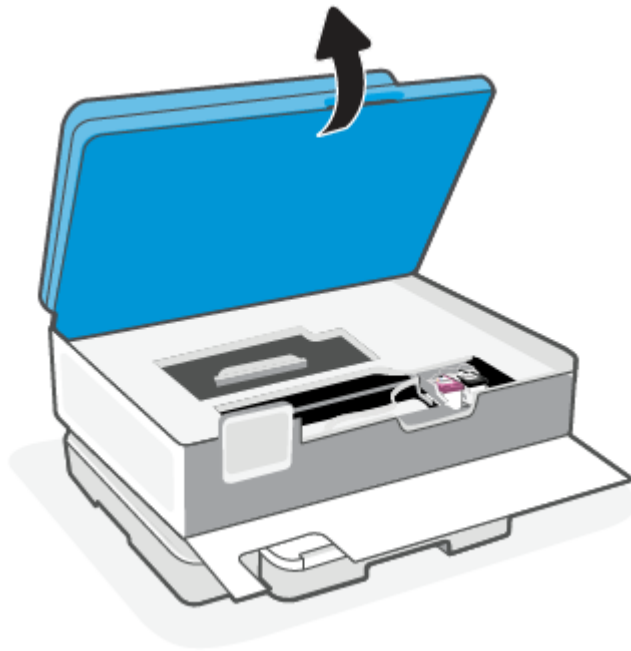
CAUTION: HP recommends that you replace any missing cartridges as soon as possible to avoid print quality issues and possible extra ink usage or damage to the ink system. Never turn off the printer when cartridges are missing.

To replace the cartridges

1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
2. Open the front door.



3. Open the cartridge access door.

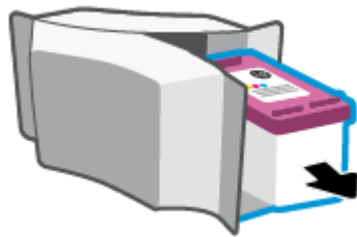


NOTE:

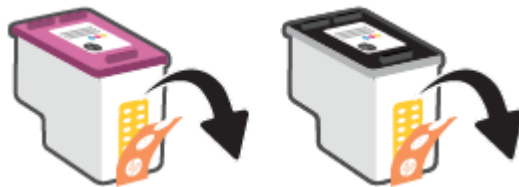
- Wait until the print carriage stops moving before proceeding.
- If the printer has a document feeder, do not grab or squeeze the document feeder when lifting the scanner.

4. Remove the cartridge from the slot.
5. Insert a new cartridge.

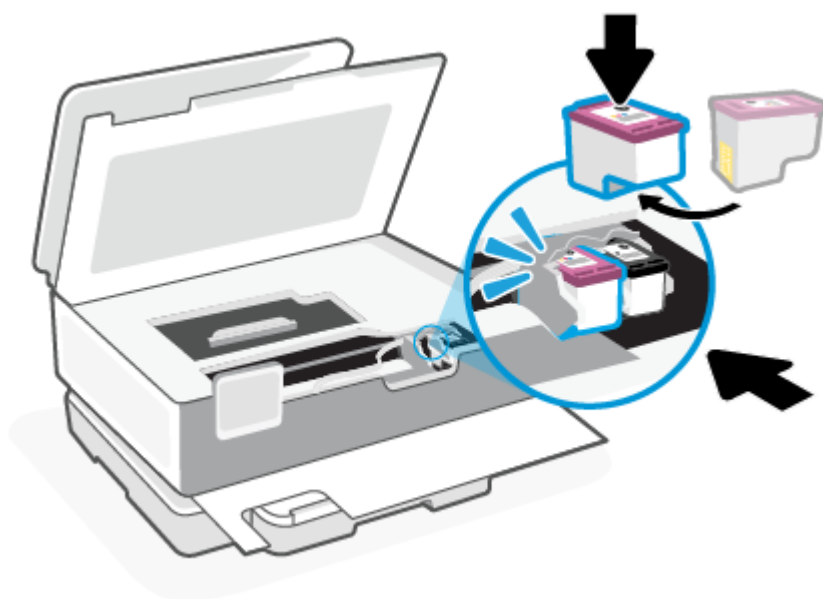
- Remove the new cartridge from its packaging.



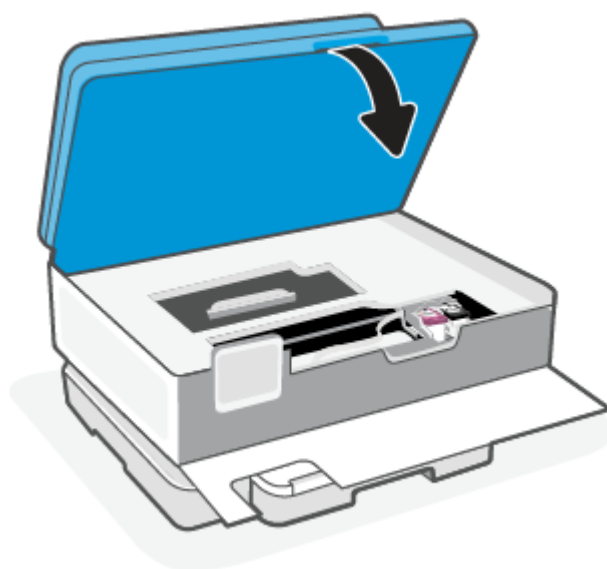
- Remove plastic tape using the pull tab.



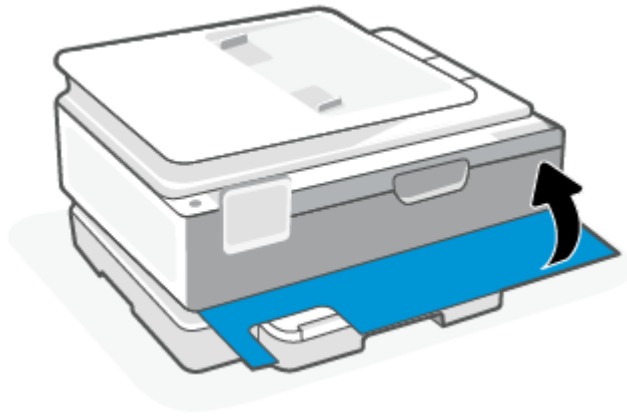
- Slide the new cartridge in the slot until it clicks.



6. Close the cartridge access door.




7. Close the front door.



Use single cartridge mode

Use the single cartridge mode to operate the printer with only one cartridge. The single cartridge mode is initiated when one of the following occurs.

- There is only one cartridge installed in the carriage.
- A cartridge is removed from the carriage if there are two cartridges installed previously.

 **NOTE:** If the printer enters the single cartridge mode when two cartridges are installed in the printer, verify that the protective piece of plastic tape has been removed from each cartridge. When the plastic tape covers the cartridge contacts, the printer cannot detect that the cartridge is installed. If there is no plastic tape on the cartridges, try cleaning the cartridge contacts. For information about cleaning cartridge contacts, see [Ink cartridge issues](#).

To exit the single cartridge mode

- Install both the black and tri-color cartridges in the printer.


Ink cartridge issues

If a cartridge has a problem, you might get a cartridge problem message.

If an error occurs after a cartridge is installed, or if a message indicates a cartridge problem, try removing the cartridges, verifying the protective piece of plastic tape has been removed from each cartridge, and then reinserting the cartridges. If this does not work, clean the cartridge contacts. If the problem is still not resolved, replace the cartridges.

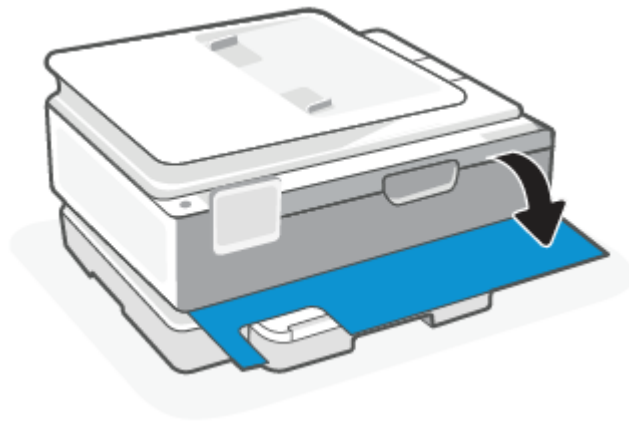

To clean cartridge contacts

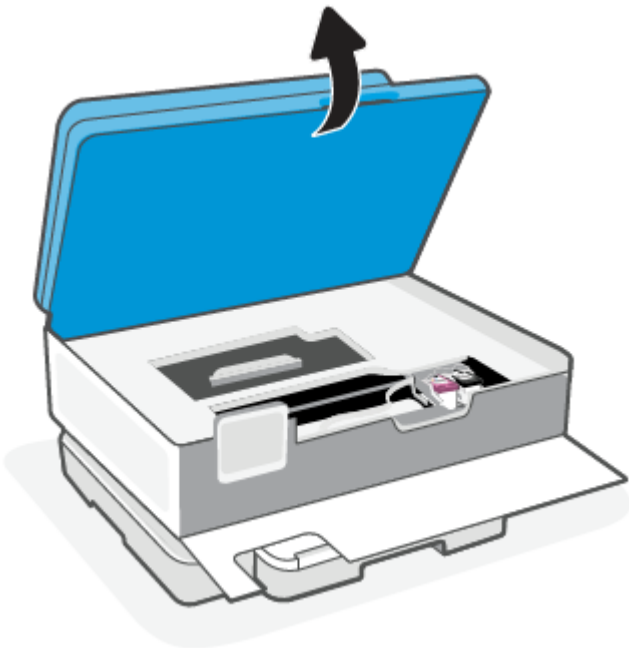
 **CAUTION:** The cleaning procedure should take only a few minutes. Make sure that the cartridges are reinstalled in the printer as soon as possible. It is not recommended to leave the cartridges outside the printer longer than 30 minutes. If cartridges are left unprotected outside the printer, their nozzles might dry out and clog up.

1. Check that power is on.

2. Open the front door.



3. Open the cartridge access door.



NOTE:


- Wait until the print carriage stops moving before proceeding.
 - If the printer has a document feeder, do not grab or squeeze the document feeder when lifting the scanner.
-

4. Wait until the carriage stops moving.
5. Remove the cartridge indicated in the error message.
6. Clean the cartridge contacts and printer contacts.

- a. Hold the cartridge by its sides with the bottom pointing up and locate the electrical contacts on the cartridge.

The electrical contacts are the small gold-colored dots on the cartridge.

- b. Wipe only the contacts with a dry swab or lint-free cloth.

 **CAUTION:** Be careful to wipe only the contacts, and do not smear any of the ink or other debris elsewhere on the cartridge.

- c. On the inside of the printer, locate the contacts for the cartridge.

The printer contacts are the set of gold-colored bumps positioned to meet the contacts on the cartridge.

- d. Use a dry swab or lint-free cloth to wipe the contacts.

7. Reinstall the cartridge.

8. Close the cartridge access door.

9. Check if the error message has gone away. If you still receive the error message, turn the printer off, and then on.



NOTE: If one cartridge is causing problems, you can remove it and use the single cartridge mode to operate the printer with only one cartridge.

Store printing supplies

Cartridges can be left in the printer for extended periods of time. However, to assure optimal cartridge health, be sure to turn off the printer properly when the printer is not in use.

Cartridge warranty information

The HP cartridge warranty is applicable when the cartridge is used in its designated HP printing device. This warranty does not cover HP cartridges that have been refilled, remanufactured, refurbished, misused, or tampered with.

During the warranty period, the cartridge is covered as long as the HP ink is not depleted and the end of warranty date has not been reached. The end of warranty date, in YYYY/MM/DD format, may be found on the cartridge as indicated:

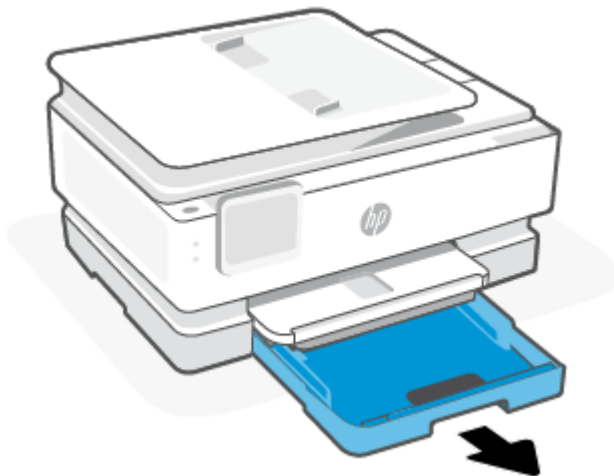
Clear a paper jam

Paper jams can occur in several locations inside the printer.

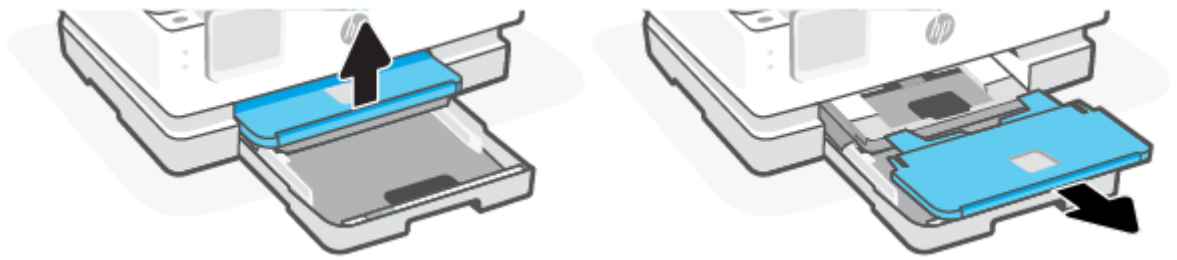
 **CAUTION:** To prevent possible damage to the printhead, clear paper jams as soon as possible.

To clear a paper jam from the main tray

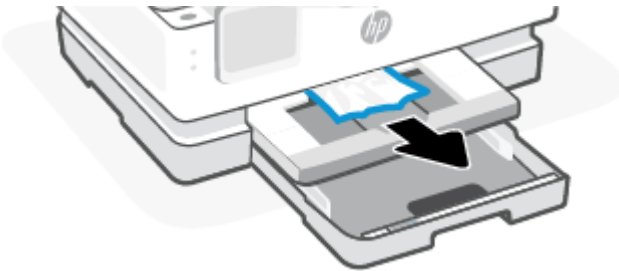
1. Open the main tray.



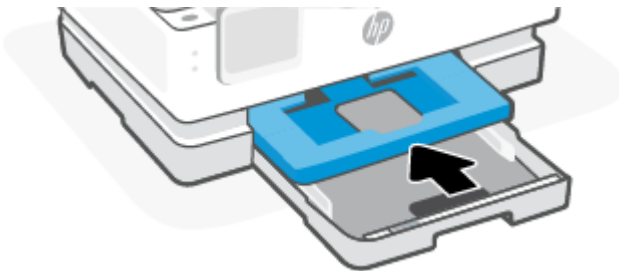
2. Lift up the output tray and then remove from the printer.



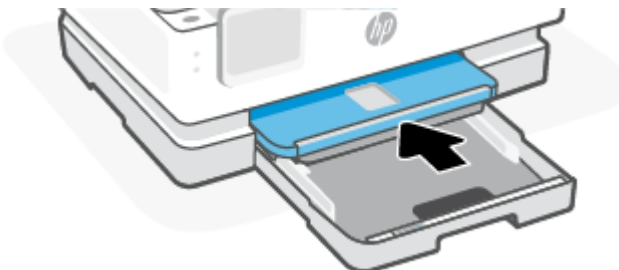
3. Remove any jammed paper in the photo tray.



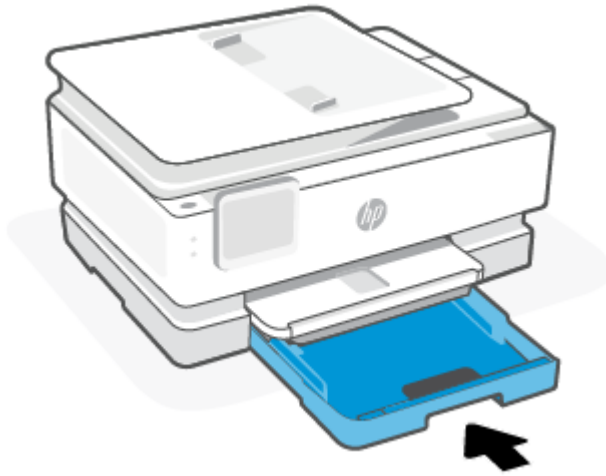
4. Push in the photo tray and then remove any jammed paper in the main tray.




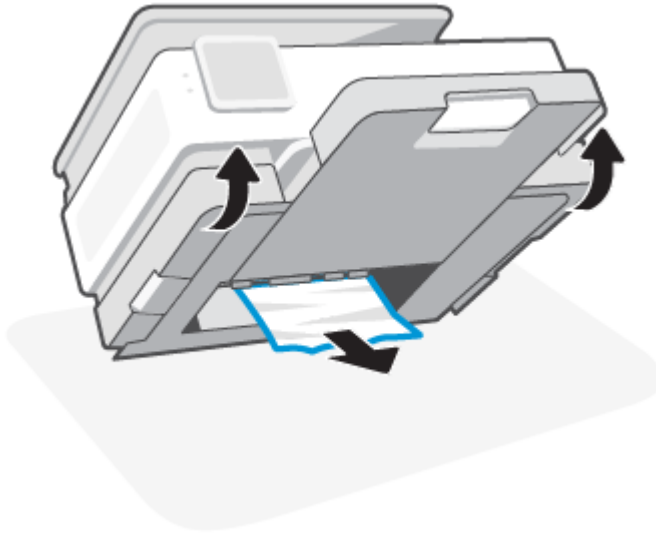
5. Insert the output tray back into the printer.



6. Close the main tray.

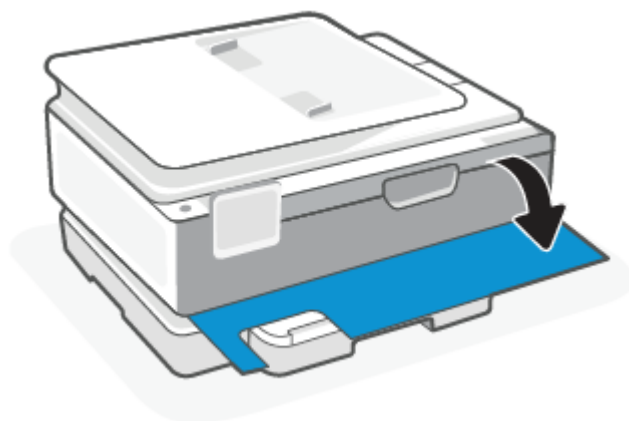


 **NOTE:** If the printer is still showing clear jam message, with the input tray extended, gently tilt the printer from the front (about 60 degrees) to remove the paper from the base of the printer.

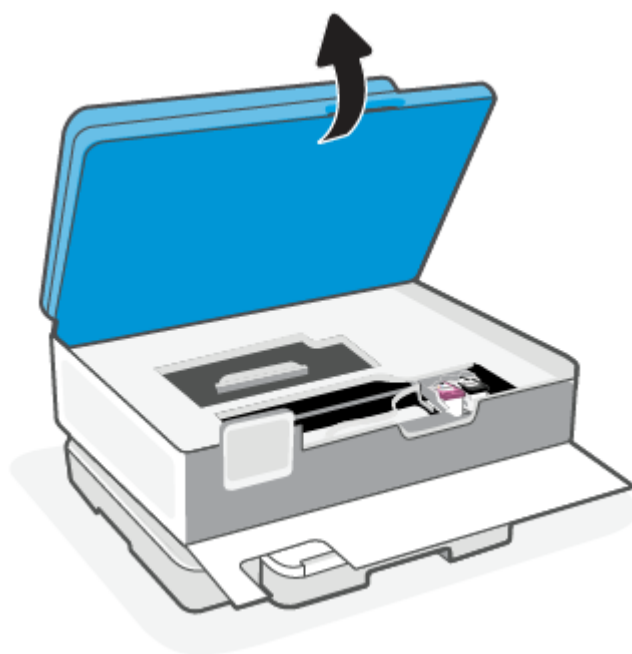


To clear a paper jam from print zone

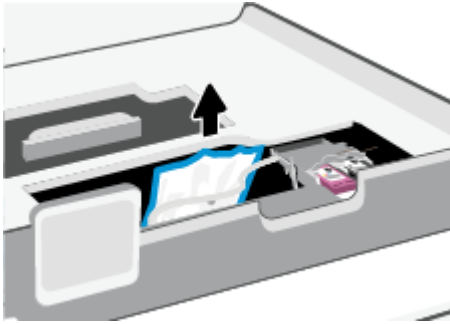
1. Open the front door.




2. Open the carriage access door.

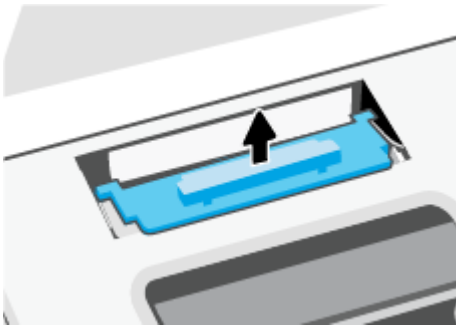


3. If the print carriage is not obstructed, gently move the print carriage to the left of the printer and then remove the jammed paper. If needed, repeat the same by gently moving the print carriage to the right of the printer.




 **NOTE:** Do not move the print carriage too far to the left or the right side of the printer.

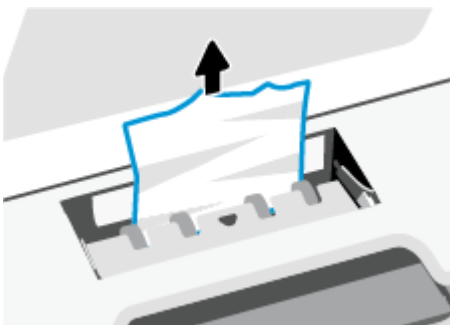
4. Lift the handle of the paper path cover and remove the cover.



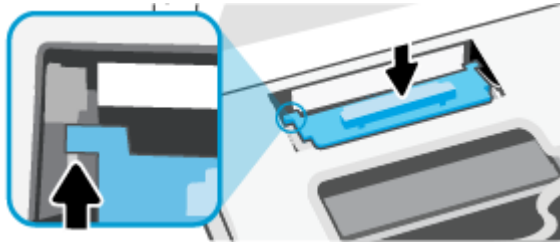
5. Locate any jammed paper inside the printer, grasp it with both hands and pull it towards you.

 **CAUTION:** If the paper tears when you are removing it from the rollers, check the rollers and wheels for torn pieces of paper that might be remaining inside the printer.

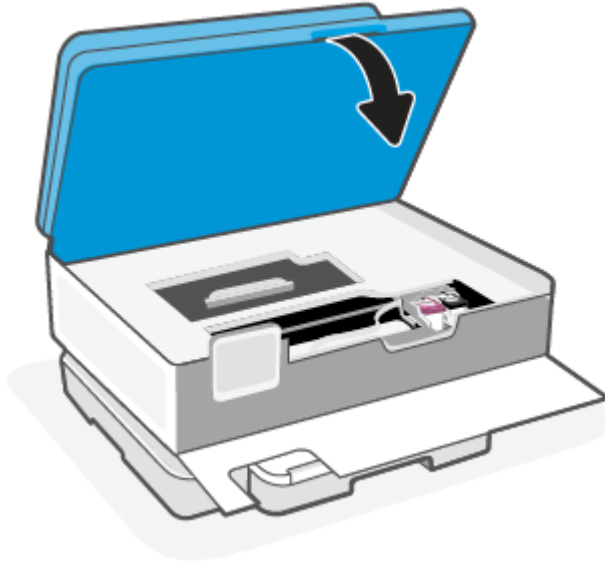
If you do not remove all the pieces of paper from the printer, more paper jams are likely to occur.



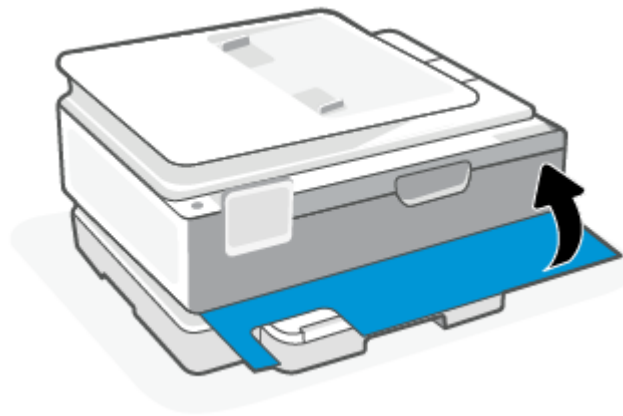
6. Reinsert the paper path cover until it snaps into place.



7. Close the cartridge access door.



8. Close the front door.

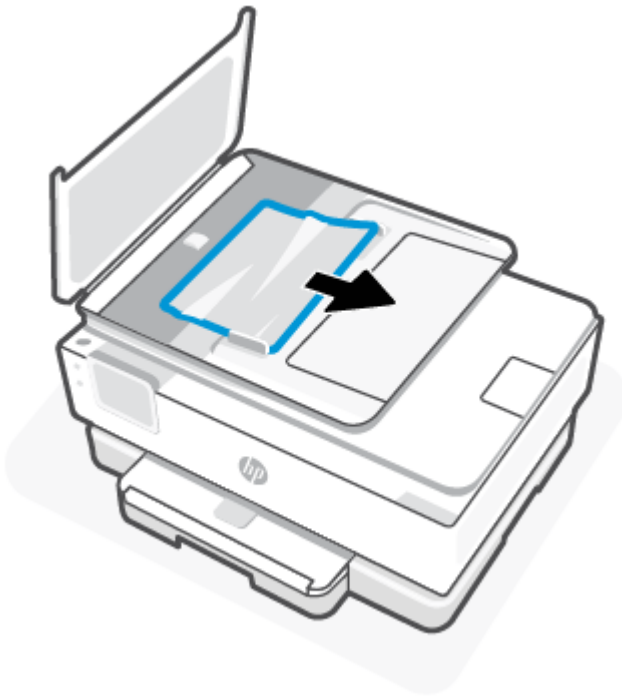


To clear a paper jam from the document feeder (some models only)

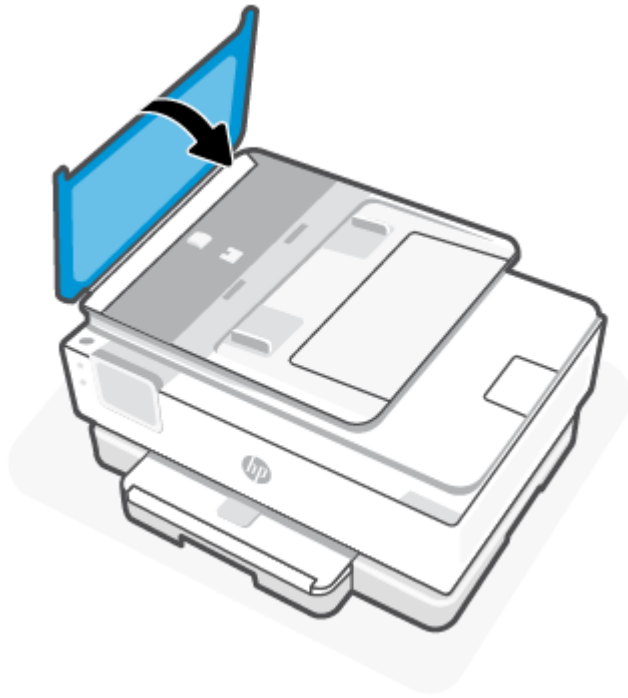
1. Lift the cover of the document feeder.



2. Pull any jammed paper out of the rollers.



3. Close the cover of the document feeder until it snaps into space.



4. Lift up the document feeder tray.



5. Remove any jammed paper under the tray.



6. Put down the document feeder tray.



Clear a print carriage jam

Remove any objects, such as paper, that are blocking the print carriage.



NOTE: Do not use any tools or other devices to remove jammed paper. Always use caution when removing jammed paper from inside the printer.

Learn how to avoid paper jams

To help avoid paper jams, follow these guidelines.

- Do not place too much paper in the printer trays. For information on tray capacity, see [Specifications](#).
- Remove printed papers from the output tray frequently.

- Make sure that you are printing with paper that is not wrinkled, folded, or damaged.
- Prevent curled or wrinkled paper by storing all unused paper flat in a resealable bag.
- Do not use paper that is too thick or too thin for the printer.
- Make sure that the trays are loaded correctly and are not too full. For more information, see [Load paper](#).
- Ensure that paper loaded in the main tray lays flat and the edges are not bent or torn.
- Do not mix different paper types and paper sizes in the main tray; the entire stack of paper in the main tray must be the same size and type.
- Do not force paper too far inside the main tray.
- If you are printing on both sides of a page, do not print highly saturated images on light weight paper.
- Use paper types that are recommended for the printer.
- If the printer is about to run out of paper, allow the printer to run out of paper first, and then add paper. Do not load paper when the printer is printing.

Solve paper-feed problems

The following lists the common paper-feed problems.

- **Paper is not picked up from a tray**
 - Make sure paper is loaded in the tray. For more information, see [Load paper](#). Fan the paper before loading.
 - Make sure the paper-width guides are set to the correct markings in the tray for the paper size you are loading. Also make sure the paper guides are snug, but not tight, against the stack.
 - Ensure that the stack of paper is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the bottom of the main tray, and does not exceed the stack height indicated by one or more label on the side or paper-width guide of the main tray.
 - Make sure paper in the tray is not curled. Uncurl paper by bending it in the opposite direction of the curl.
- **Pages are skewing**
 - Make sure the paper loaded in the main tray is aligned to the paper-width guides. If needed, open the main tray from the printer and reload the paper correctly, making sure that the paper guides are aligned correctly.
 - Load paper into the printer only when it is not printing.
 - Make sure the rear access door is securely shut.
- **Multiple pages are being picked up**
 - Make sure the paper-width guides are set to the correct markings in the tray for the paper size you are loading. Also make sure the paper-width guides are snug, but not tight, against the stack.
 - Ensure that the stack of paper is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the bottom of the main tray, and does not exceed the stack height indicated by one or more label on the side or paper-width guide of the main tray.

- Make sure the tray is not overloaded with paper.
- Use HP paper for optimum performance and efficiency.

Printing issues

This topic helps you troubleshoot printing issues.


Fix problems with page not printing (unable to print)

This topic helps you troubleshoot printing issues.

To resolve print issues

Make sure that the printer is turned on and that there is paper in the tray. If you are still unable to print, try the following in order:

1. Check for error messages and resolve them by following the on-screen instructions.
2. If your computer is connected to the printer with a USB cable, disconnect and reconnect the USB cable. If your computer is connected to the printer with a wireless connection, confirm that the connection is working.
3. Run HP Print and Scan Doctor to automatically diagnose and resolve issues.

 **TIP:** If you are using Windows 10, you can run the HP Print and Scan Doctor from HP Smart.

To check the power connection and reset the printer

1. Make sure the power cord is firmly connected to the printer.

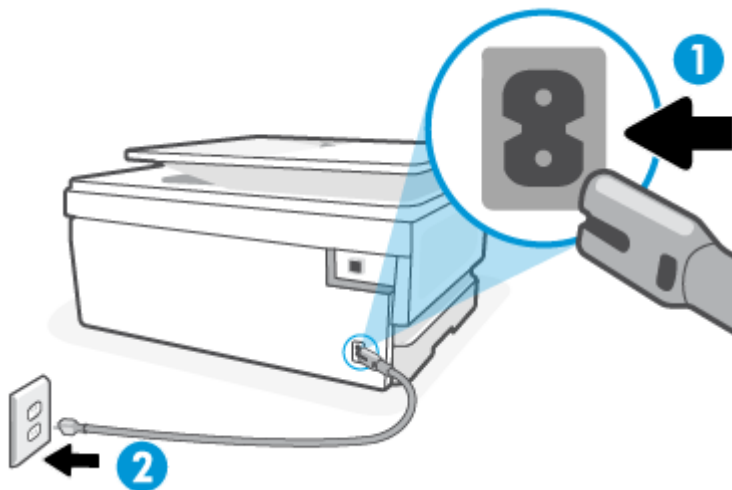


Table 8-1 Printer ports

Port	Description
1	Power connection to the printer
2	Connection to a power outlet

2. Look at the Power button located on the printer. If it is not lit, the printer is turned off. Press the Power button to turn on the printer.



NOTE: If the printer is not receiving electrical power, connect it to another power outlet.

3. With the printer turned on, disconnect the power cord from the back of the printer.
4. Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.
5. Wait at least 15 seconds.
6. Plug the power cord back into the wall outlet.
7. Reconnect the power cord to the back of the printer.
8. If the printer does not turn on by itself, press the Power button to turn on the printer.
9. Try using the printer again.



Fix print quality issues

This topic helps you troubleshoot print quality issues.



NOTE: To avoid print quality problems, always turn the printer off using the Power button, and wait until the Power button light goes out before you pull the plug or turn off a power strip. This allows the printer to move the cartridges to a capped position, where they are protected from drying out.

To improve print quality from the printer control panel

1. Clean the printhead from the printer control panel.
 - a. Load Letter, A4, or Legal unused plain white paper into the main tray.
 - b. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
 - c. Touch **Printer Maintenance**, select **Clean Cartridges**, and then follow the onscreen instructions.
2. Make sure you are using original HP cartridges.
3. Make sure you have selected the appropriate paper type and print quality.
4. Check the estimated ink levels to determine if the cartridges are low on ink. For more information, see [Check the estimated ink levels](#). If the cartridges are low on ink, consider replacing them.
5. Print a diagnostics page if the cartridges are not low on ink.
 - a. Load Letter, A4, or Legal unused plain white paper into the main tray.
 - b. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
 - c. Touch **Reports**.
 - d. Touch **Print Quality Report**.
6. Review the blue, magenta, yellow, and black boxes on the diagnostics page. If you are seeing streaks in the color and black boxes, or no ink in portions of the boxes, then automatically clean the printhead.

7. If cleaning the printhead does not solve the problem, contact HP support. Go to hp.com/support. This website provides information and utilities that can help you correct many common printer problems. If prompted, select your country/region, and then click **All HP Contacts** for information on calling for technical support.

Copy and scan issues

Choose one of the following troubleshooting options.

- Use an HP online troubleshooting tool to solve your copy and scan.
- Use [HP Print and Scan Doctor](#) to automatically diagnose and resolve issues. If you are using Windows 10, you can run the HP Print and Scan Doctor from HP Smart.



NOTE: The HP Print and Scan Doctor and the HP online troubleshooting wizards may not be available in all languages.

Network and connection issues

This topic helps you troubleshoot network and connection issues.

Fix wireless connection

Choose one of the following troubleshooting options.


- Restore network settings and reconnect the printer. For more information, see [Restore original factory defaults and settings](#).
- Check the network configuration or print the wireless test report to assist in diagnosing network connection issues.

1. From the Home screen, touch **Wireless**  and then touch **Settings** .
2. Touch **Print Reports**, and then touch **Network Configuration Page** or **Wireless Test Report**.

Check the top of the wireless network test report to see if something failed during the test.

- See the **DIAGNOSTICS RESULTS** section for all tests that were performed, to determine whether or not your printer passed.
 - From the **CURRENT CONFIGURATION** section, find out the Network Name (SSID) to which your printer is currently connected. Make sure that the printer is connected to the same network as your computer or mobile devices.
- Use an HP online troubleshooting tool to solve your printer issues.

Fix Wi-Fi Direct connection

1. Check the printer to confirm that the Wi-Fi Direct is turned on:
From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Wi-Fi Direct**  .
2. From your wireless computer or mobile device, turn on the Wi-Fi connection, and then search for and connect to the Wi-Fi Direct name of your printer.
3. Enter the Wi-Fi Direct password when prompted.
4. If you are using a mobile device, make sure you have installed a compatible printing app. For more information about mobile printing, visit hp.com/go/mobileprinting.

Printer hardware issues

Complete the following steps to resolve printer failure problems:

The printer shuts down unexpectedly

- Check the power and power connections.
- Make sure the printer's power cord is connected firmly to a functioning power outlet.



Printhead alignment fails

- If the alignment process fails, make sure you have loaded unused, plain white paper into the main tray. If you have colored paper loaded in the main tray when you align the printhead, the alignment fails.
- If the alignment process fails repeatedly, you may need to clean the printhead, or you might have a defective sensor. To clean the printhead, see [Maintain the printhead and cartridges](#).
- If cleaning the printhead does not solve the problem, contact HP support. Go to hp.com/support. This website provides information and utilities that can help you correct many common printer problems. If prompted, select your country/region, and then click **All HP Contacts** for information on calling for technical support.

The printer shuts down unexpectedly

- Check the power and power connections.
- Make sure the printer's power cord is connected firmly to a functioning power outlet.

Resolve printer failure

1. Press the Power button  to turn off the printer.
2. Unplug the power cord, and then plug in the power cord again.
3. Press the Power button  to turn on the printer.

If this problem persists, write down the error code provided in the message, and then contact HP support. For more information about contacting HP support, see [HP support](#).

Understand printer reports

You can print the following reports to help troubleshoot problems with the printer.

Printer status report

Use the printer status report to view current printer information and cartridge status. Also use the printer status report to help you troubleshoot problems with the printer.

The printer status report also contains a log of recent events.

If you need to call HP, it is often useful to print the printer status report before calling.

Network configuration page

If the printer is connected to a network, you can print a network configuration page to view the network settings for the printer and a list of networks detected by your printer. The last page of the report includes a list of all detectable wireless networks in the area, along with signal strength and the channels being used. This might help you select a channel for your network which is not heavily used by other networks (which will improve network performance).

The IP address is set back to the Automatic mode.



NOTE: In order to get the list of detected wireless networks in the area, the wireless radio on the printer should be turned on. If it is off, the list is not displayed.

You can use the network configuration page to help troubleshoot network connectivity problems. If you need to call HP, it is often useful to print this page before calling.

Print quality report

Print quality problems can have many causes—software settings, a poor image file, or the printing system itself. If you are unhappy with the quality of your prints, a Print Quality Report page can help you determine if the printing system is working correctly.

Wireless test report

When you print the Wireless Test Report, a number of tests are run to check various conditions of the printer wireless connection. The report shows the results of the tests. If an issue is discovered, the issue along with a message how to fix it is provided on the report. Some key wireless configuration details are provided at the bottom section of the report.

Web access test report

Print the web access report to help identify internet connectivity issues which can affect Web Services.

Solve Web Services problems

If you are having problems using Web Services, check the following:

- Make sure the printer is connected to the Internet using a supported network connection.



NOTE: You cannot use these web features if the printer is connected using a USB cable.

- Make sure the latest product updates have been installed on the printer.

- Make sure Web Services is enabled on the printer. For more information, see [To set up Web Services](#).
- Make sure the network hub, switch, or router is turned on and working correctly.
- If you are connecting the printer using a wireless connection, make sure the wireless network is functioning properly. For more information, see [Network and connection issues](#).
- If your network uses proxy settings when connecting to the Internet, make sure the proxy settings you are entering are valid:
 - Check the settings being used by the web browser you are using (such as Internet Explorer, Firefox, or Safari).
 - Check with the IT administrator or person who set up your firewall.

If the proxy settings used by your firewall have changed, you must update these settings in either the printer control panel or the embedded web server. If these settings are not updated, you will not be able to use Web Services.

Maintain the printer

This topic describes how to maintain the printer.

Clean the scanner glass

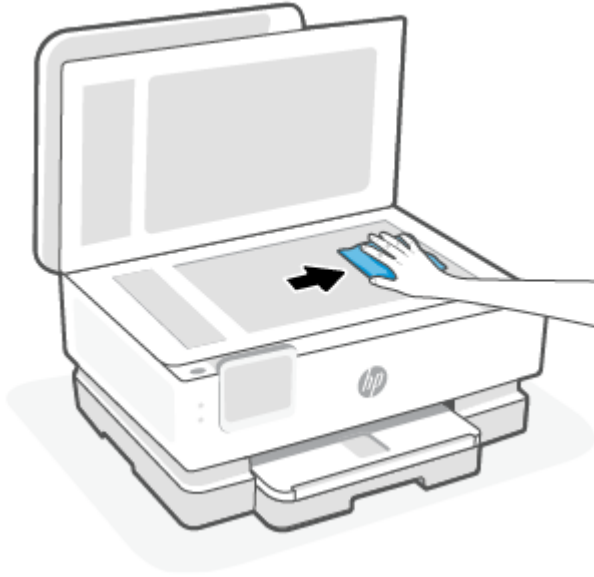
Dust or dirt on the scanner glass, scanner lid backing, or scanner frame can slow down performance, degrade the quality of scans, and affect the accuracy of special features such as fitting copies to a certain page size.

 **WARNING!** Before cleaning the printer, turn the printer off by pressing the Power button  and unplug the power cord from the electrical socket.

1. Lift the scanner lid.



2. Clean the scanner glass and lid backing by using a soft, lint-free cloth that has been sprayed with a mild glass cleaner.




⚠ CAUTION:

- Use only glass cleaner to clean the scanner glass. Avoid cleaners that contain abrasives, acetone, benzene, and carbon tetrachloride, all of which can damage the scanner glass. Avoid isopropyl alcohol because it can leave streaks on the scanner glass.
- Do not spray the glass cleaner directly on the scanner glass. If too much glass cleaner is applied, the cleaner could leak under the scanner glass and damage the scanner.

⚠ CAUTION:

3. Close the scanner lid, and turn on the printer.


Clean the exterior

-
- ⚠ WARNING!** Before cleaning the printer, turn the printer off by pressing the Power button  and unplugging the power cord from the electrical socket.

Use a soft, damp, lint-free cloth to wipe dust, smudges, and stains off of the case. Keep fluids away from the interior of the printer, as well as from the printer control panel.

Clean the document feeder (some models only)

If the document feeder picks up multiple pages or if it does not pick up plain paper, you can clean the rollers and separator pad.

-
- ⚠ WARNING!** Before cleaning the printer, turn the printer off by pressing the Power button  and unplug the power cord from the electrical socket.

1. Remove all originals from the document feeder tray.

2. Lift the document feeder cover.



This provides easy access to the rollers (1) and separator pad (2).

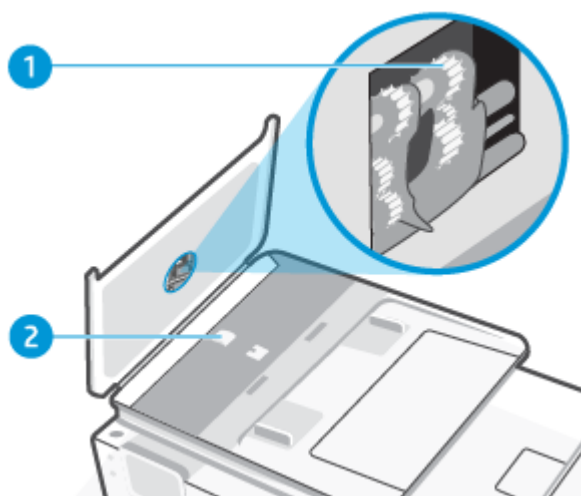


Table 8-2 Clean the document feeder

Feature	Description
1	Rollers
2	Separator pad

3. Lightly dampen a clean lint-free cloth with distilled water, then squeeze any excess liquid from the cloth.
4. Use the damp cloth to wipe any residue off the rollers or separator pad.



NOTE: If the residue does not come off using distilled water, try using isopropyl (rubbing) alcohol.

5. Close the cover of the document feeder.

Maintain the printhead and cartridges

If you are experiencing problems with printing, you might have a problem with the printhead. You should perform the procedures in the following sections only when directed to do so for resolving print quality issues.

Performing the aligning and cleaning procedures unnecessarily can waste ink and shorten the life of the cartridges.

- Clean the printhead if your printed output is streaked or has any incorrect or missing colors.

There are three stages of cleaning. Each stage lasts about two minutes, uses one sheet of paper, and uses an increasing amount of ink. After each stage, review the quality of the printed page. You should only initiate the next phase of cleaning if the print quality is poor.

If print quality still seems poor after you complete all stages of cleaning, try aligning the printhead. If print quality problems persist after cleaning and aligning, contact HP support. For more information, see [To install HP Smart and open the app](#).


- Align the printhead when the printer status page shows streaking or white lines through any of the blocks of color, or if you are having print quality issues with your printouts.

The printer automatically aligns the printhead during the initial setup.



NOTE: Cleaning uses ink, so clean the printhead only when necessary. The cleaning process takes a few minutes. Some noise might be generated in the process.

Always use the Power button to turn off the printer. Turning the printer off improperly can cause print quality problems.

1. Load Letter or A4 unused plain white paper into the main tray. For more information, see [Load paper](#).
2. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
3. Touch **Printer Maintenance**, select the desired option, and then follow the onscreen instructions.




NOTE: You can also do the same from the HP printer software or EWS. To access the software or EWS, see [To install HP Smart and open the app](#) or [To access and use EWS](#).

Restore original factory defaults and settings

This topic describes how to restore original factory defaults and settings.

If you disable some functions or change some settings and want to change them back, you can restore the printer to the original factory settings or network settings.

To restore the selected printer functions to the original factory settings


1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
2. Touch **Printer Maintenance**.

3. Touch **Restore**.
4. Touch **Restore Settings**.
5. Select one of the following functions to restore to the original factory settings:
 - Copy
 - Scan
 - Network


Touch **Restore**.

A message appears stating that the settings will be restored.
6. Touch **Restore**.

To restore the printer to the original factory defaults

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
 2. Touch **Printer Maintenance**.
 3. Touch **Restore**.
 4. Touch **Restore Factory Defaults**.
- A message appears stating that the factory defaults will be restored.
5. Touch **Continue**.

To restore the printer to the original network settings

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
 2. Touch **Network Setup**.
 3. Touch **Restore Network Settings**.
- A message appears stating that the network defaults will be restored.
4. Touch **Yes**.
 5. Print the network configuration page and verify that the network settings have been reset.



NOTE: When you reset the printer network settings, previously configured network-related settings (such as the link speed or IP address) are removed. The IP address is set back to the Automatic mode.




TIP: You can visit the HP online support website at [HP support](#) for information and utilities that can help you correct many common printer problems.

Run the [HP Print and Scan Doctor](#) to diagnose and automatically fix printing issues. If you are using Windows 10, you can run the HP Print and Scan Doctor from HP Smart.

To use Cold Reset to restore settings

Cold Reset removes all user configured settings, including saved administrator passwords, network configurations, selected country/region and language, Address Book entries, and Web Services account information.

You can use this feature if you are selling the printer or giving it to someone else and want to be sure that all personal information has been removed.

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Setup** .
2. Touch **Printer Maintenance**.
3. Touch **Restore**.
4. Touch **Cold Reset**.
A message appears, stating what settings will be restored.
5. Touch **Continue**.

Power Management


Use **Sleep Mode**, **Auto-Off**, and **Schedule On/Off** to conserve electricity.



NOTE: Configuring longer times for these settings or turning off these features will increase energy consumption.

Sleep mode

Power usage is reduced while in Sleep mode. After initial setup of printer, the printer will enter Sleep mode after five minutes of inactivity. Use **Sleep Mode**, **Auto-Off** and **Schedule On/Off** to conserve electricity. Use the following instructions to change the period of inactivity before the printer sleeps.

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, touch the **HP EcoSolutions** .
2. Touch **Sleep Mode**, and then touch the desired option.

Auto-off

This feature turns the printer off after 8 hours of inactivity to help reduce energy use. Auto-Off turns the printer off completely, so you must use the Power button to turn on the printer again.


If your printer supports this energy saving feature, Auto-Off is automatically enabled or disabled depending on printer capabilities and connection options. Even when Auto-Off is disabled, the printer enters Sleep mode after 5 minutes of inactivity to help reduce energy use.

- Auto-Off is enabled when the printer is turned on, if the printer does not have network, fax or Wi-Fi Direct capability, or is not using these capabilities.
- Auto-Off is disabled when a printer's wireless or Wi-Fi Direct capability is turned on or when a printer with fax, USB, or Ethernet network capability establishes a fax, USB, or Ethernet network connection.



Schedule On and Off

Use this feature to automatically turn the printer on or off on selected days. For example, you can schedule the printer to turn on at 8 a.m. and turn off at 8 p.m. from Monday to Friday. In this way, you save energy during the night and weekends.

Use the following instructions to schedule the day and time for On and Off.

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, touch **HP EcoSolutions** .

2. Touch **Schedule On/Off**.
3. Touch the toggle button next to **Schedule On** or **Schedule Off** to turn it on.
4. Touch the time option, and then follow the onscreen messages to set the day and time to turn the printer off and on.


 **CAUTION:** Always turn the printer off properly, using either **Schedule Off** or the Power button  located on the front left side of the printer.

If you improperly turn the printer off, the print carriage might not return to the correct position, causing problems with the cartridges and print quality issues.

Never turn off the printer when cartridges are missing. HP recommends that you replace any missing cartridges as soon as possible to avoid print quality issues, possible extra ink usage from the remaining cartridges, or damage to the ink system.


Quiet Mode


Quiet Mode slows down printing to reduce overall noise without affecting print quality. It only works when printing on plain paper. Additionally, Quiet Mode is disabled if you are printing using the best or presentation print quality. To reduce printing noise, turn on Quiet Mode. To print at normal speed, turn Quiet Mode off. Quiet Mode is off by default.

 **NOTE:** Quiet Mode does not work if you print photos or envelopes.


You can create a schedule by selecting the time when the printer prints in Quiet Mode. For example, you can schedule the printer to be in Quiet Mode from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. everyday.

To turn Quiet Mode on or off from the printer control panel

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Quiet Mode** .
2. Touch the toggle button next to **Quiet Mode** to turn the feature on or off.

 **TIP:** While the printer is printing or while making a copy, you can turn on or turn off Quiet Mode by selecting **Quiet Mode** on the control panel screen. The new settings will take effect after the current page has printed and will only be used for the current job.

To create a schedule for Quiet Mode from the printer control panel

1. From the printer control panel, touch or swipe down the tab at the top of the screen to open the Dashboard, and then touch **Quiet Mode** .
2. Turn on **Quiet Mode**.
3. Touch the toggle button next to **Schedule** to turn it on, and then change the start time and end time of the schedule.

To turn Quiet Mode on or off from EWS

1. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).

2. Click the **Settings** tab.

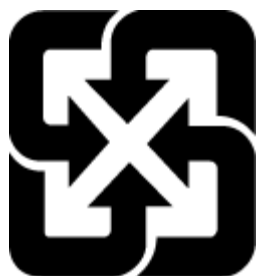
